FOREWORD

THE ELEVENTH EDITION OF THE KANSAS STATISTICAL ABSTRACT COVERS 20 DIFFERENT CATEGORIES OF INFORMATION INCLUDING POPULATION; VITAL STATISTICS AND HEALTH; HOUSING; ELECTIONS; EDUCATION; CLIMATE; EMPLOYMENT, EARNINGS, AND PUBLIC WELFARE; INCOME, EXPENDITURE, AND WEALTH; BANKING AND FINANCE; STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT FINANCES AND EMPLOYMENT; CRIME AND LAW ENFORCEMENT; PARKS AND RECREATION; COMMUNICATIONS; POWER; TRANSPORTATION; AGRICULTURE; MINING AND MINERAL PRODUCTS; CONSTRUCTION; MANUFACTURING; AND DISTRIBUTION. THE STATISTICS REPORTED ARE TAKEN FROM CURRENT STATE AND FEDERAL CENSUSES AND OTHER REPORTS FROM STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AS WELL AS THE PRIVATE SECTOR. THE MOST RECENT AVAILABLE SOURCE IS USED IN EACH CASE.

THE 1975 ABSTRACT PROVIDES EXPANDED COVERAGE IN HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS, THE KANSAS FARM CONSERVATION PROGRAM, PERSONAL EXPENDITURE FOR SELECTED GOODS AND PRICES RECEIVED BY KANSAS FARMERS. THE INCLUSION OF HOUSING DATA REPRESENTS A MUCH NEEDED INNOVATION ABOUT A SUBJECT OF GROWING IMPORTANCE TO KANSANS. SOME DELETIONS OF DATED MATERIAL HAVE BEEN MADE IN THE INTERESTS OF CURRENCY AND TO REDUCE UNNECESSARY COSTS.

WE INVITE READER SUGGESTIONS ABOUT WAYS TO IMPROVE THE ABSTRACT. THE DATA PROVIDED HERE SHOULD BE USEFUL TO INDIVIDUALS, OFFICIALS, AND AGENCIES IN BOTH THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTORS TO UNDERSTAND LIFE AND DEVELOPMENT IN KANSAS DURING THE BICENTENNIAL YEAR.

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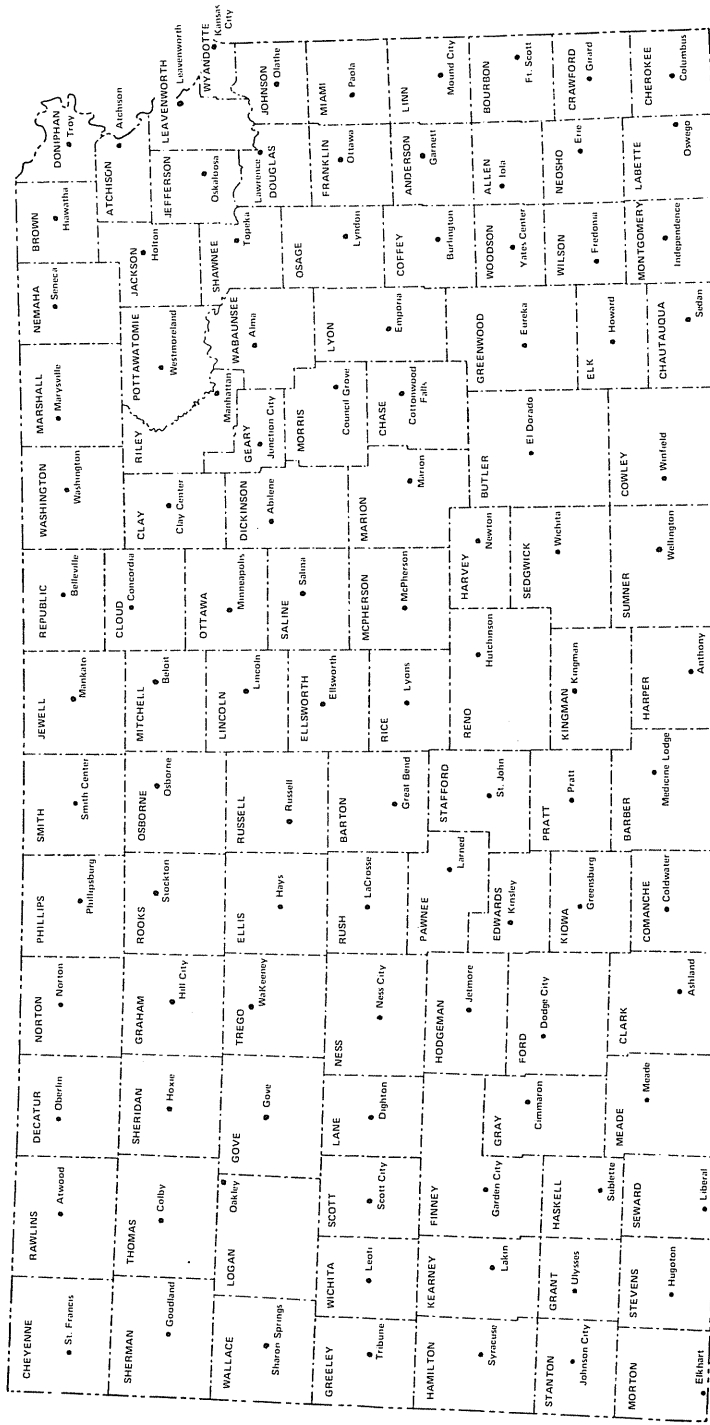

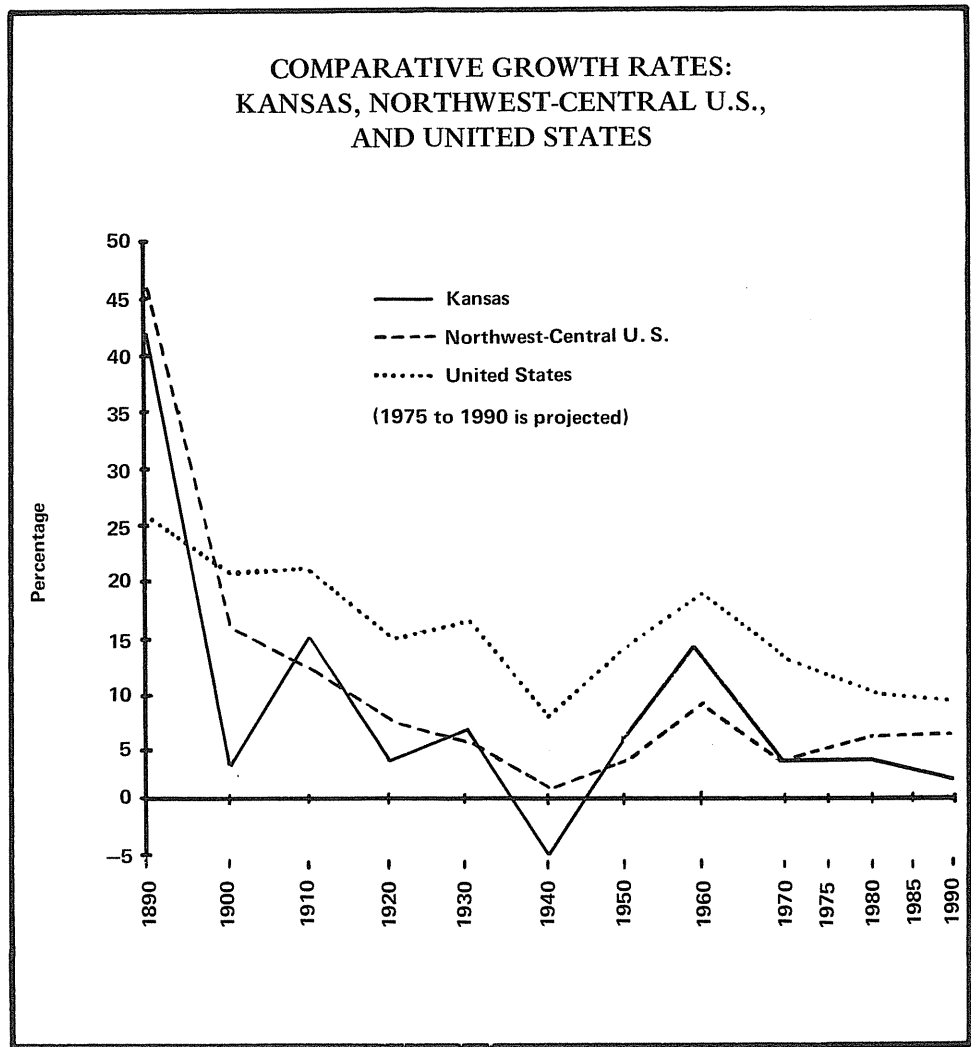

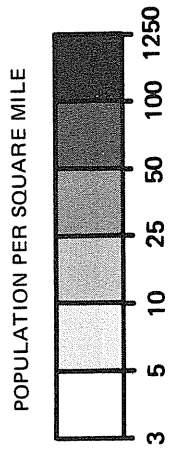
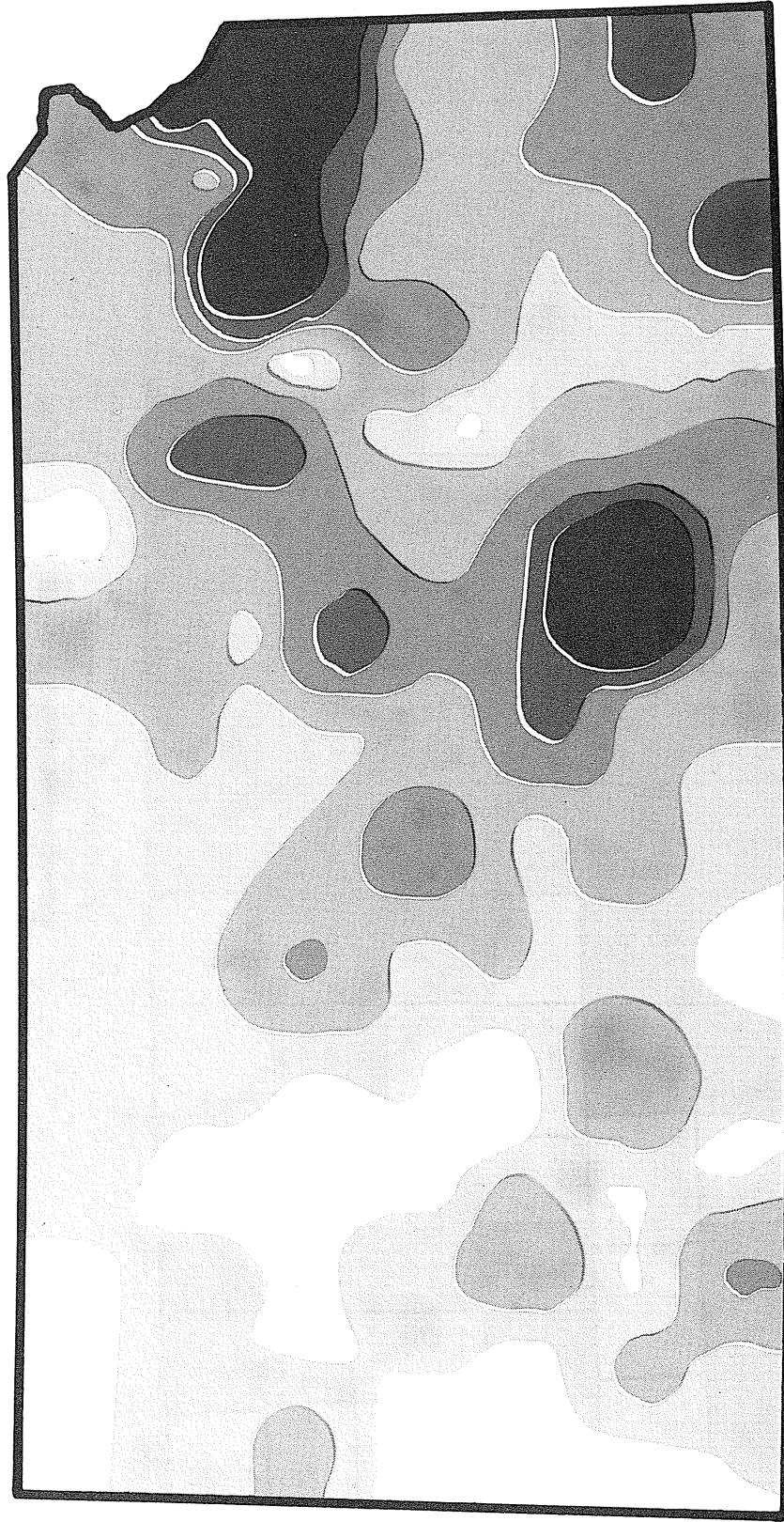

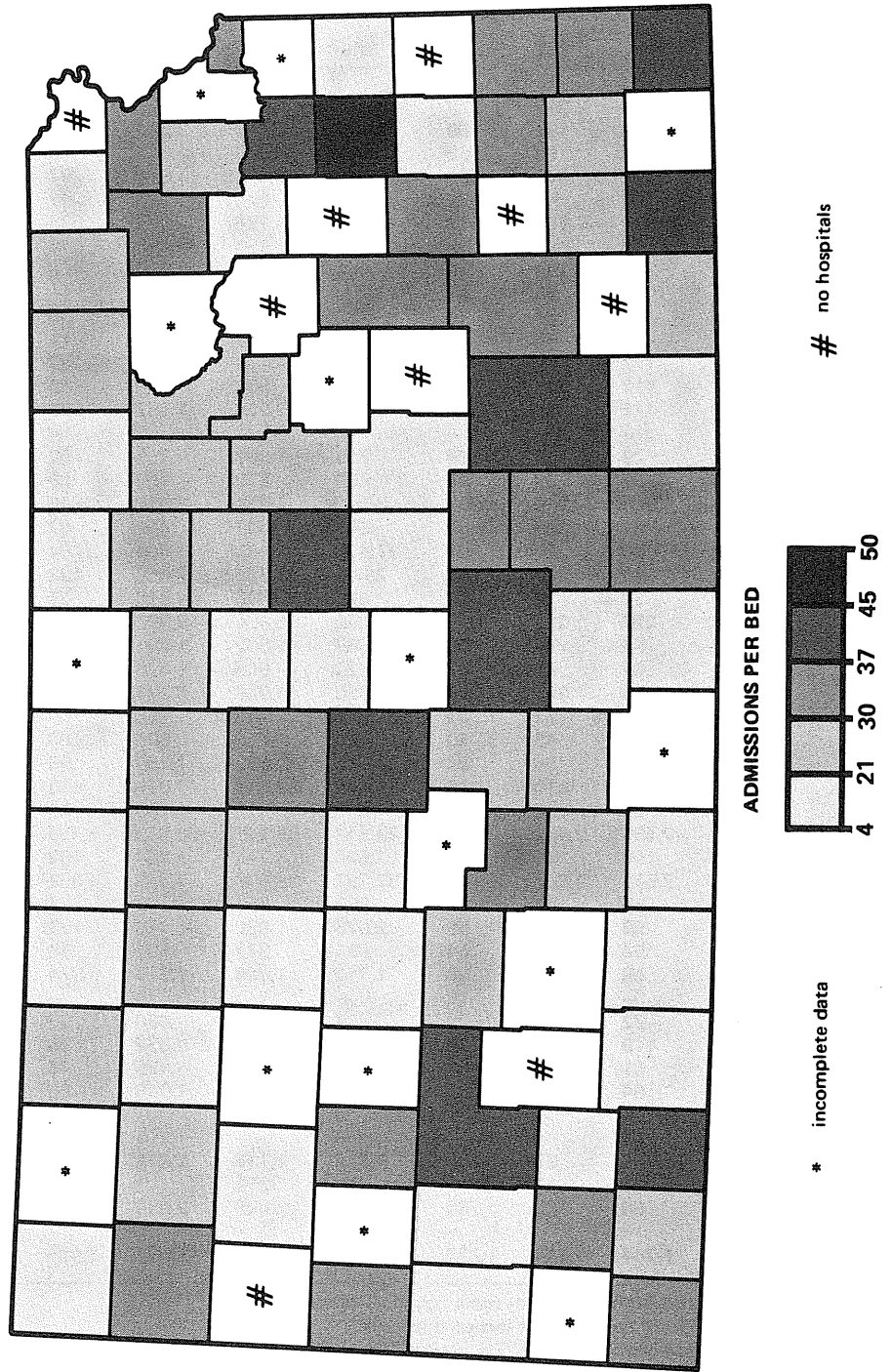

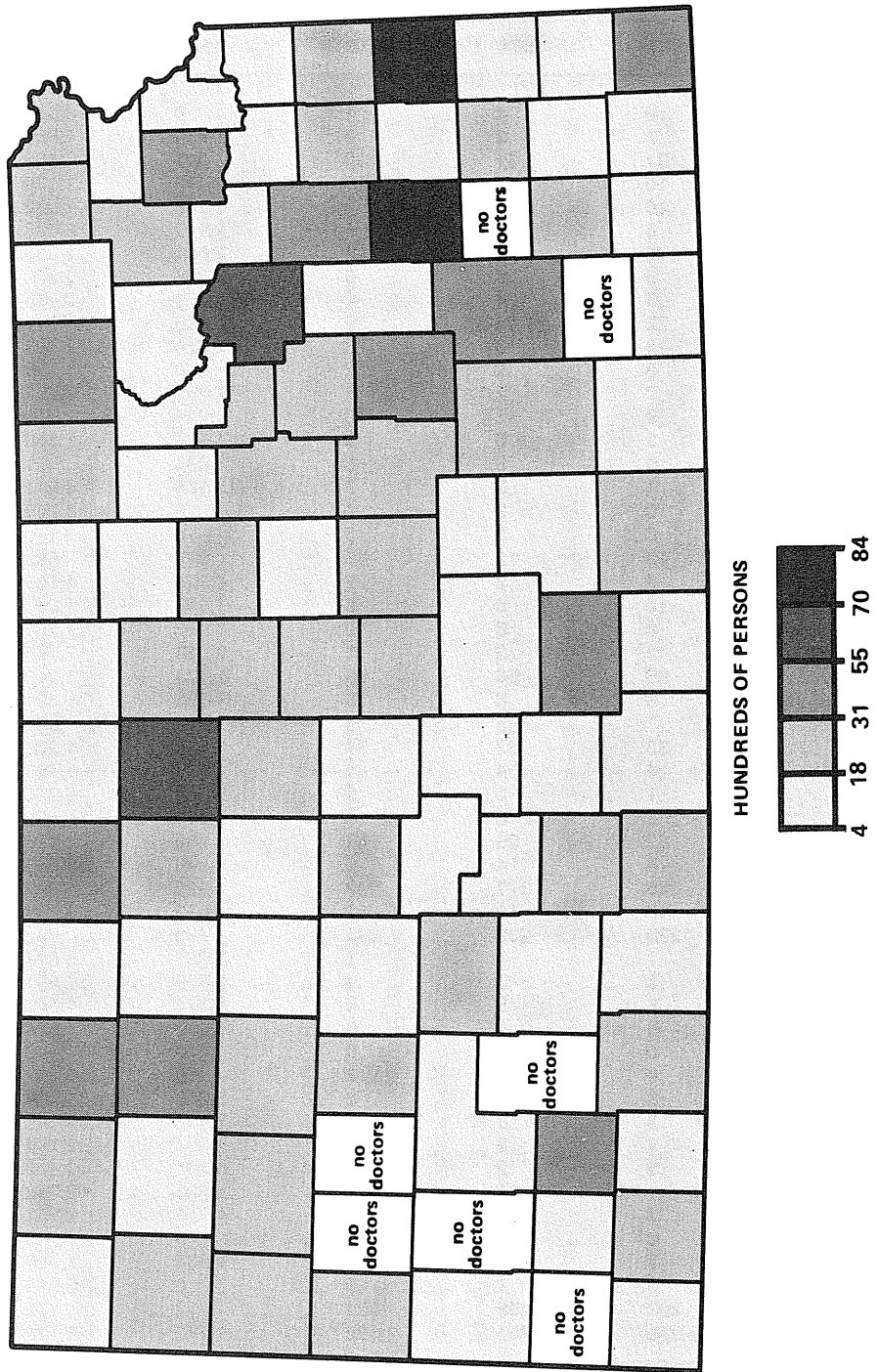

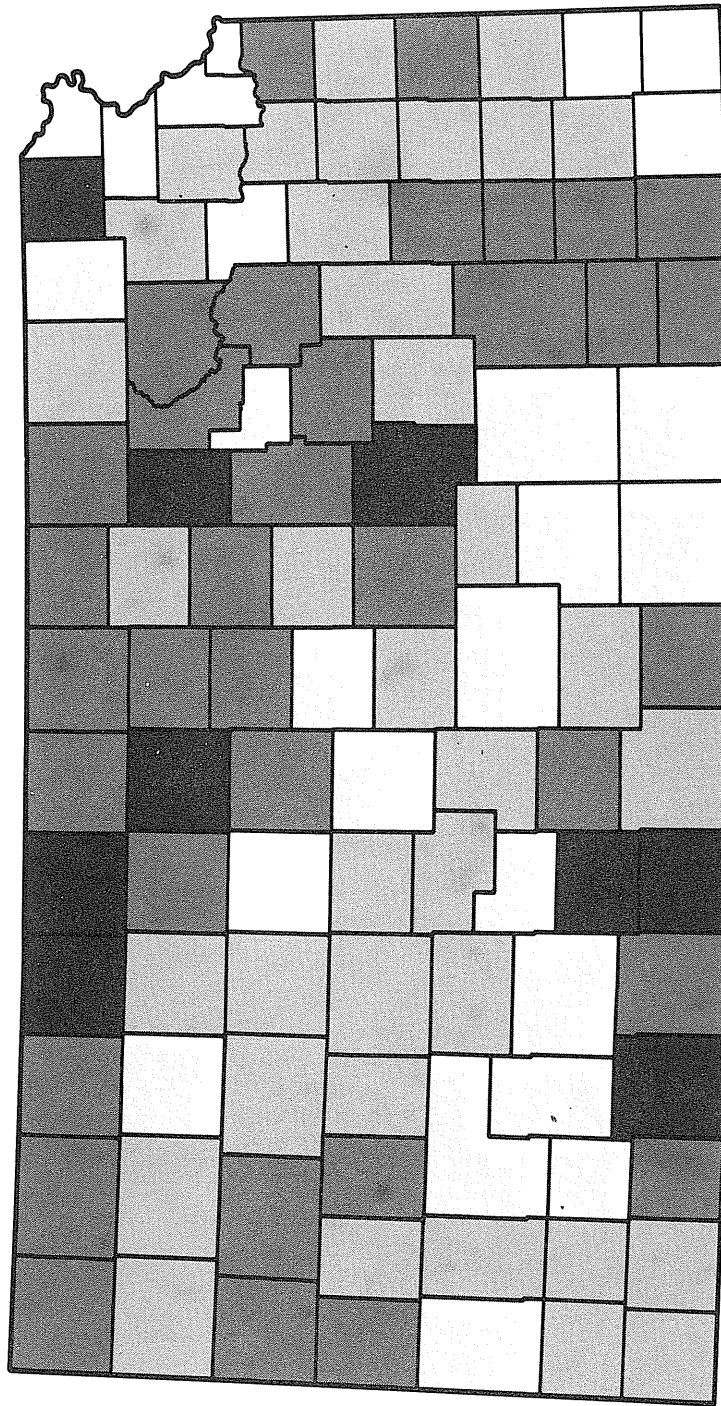

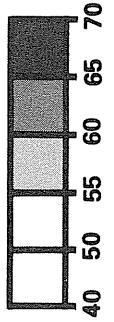

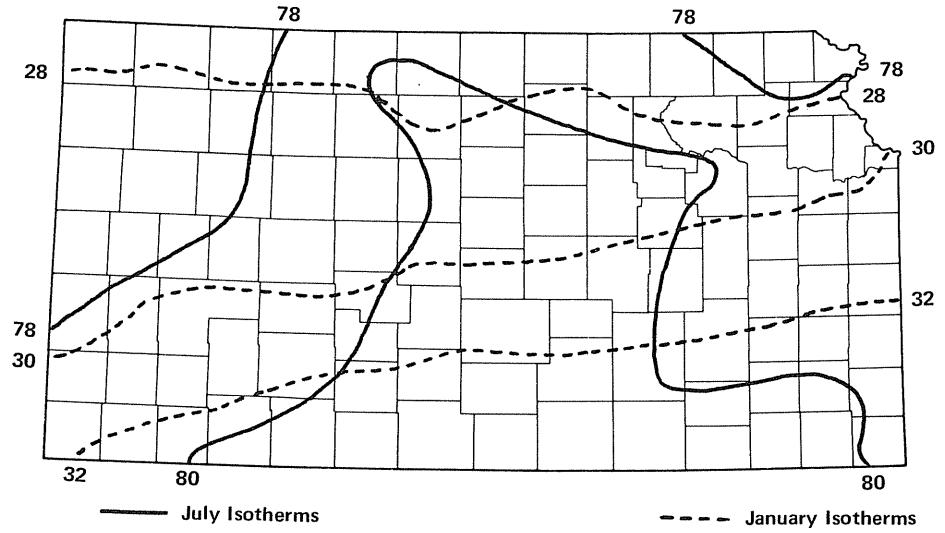

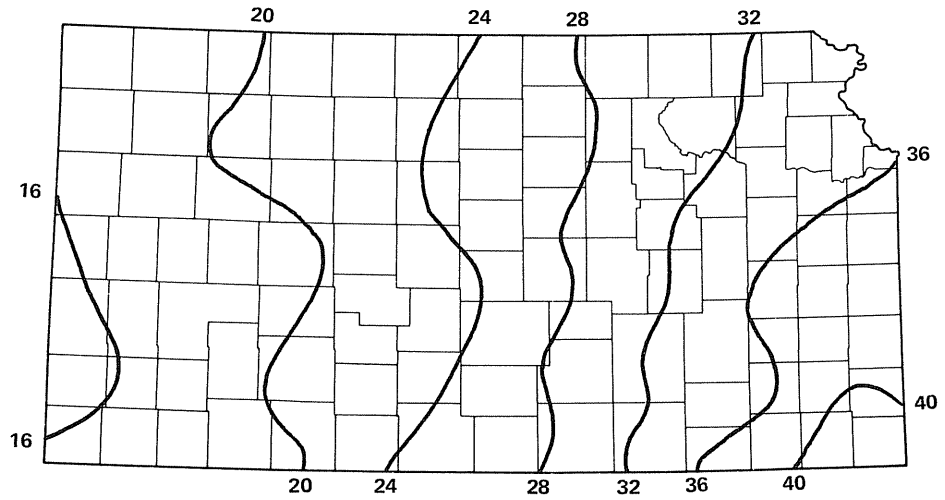

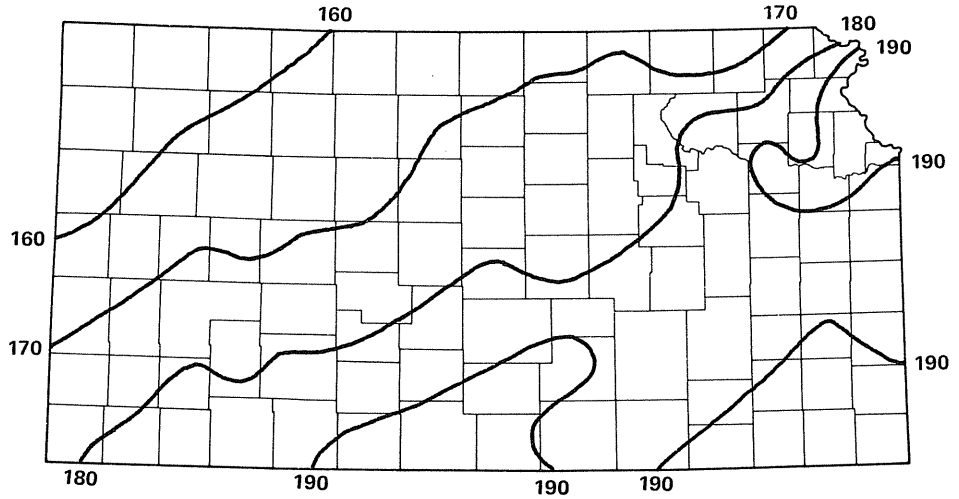
KANSAS AVERAGE DAILY TEMPERATURES, (°F)



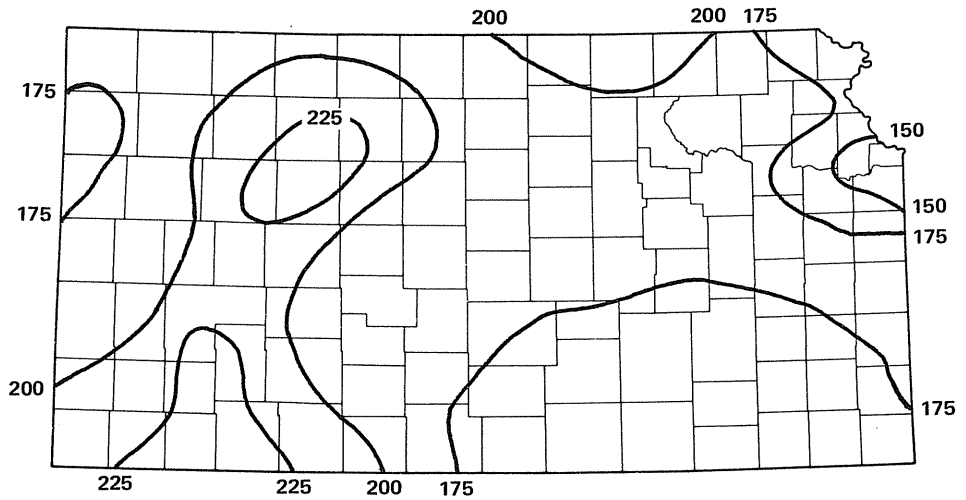
KANSAS AVERAGE ANNUAL PRECIPITATION, (INCHES)

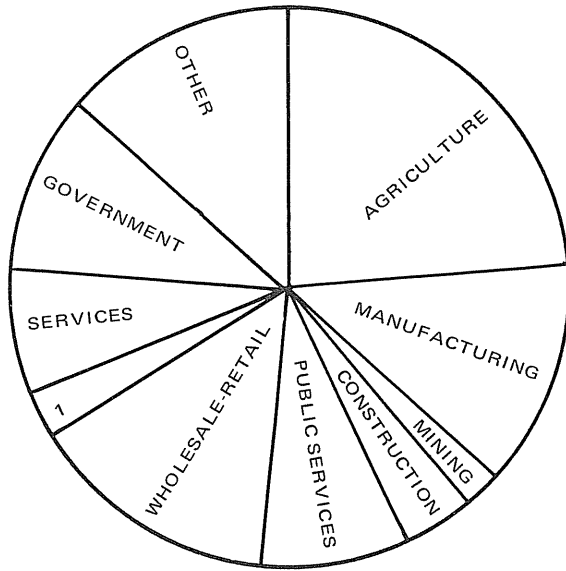

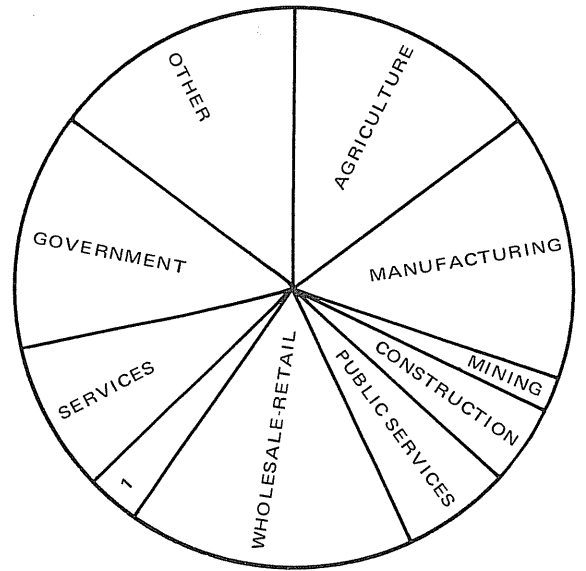

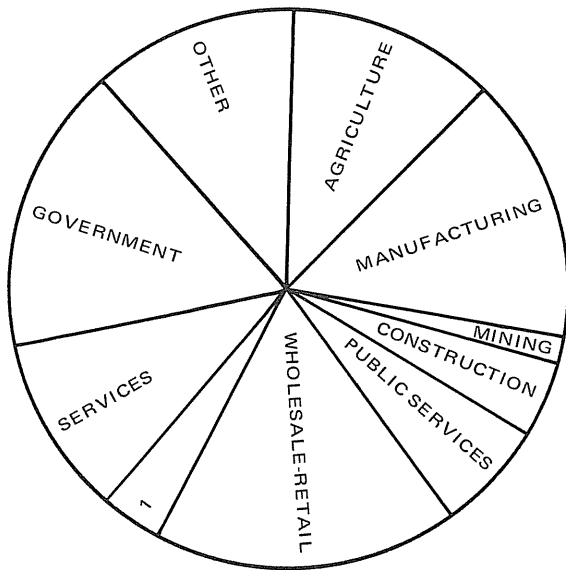
EMPLOYMENT IN KANSAS BY SECTORS 1950-1970



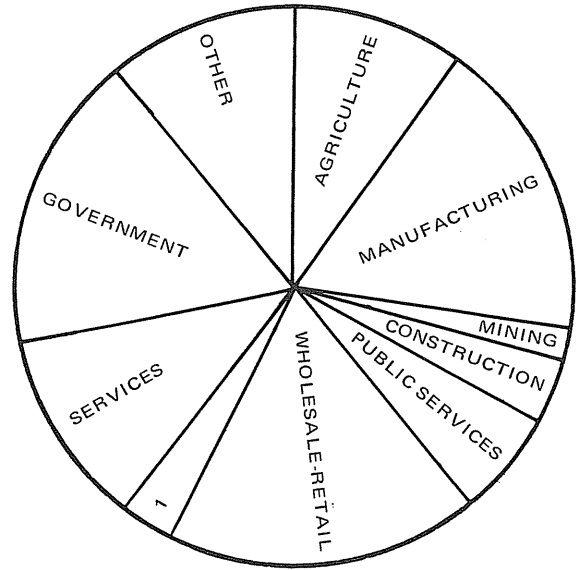

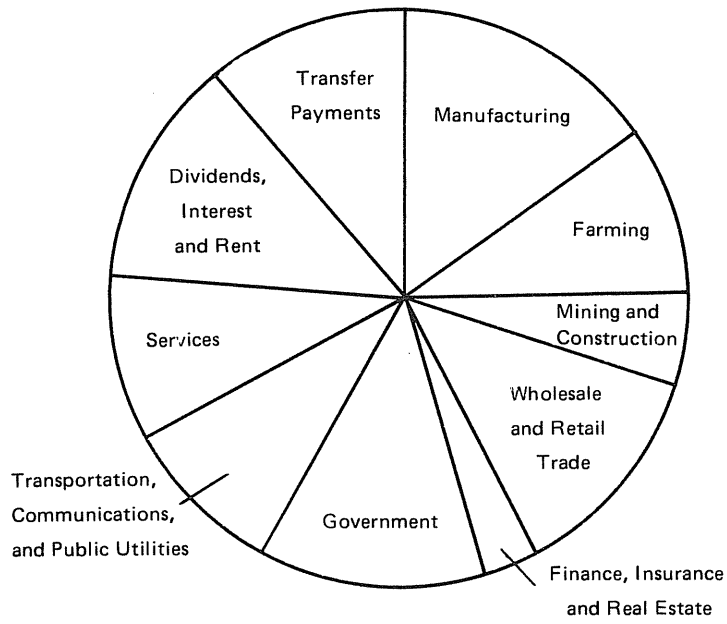

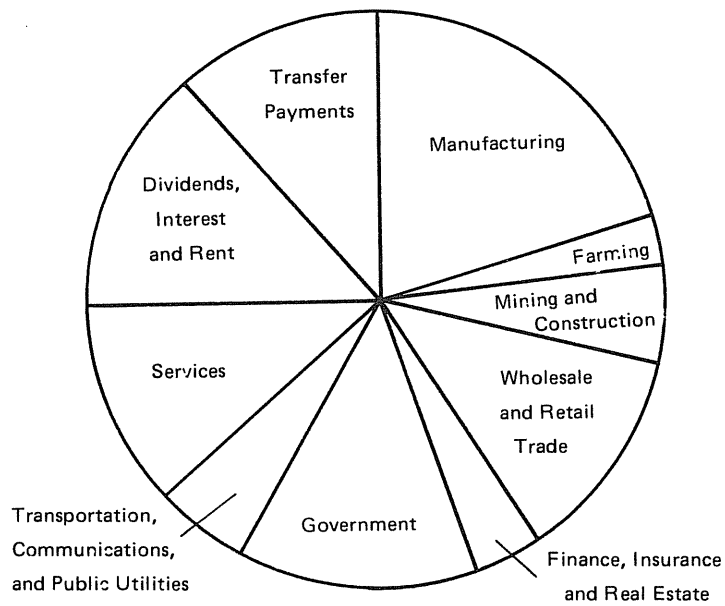

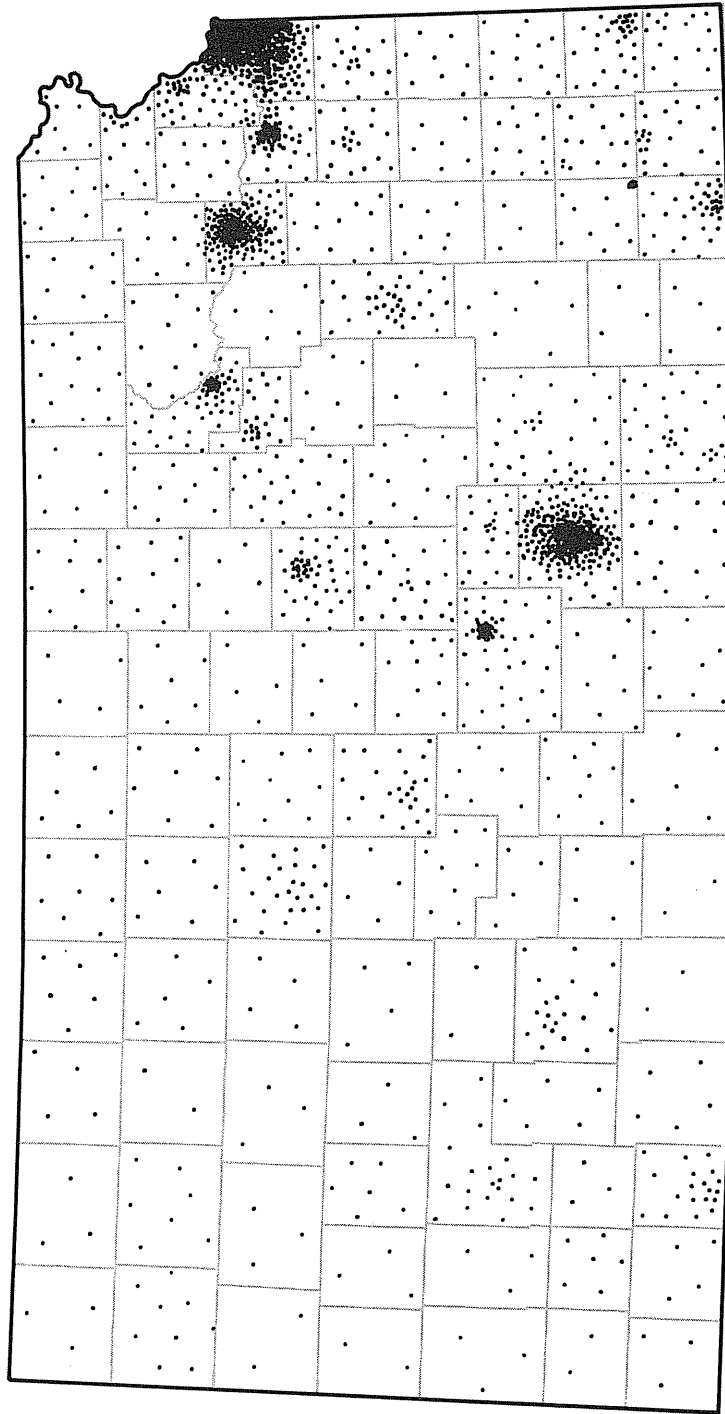

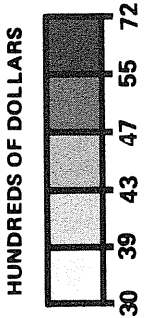
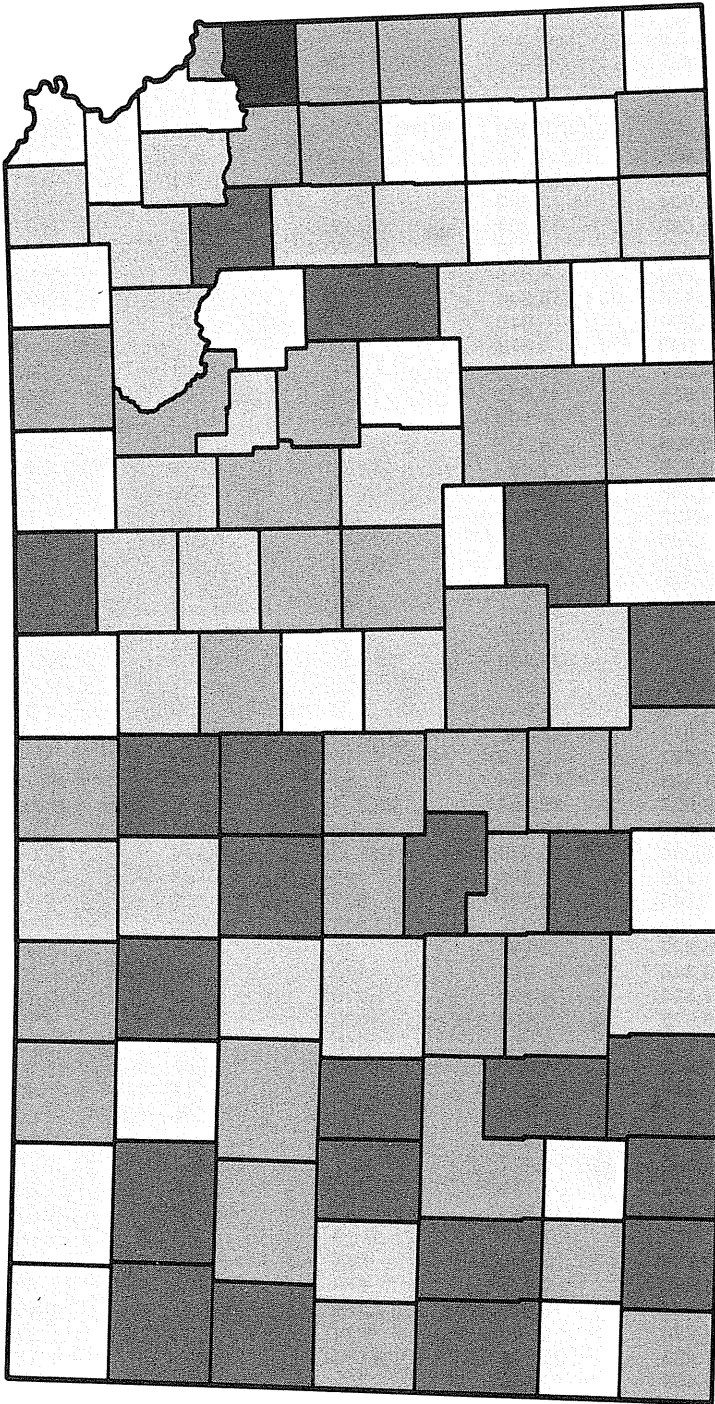

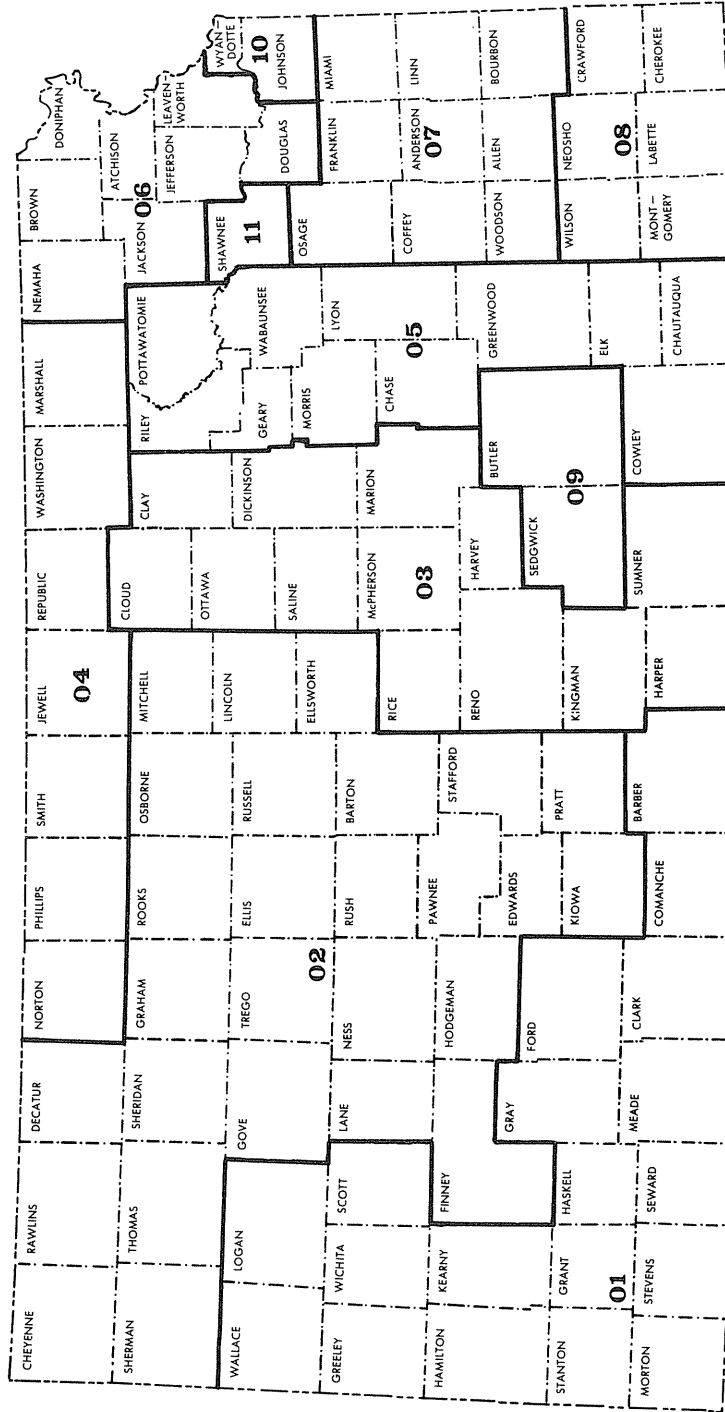

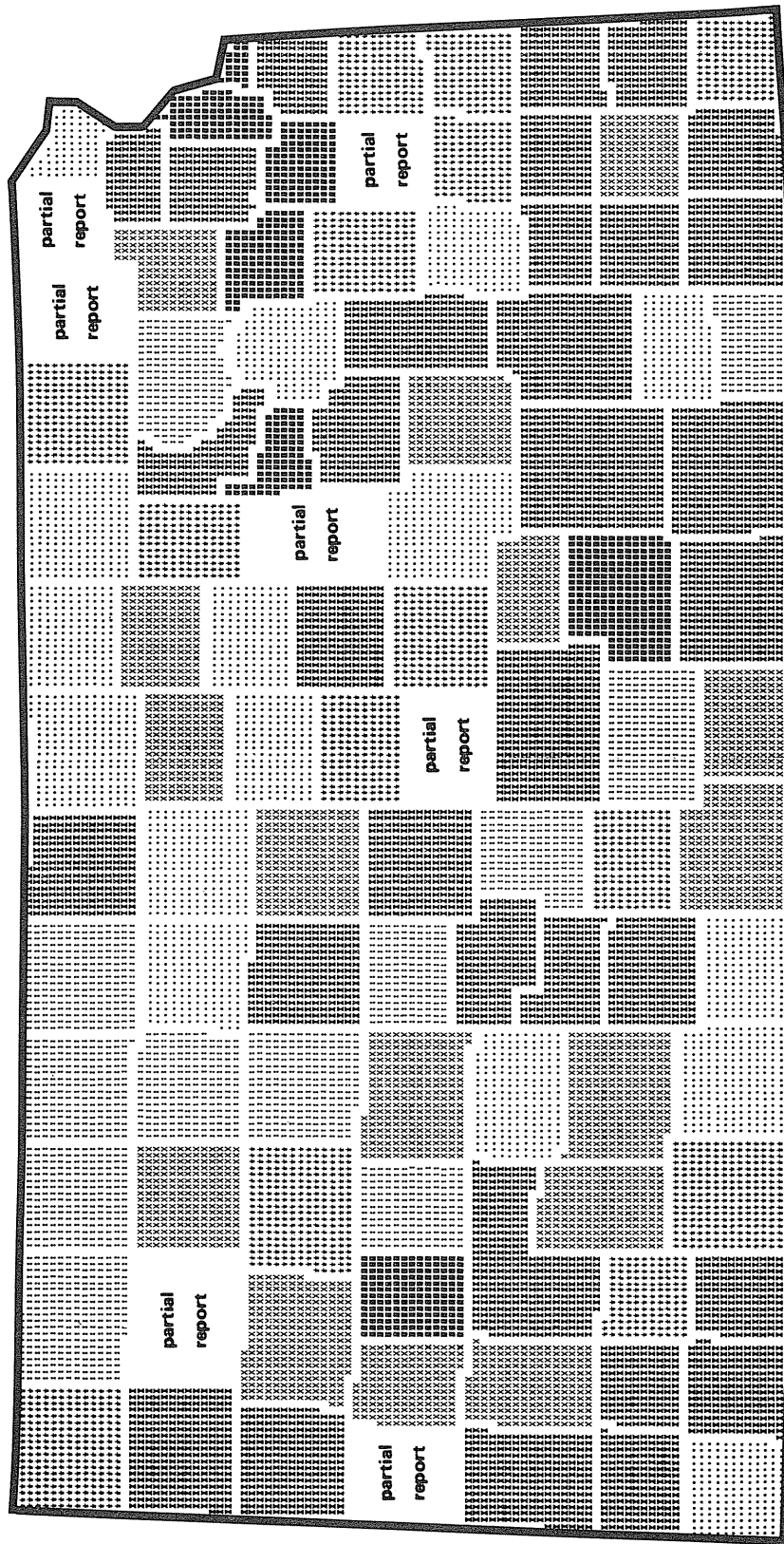

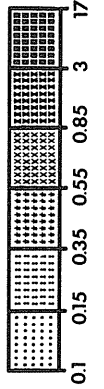

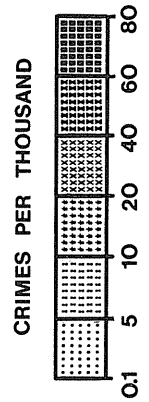
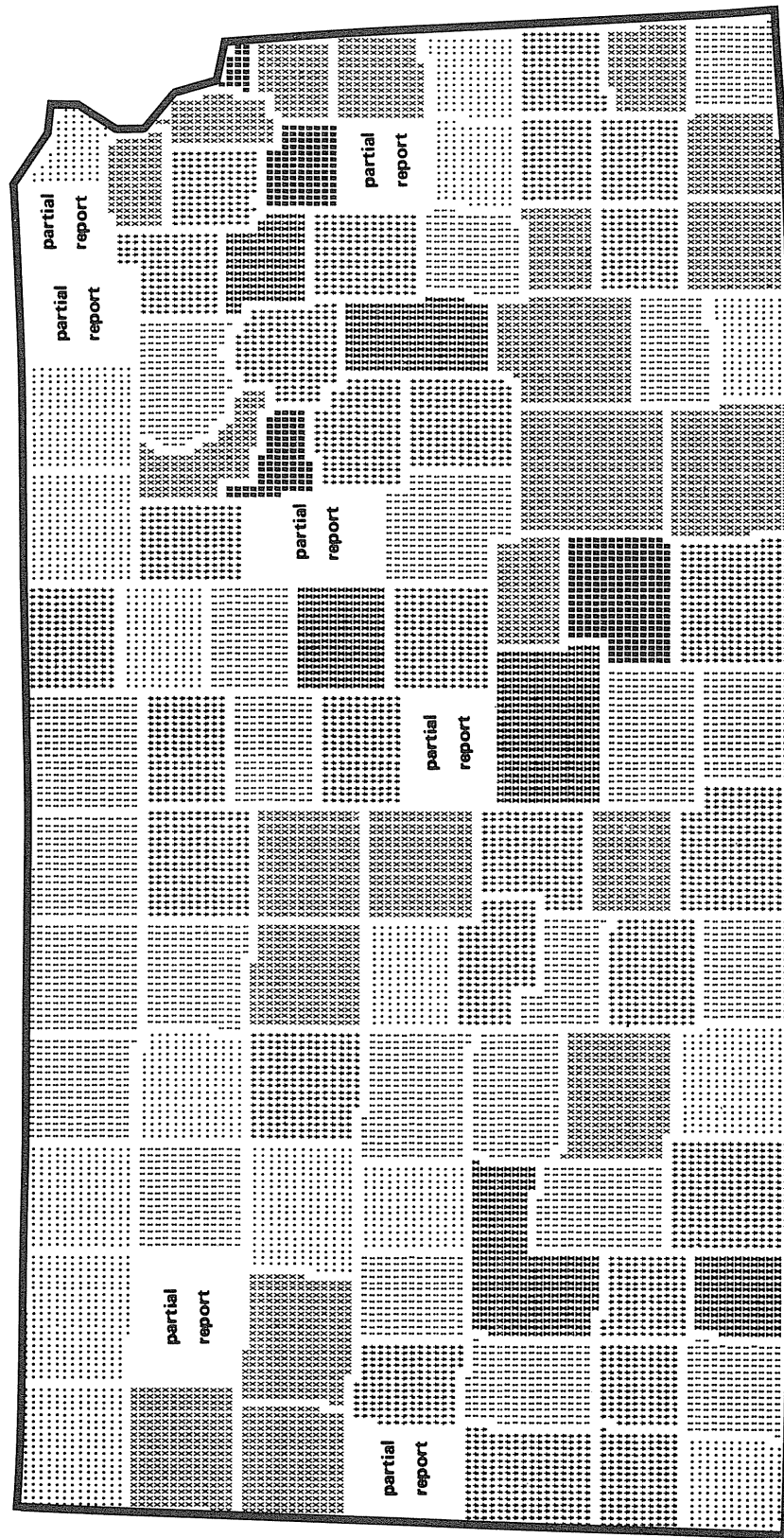
VIOLENT CRIMES 1974



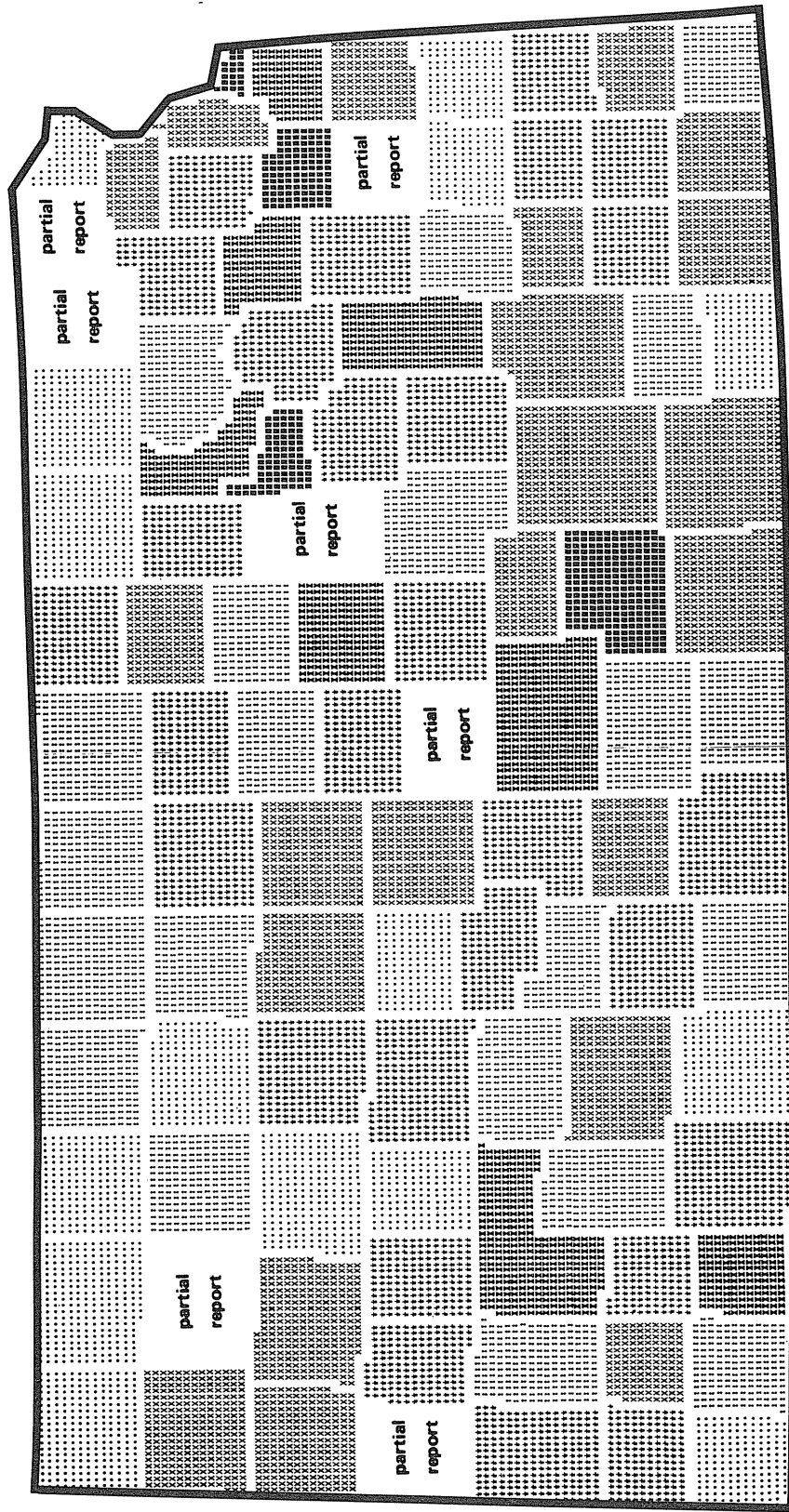
CRIMES PER THOUSAND



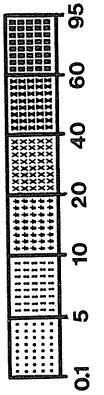
PROPERTY CRIMES 1974

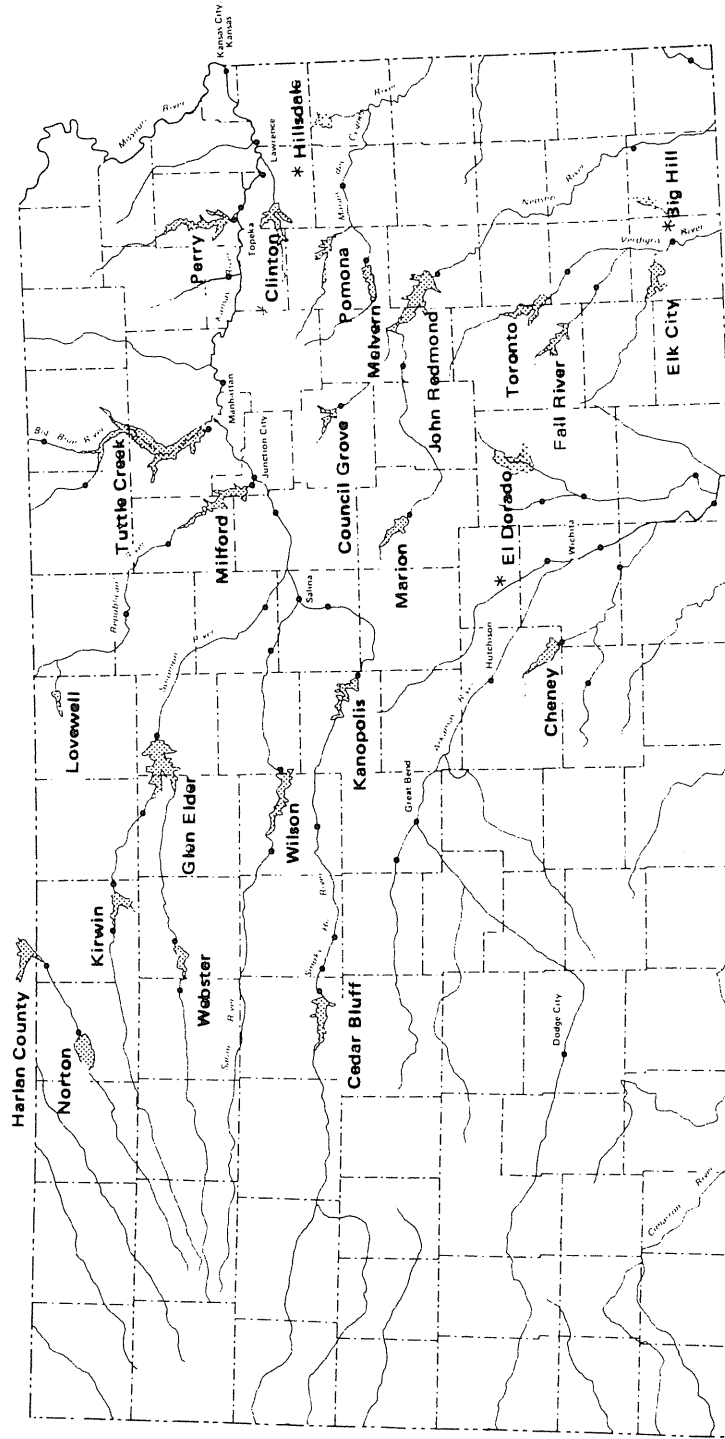

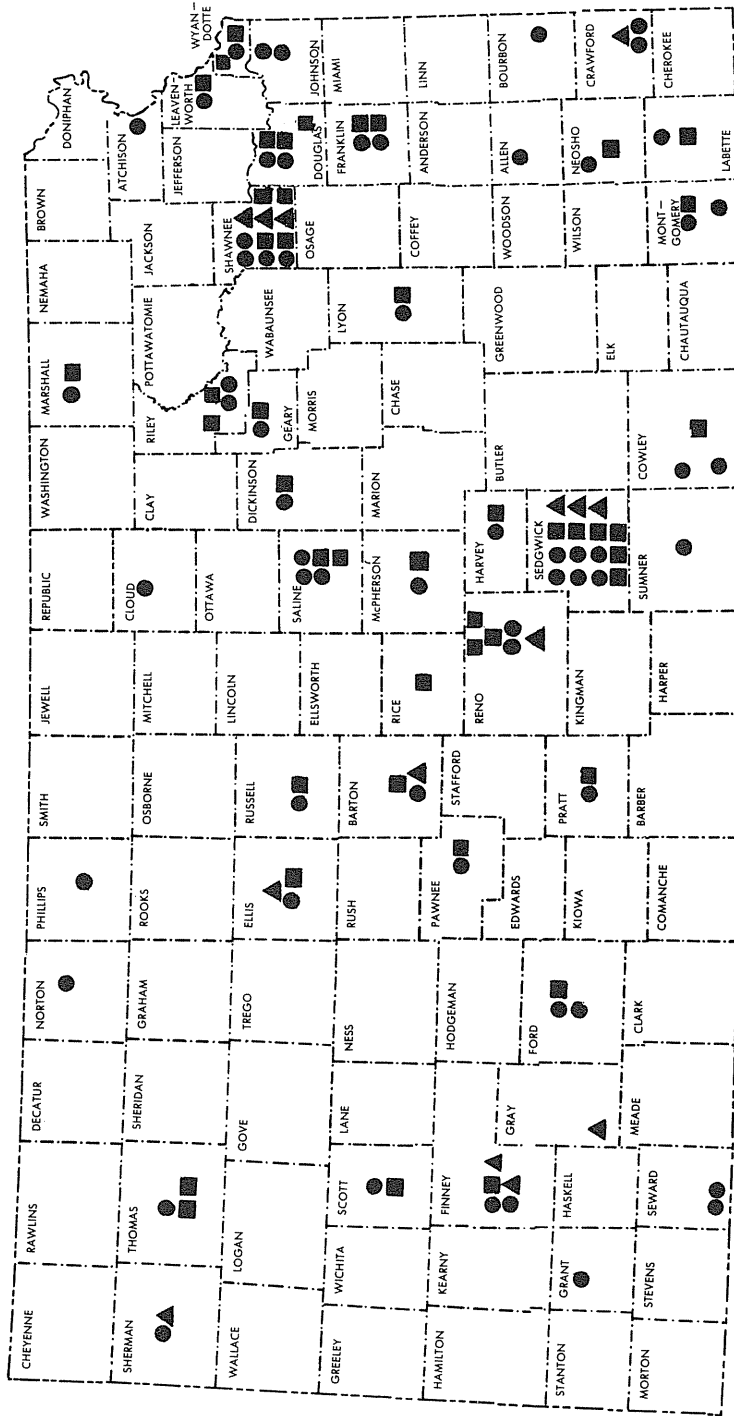

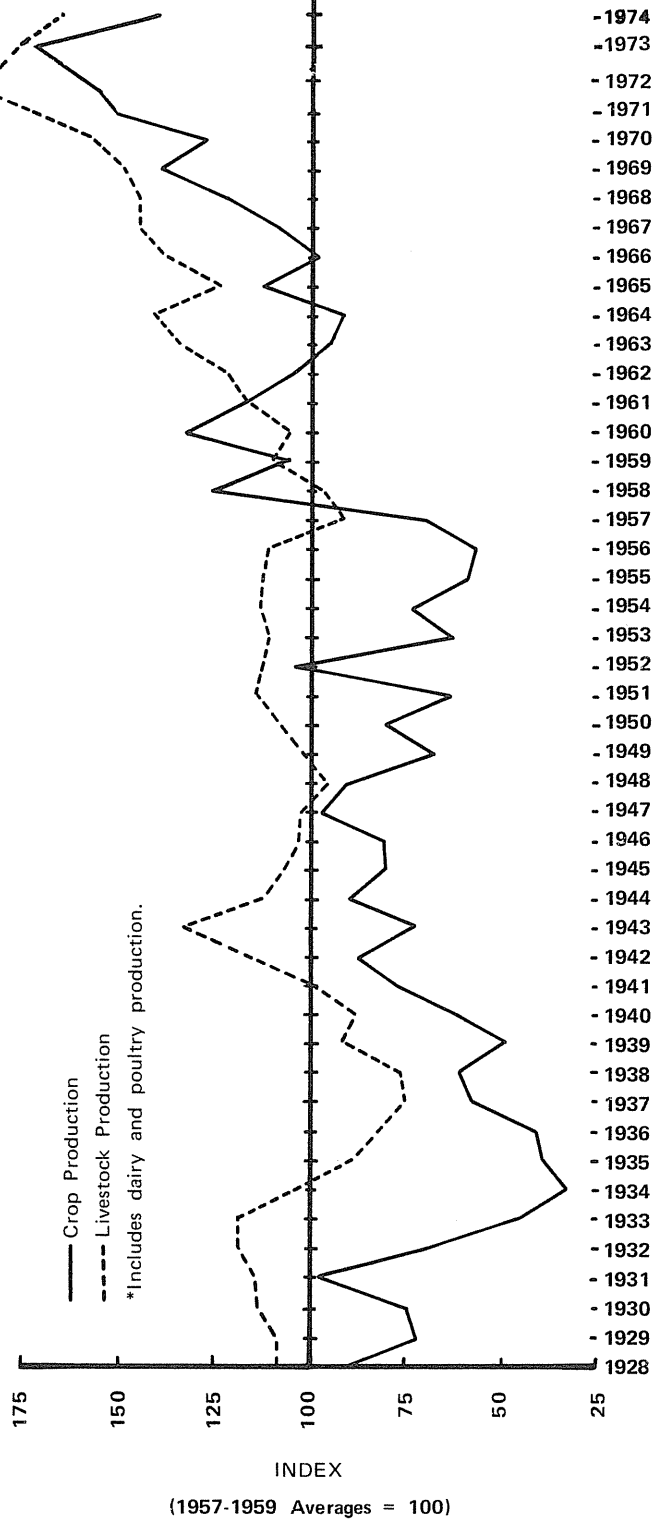
