## FOREWORD

THIS IS THE TENTH EDITION OF THE *KANSAS STATISTICAL ABSTRACT*. AS BEFORE, THE *ABSTRACT* SUMMARIZES DATA ABOUT THE STATE OF KANSAS IN CATEGORIES WHICH INCLUDE POPULATION, VITAL STATISTICS AND HEALTH, ELECTIONS, EDUCATION, CLIMATE, EMPLOYMENT, INCOME AND EXPENDITURES, BANKING AND FINANCE, STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT FINANCE, CRIME AND LAW ENFORCEMENT, RECREATION, COMMUNICATIONS, POWER, MOTOR VEHICLES, MINERAL PRODUCTS, CONSTRUCTION, MANUFACTURING, AND TRADE SERVICES. THE STATISTICS PROVIDED ARE TAKEN FROM THE CURRENT STATE AND FEDERAL CENSUSES AND OTHER REPORTS FROM STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR. THE MOST RECENT AVAILABLE SOURCES ARE USED IN ALL CASES.

THE 1974 *ABSTRACT* PROVIDES EXPANDED COVERAGE INCLUDING DATA ON THE ETHNIC COMPOSITION OF THE STATE'S POPULATION, INFORMATION ON INCOME BY FEDERAL TAX RETURNS FOR KANSAS AND THE UNITED STATES, DATA ON DISTRICT COURT CASES (CRIMINAL AND CIVIL) AND SOCIOECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS OF OFFENDERS IN KANSAS, AND INFORMATION ON MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENTS. THESE NEW CATEGORIES REFLECT THE CONTINUED EFFORTS OF THE INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF KANSAS TO MEET READER INFORMATION NEEDS.

WE INVITE READER SUGGESTIONS ABOUT INFORMATION AND FORMAT TO AID THE INSTITUTE IN ITS EFFORT TO IMPROVE THE USEFULNESS OF THE *ABSTRACT*. IT IS HOPED THAT THE DATA PROVIDED WILL ENABLE INDIVIDUALS, OFFICIALS, AND AGENCIES IN BOTH THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTORS TO BETTER UNDERSTAND THE VARIETY OF ACTIVITIES REFLECTIVE OF LIFE AND DEVELOPMENT IN KANSAS.

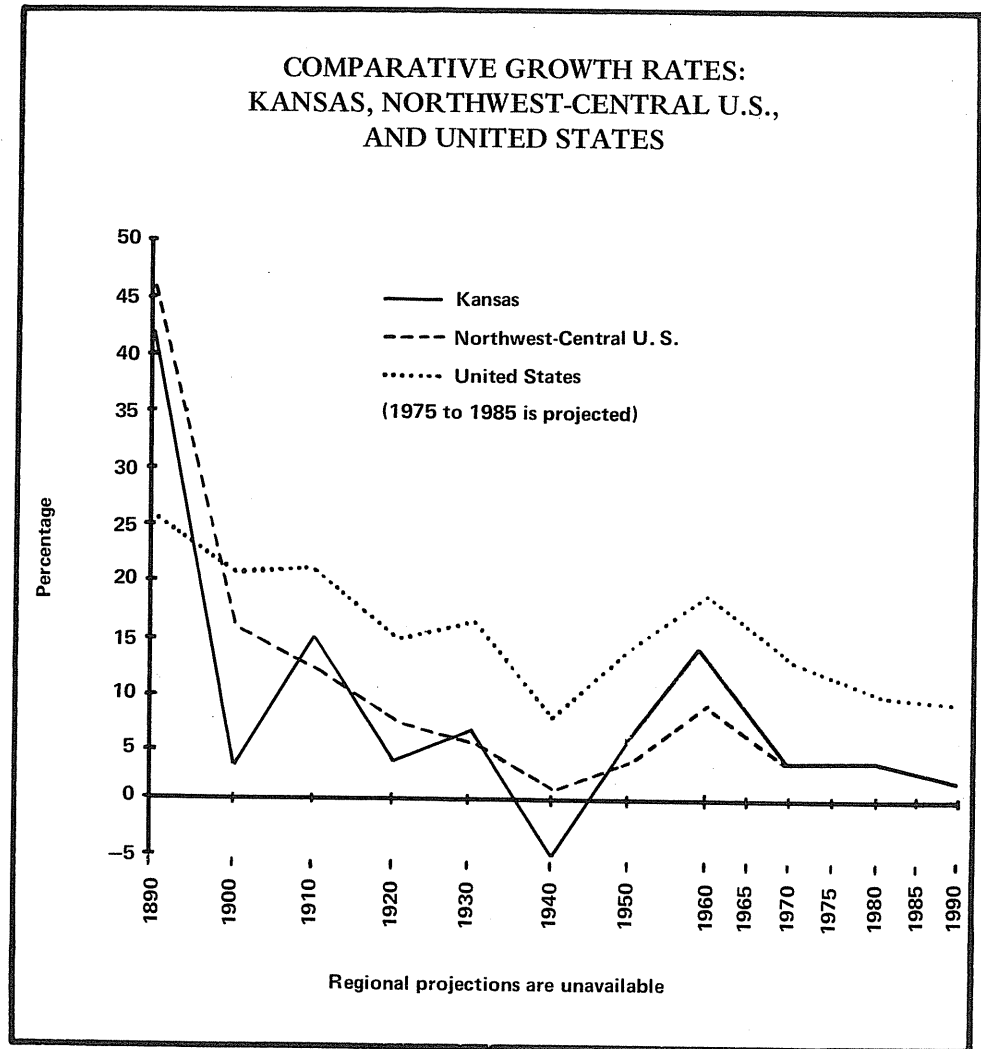

<sup>†</sup>In previous editions of the *Kansas Statistical Abstract* Series II-D projections for Kansas and Series I-B projections for the United States were used. However, the newly constructed Series E projections correspond more closely to the actual population growth rates. For national projections, an immigration rate of 400,000 per year and a completed cohort fertility rate of 2.1 were assumed. Kansas projections assumed that each age group would have similar mortality and migration patterns as it had from 1960-1970, that survival rates for those aged 75 or older would remain constant, and that birth rates would follow the Series E projections.

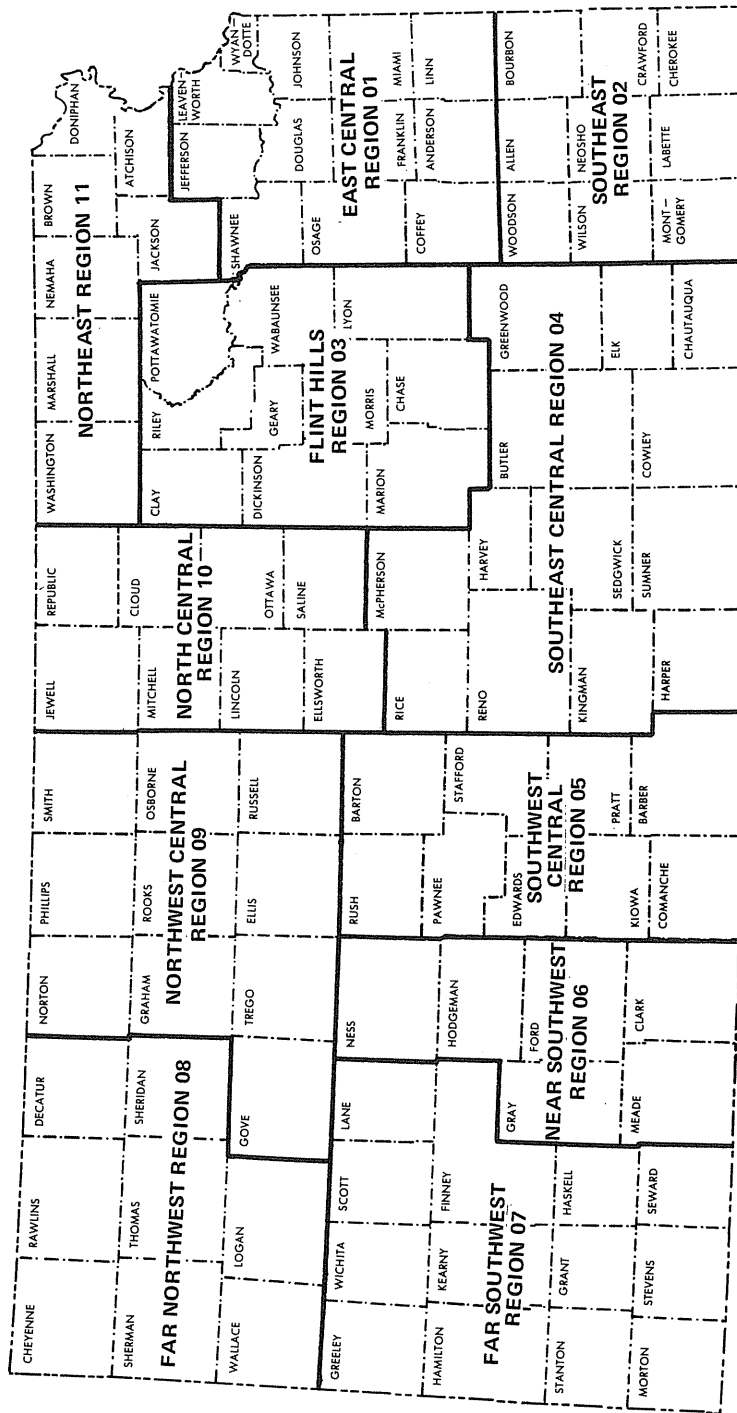

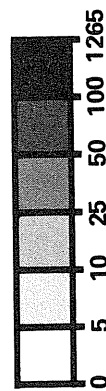

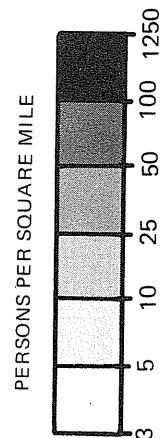
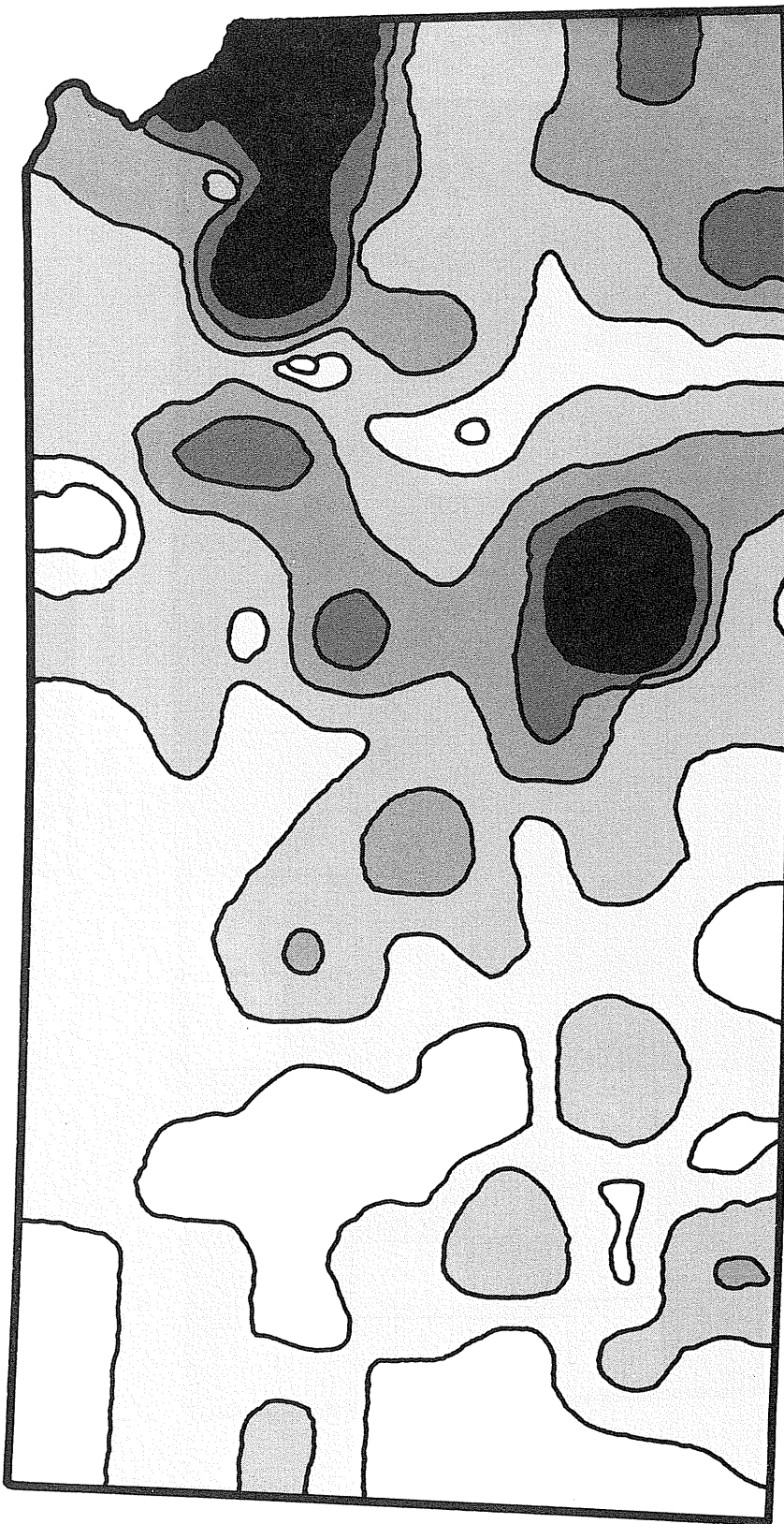
POPULATION DENSITY - 1974

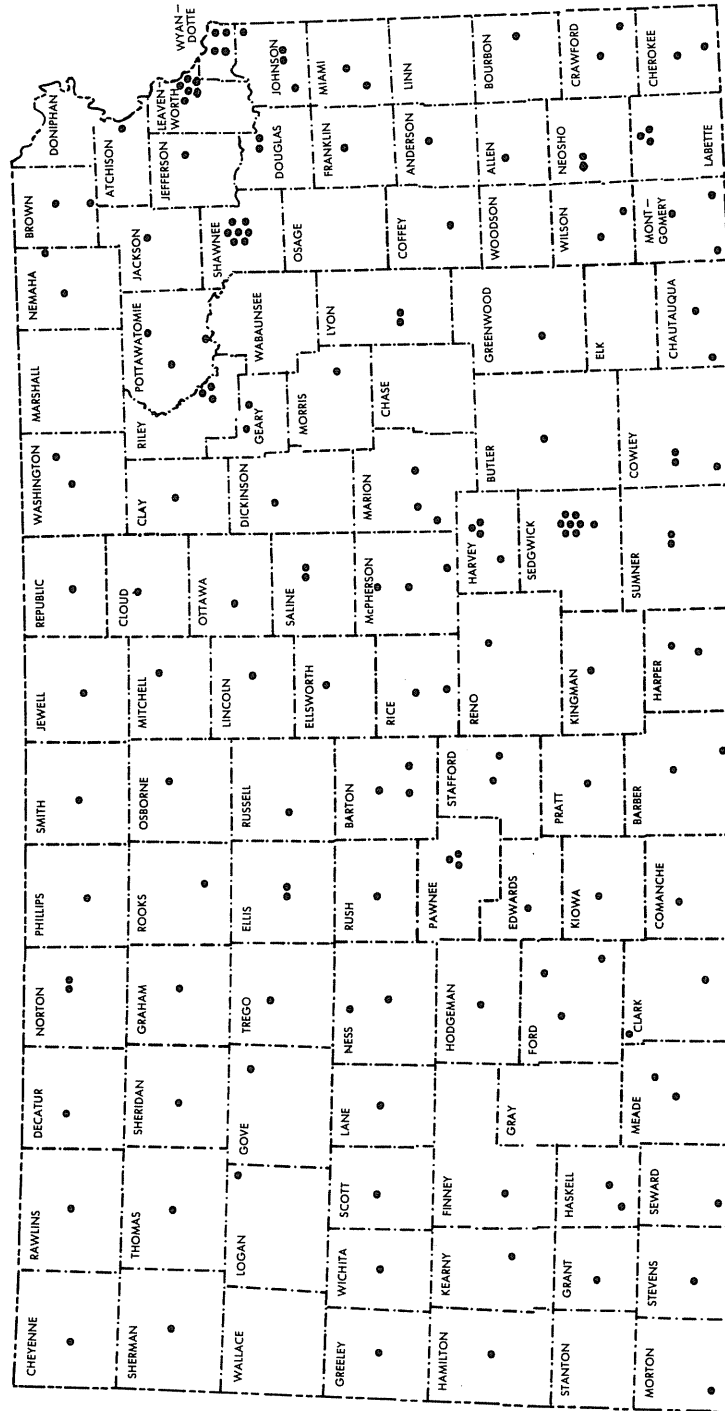

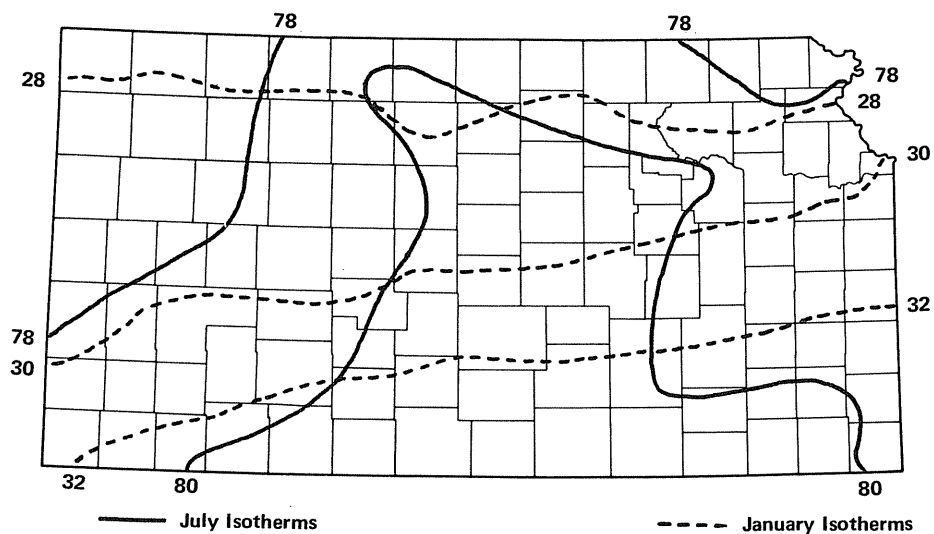

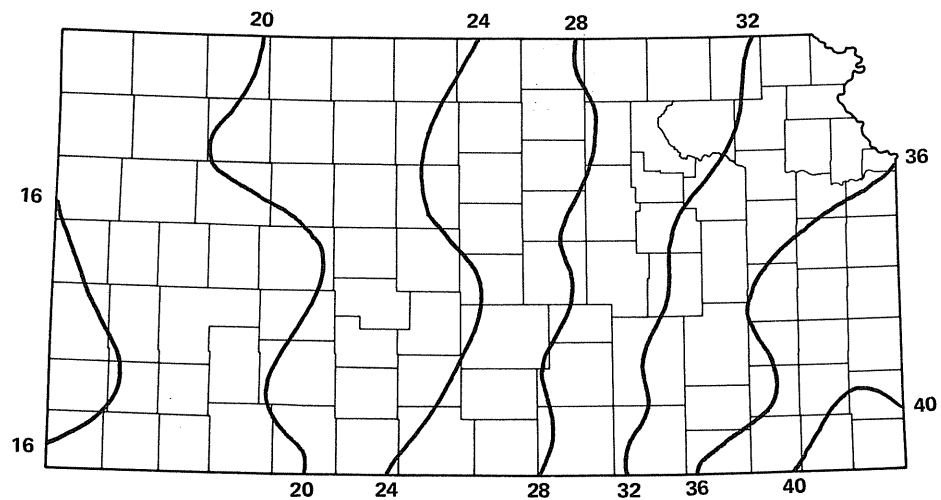

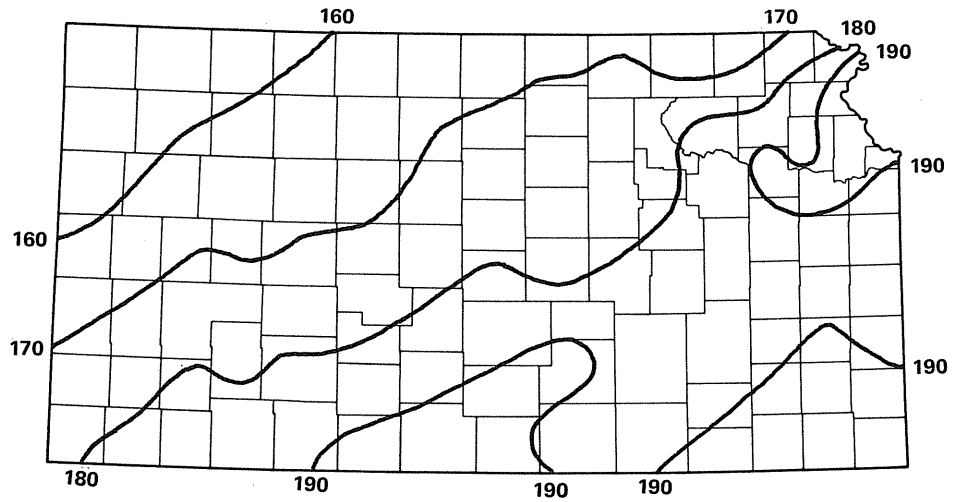
### KANSAS AVERAGE DAILY TEMPERATURES, (°F)



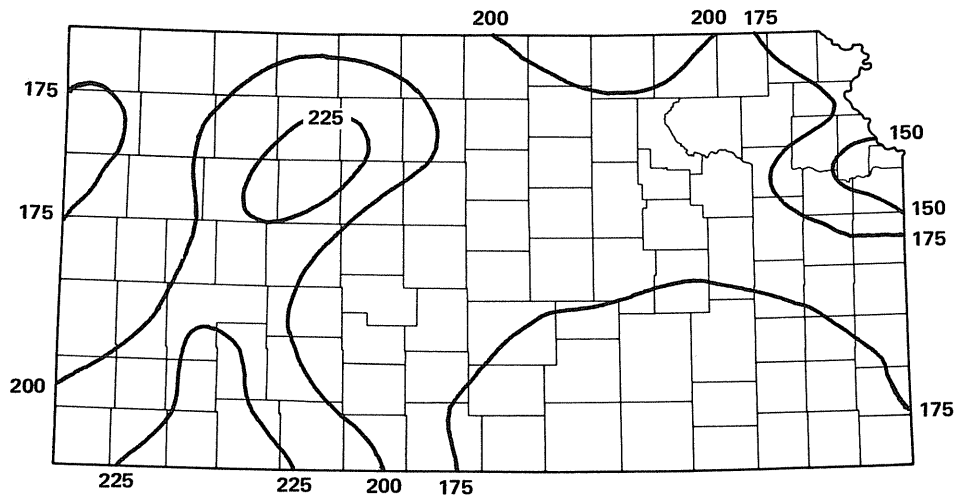
### KANSAS AVERAGE ANNUAL PRECIPITATION, (INCHES)

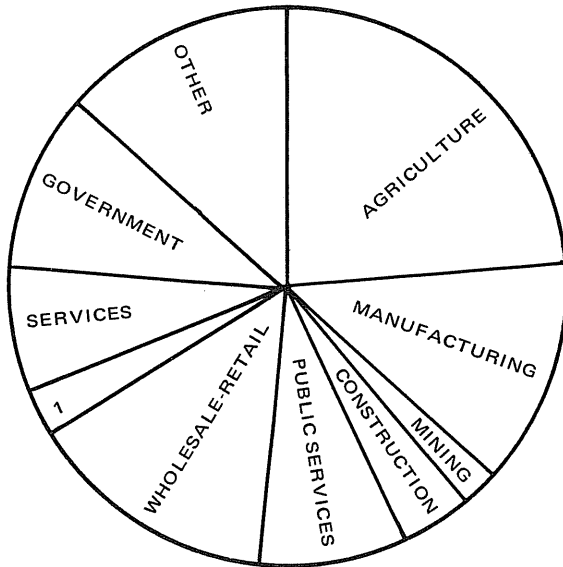

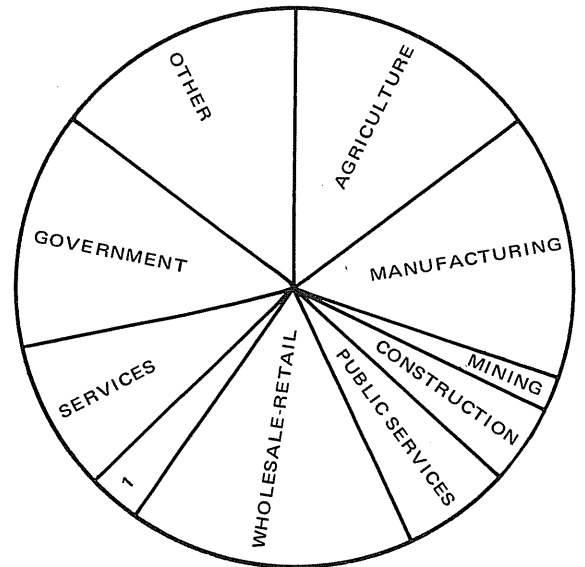

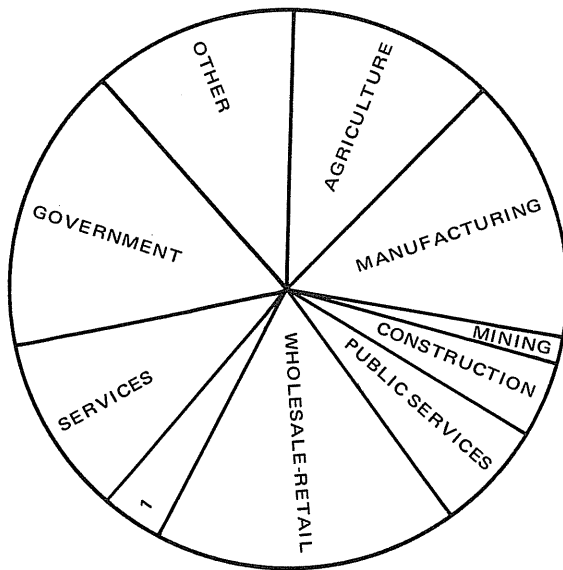
### EMPLOYMENT IN KANSAS BY SECTORS 1950-1970



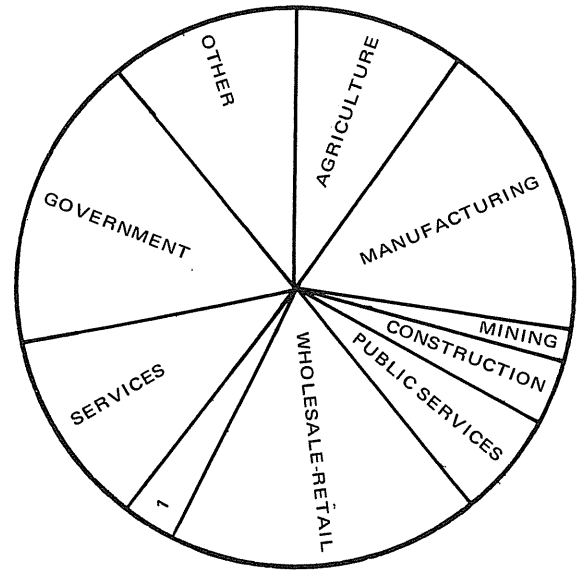

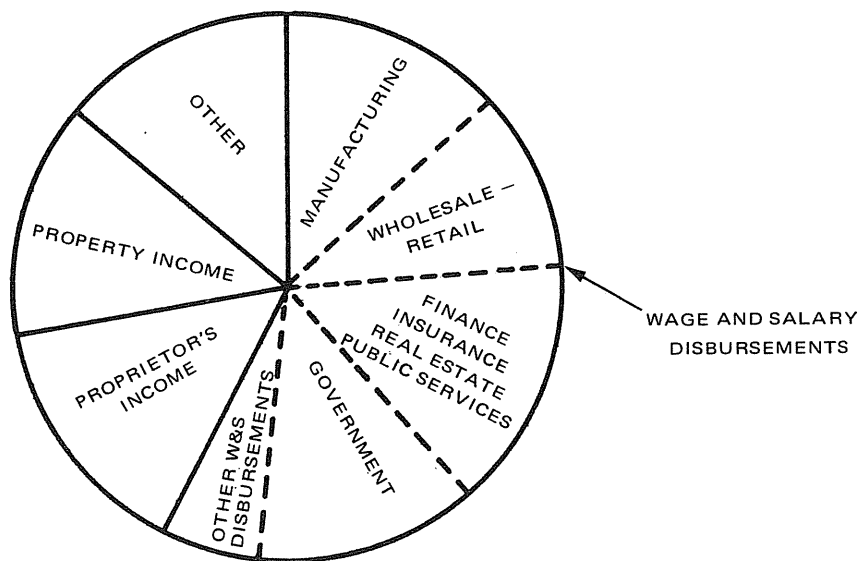

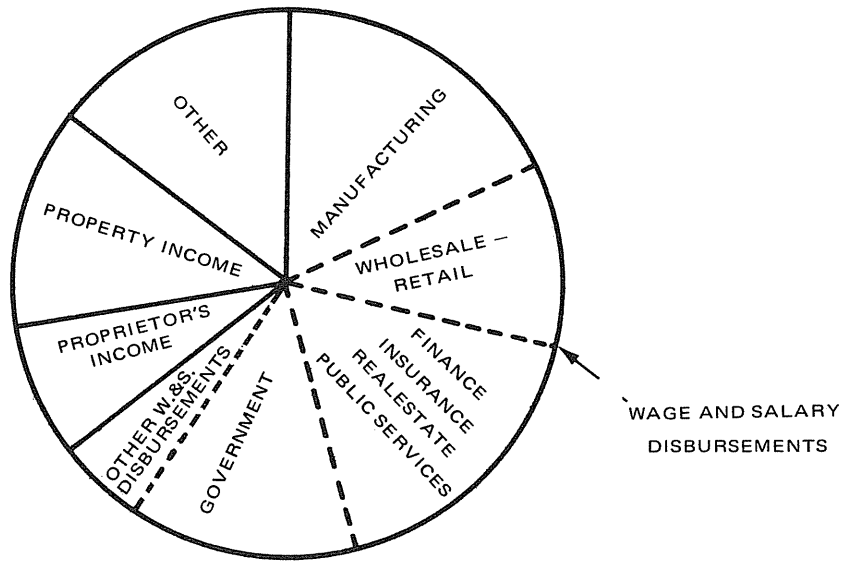

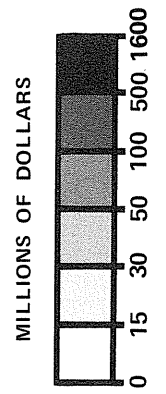

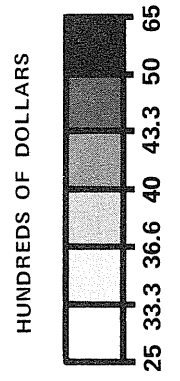
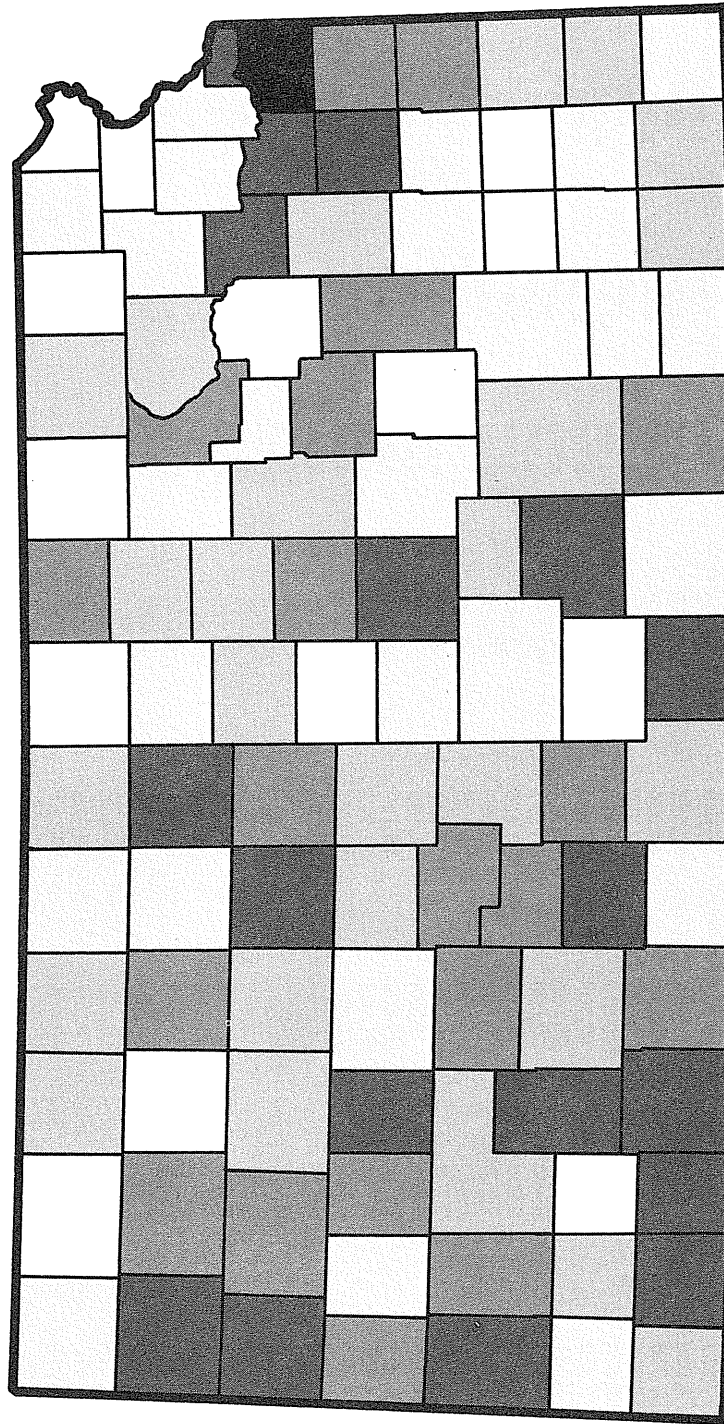

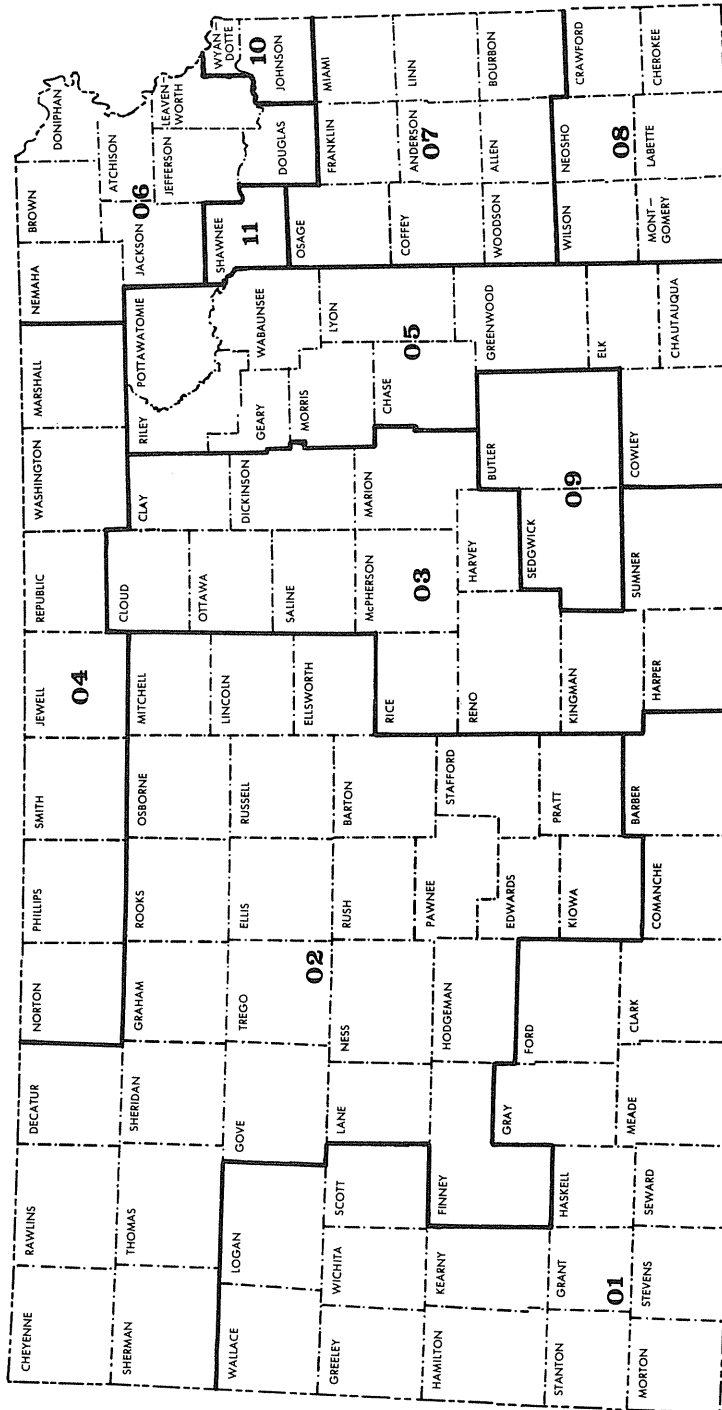

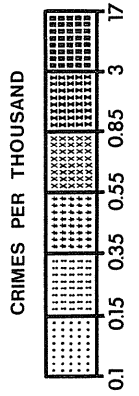

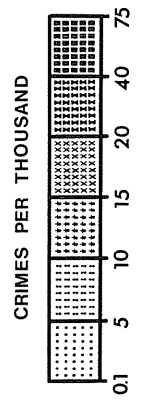

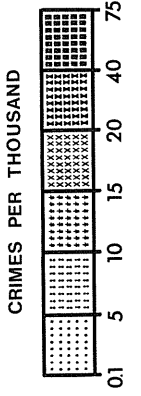
VIOLENT CRIMES—1973

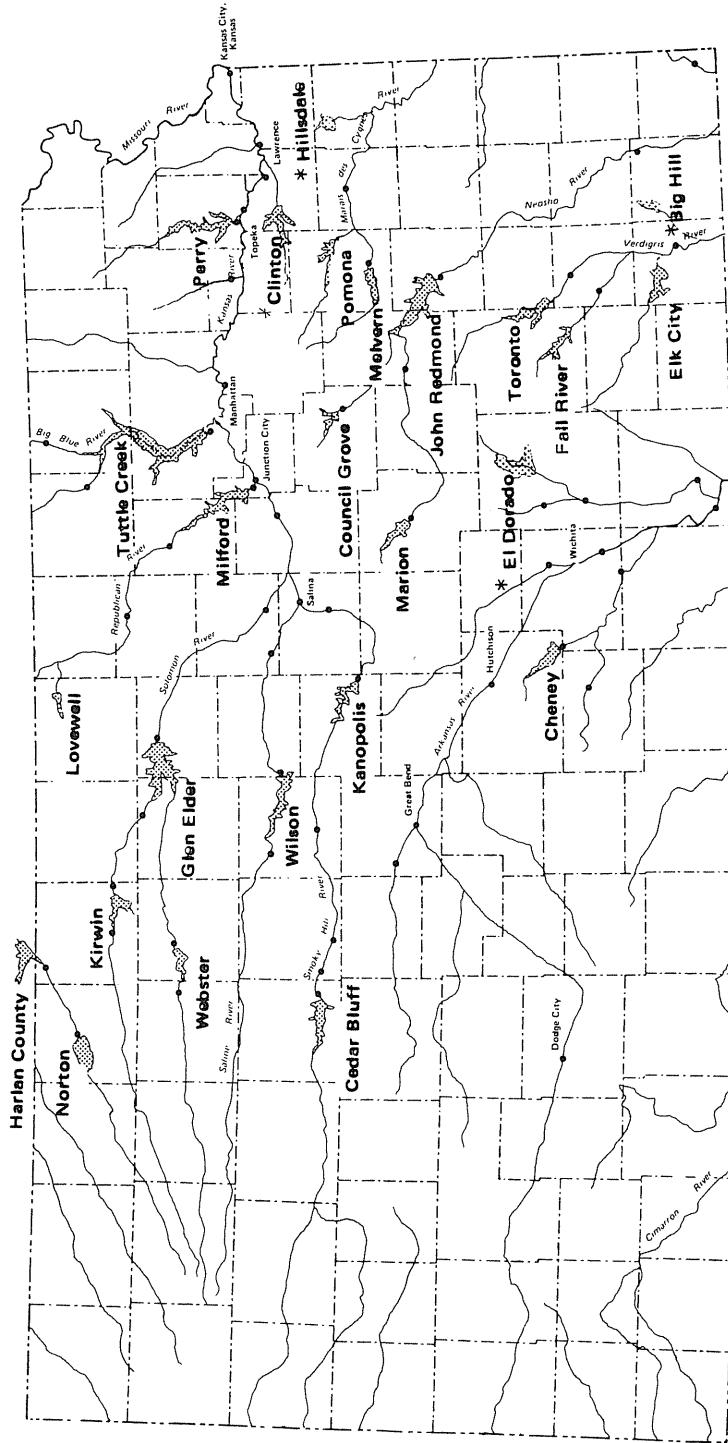

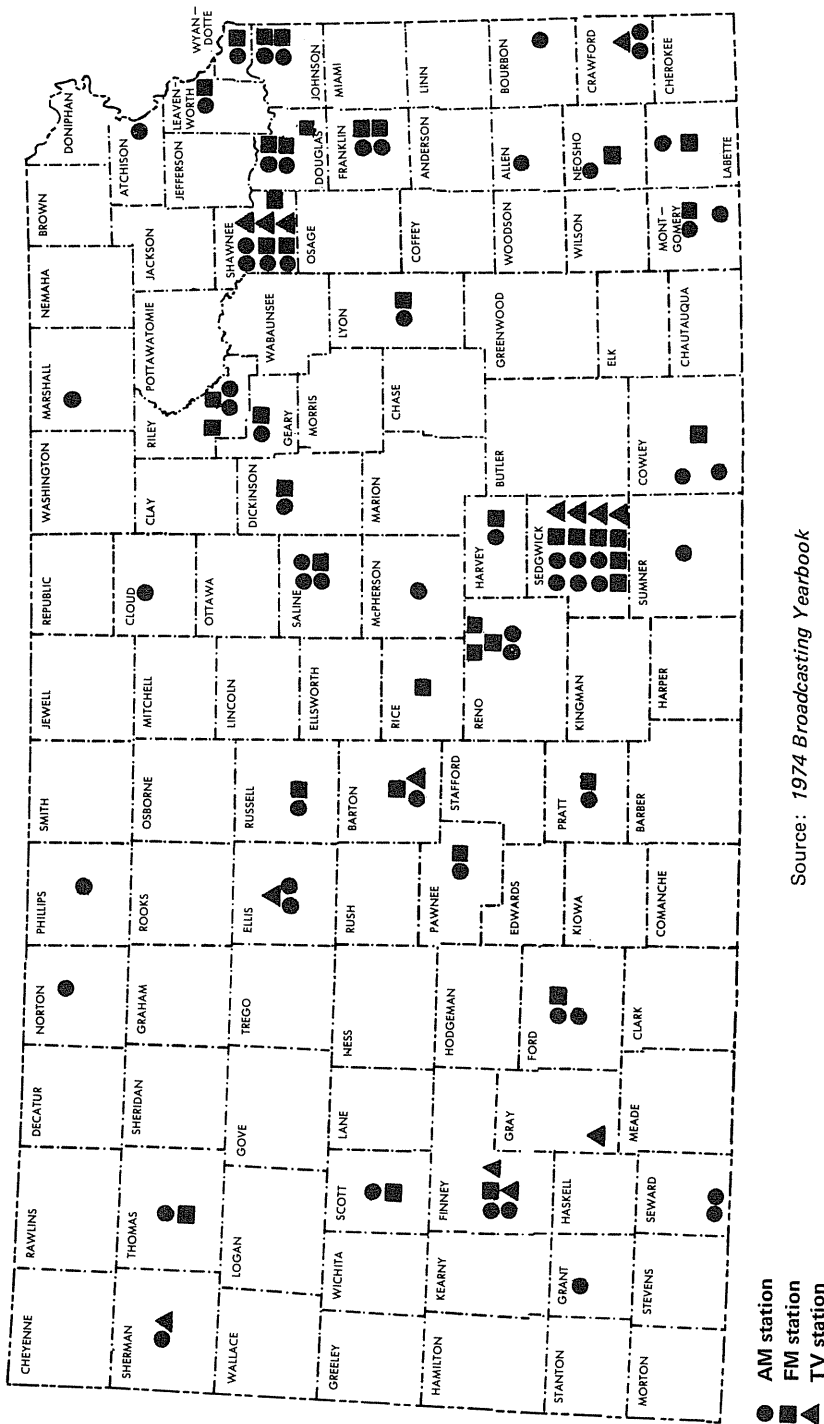

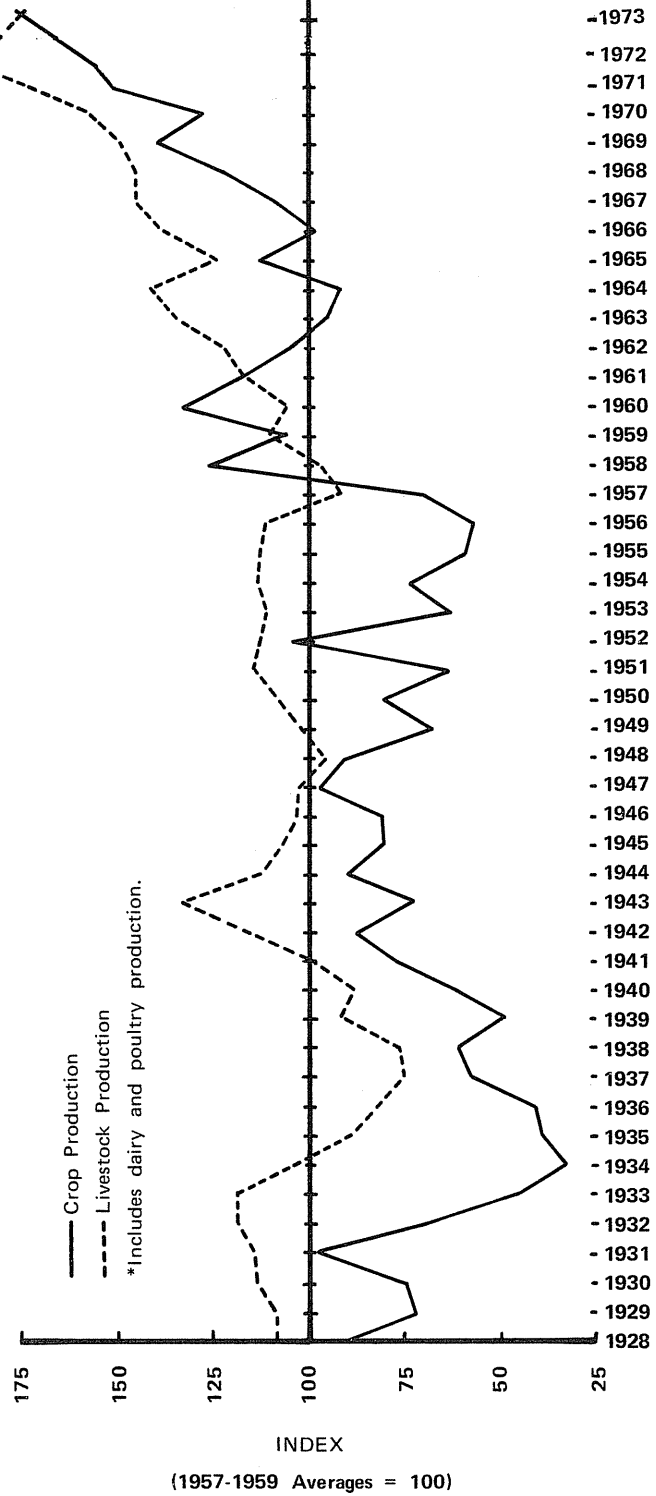
