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## FOREWORD

THE THIRTEENTH EDITION OF THE KANSAS STATISTICAL ABSTRACT COVERS 19 DIFFERENT CATEGORIES OF INFORMATION INCLUDING POPULATION; VITAL STATISTICS AND HEALTH; HOUSING, AND CONSTRUCTION; ELECTIONS; EDUCATION; CLIMATE; EMPLOYMENT, EARNINGS, AND PUBLIC WELFARE; INCOME, EXPENDITURE, AND WEALTH; BANKING AND FINANCE; STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT FINANCES AND EMPLOYMENT; CRIME AND LAW ENFORCEMENT; PARKS AND RECREATION; COMMUNICATIONS; POWER; TRANSPORTATION; AGRICULTURE; MINING AND MINERAL PRODUCTS; MANUFACTURING; AND DISTRIBUTION. THE STATISTICS REPORTED ARE TAKEN FROM CURRENT STATE AND FEDERAL CENSUSES AND OTHER REPORTS FROM STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AS WELL AS THE PRIVATE SECTOR. THE MOST RECENT AVAILABLE SOURCE IS USED IN EACH CASE.

THE 1977 ABSTRACT CONTINUES THE EXPANDED COVERAGE OF THE 1976 ISSUE AND ADDS NEW INFORMATION ON VITAL STATISTICS AND HEALTH (INDUCED ABORTIONS BY AGE GROUPS), EMPLOYMENT EARNINGS AND PUBLIC WELFARE (AVERAGE CIVILIAN LABOR FORCE ESTIMATES FOR COUNTIES) AND AGRICULTURE (GROSS AND NET FARM INCOME) (GROSS FARM PRODUCT). SOME DELETIONS OF DATED MATERIAL HAVE BEEN MADE IN THE INTERESTS OF CURRENCY AND TO REDUCE UNNECESSARY COSTS.

WE INVITE READER SUGGESTIONS ABOUT WAYS TO IMPROVE THE ABSTRACT. THE DATA PROVIDED HERE SHOULD BE USEFUL TO INDIVIDUALS, OFFICIALS, AND AGENCIES IN BOTH THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTORS TO UNDERSTAND LIFE AND DEVELOPMENT IN KANSAS.

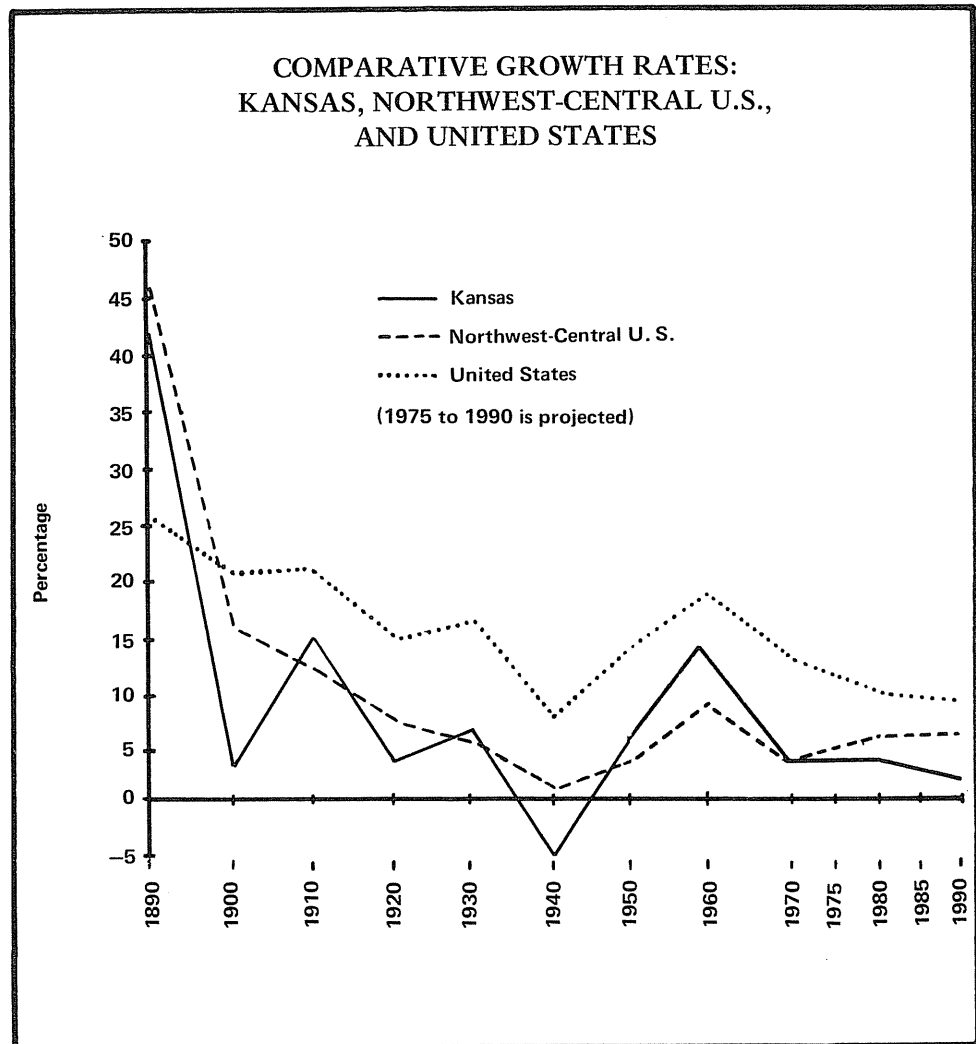

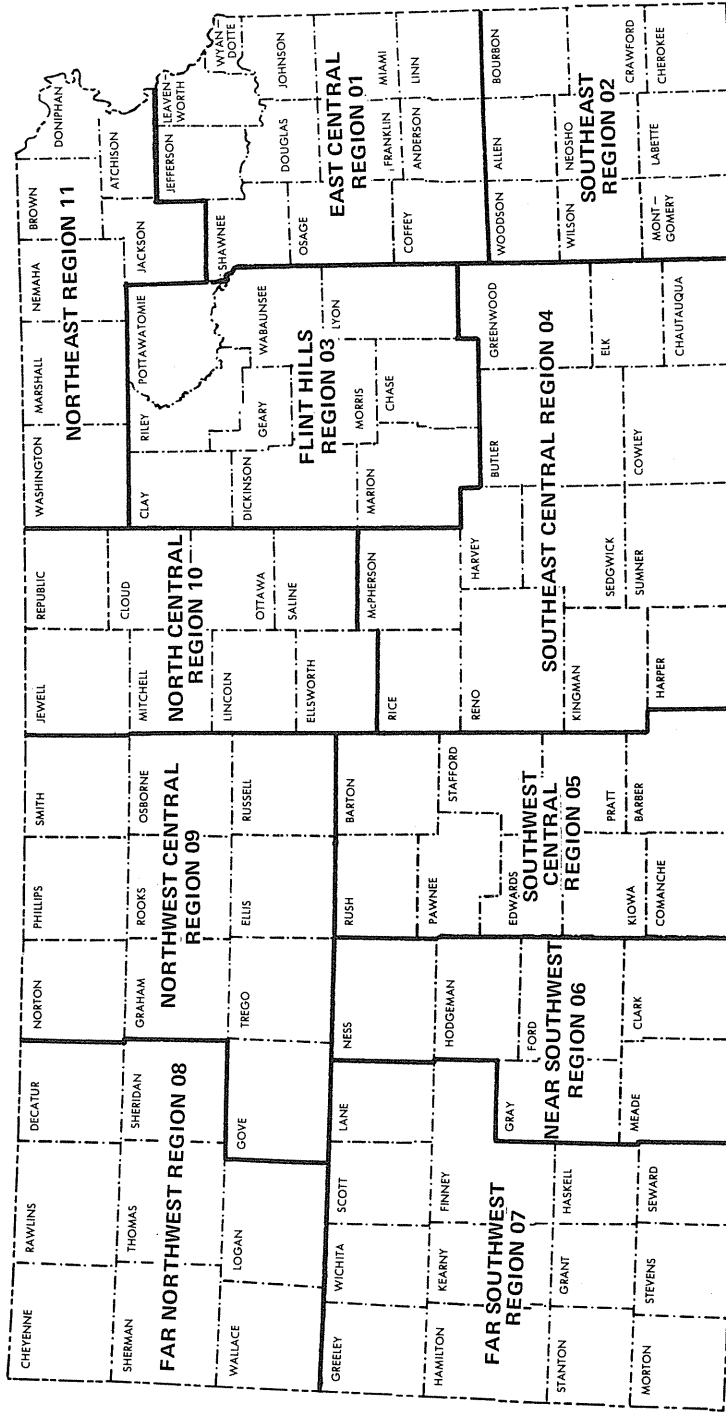

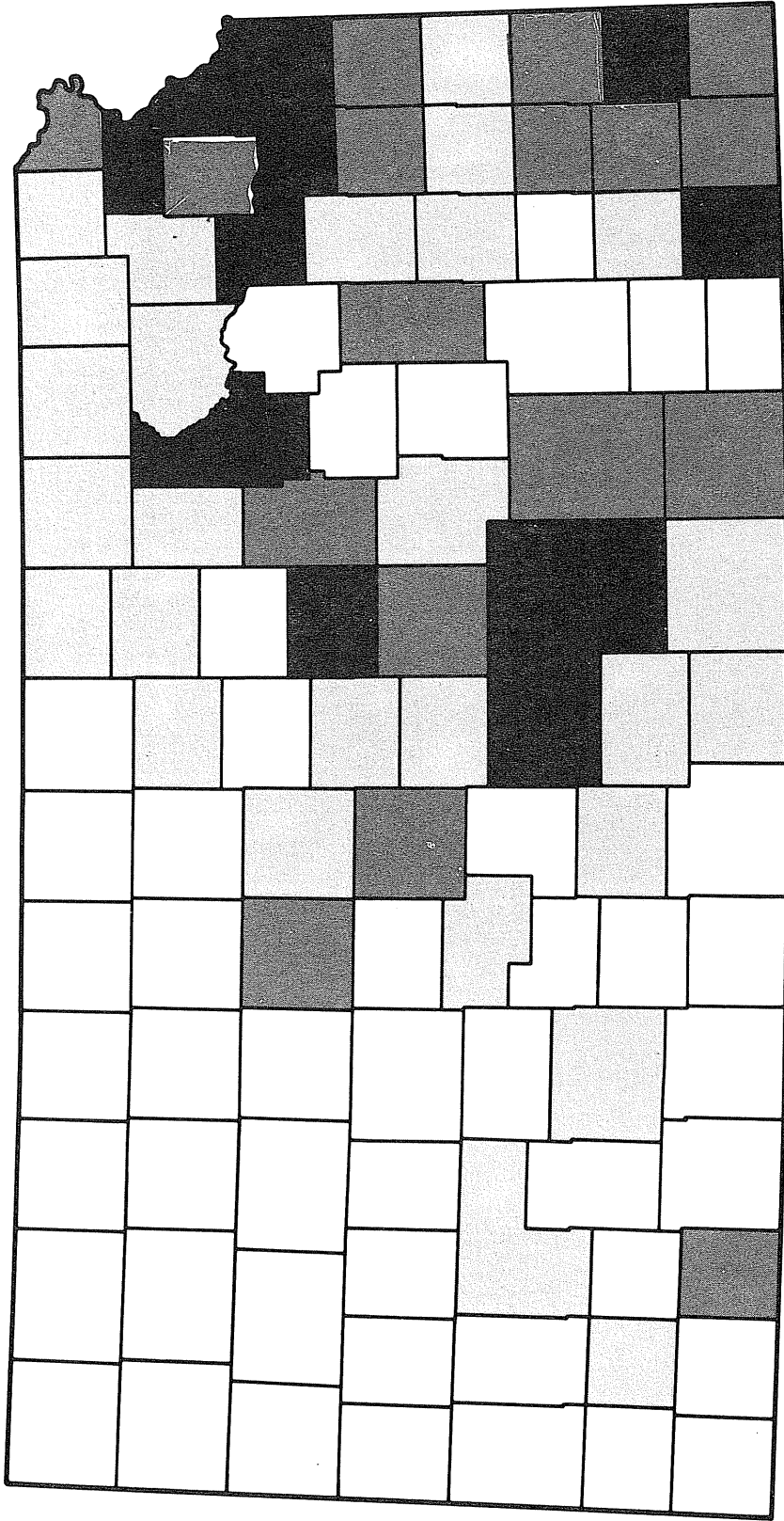

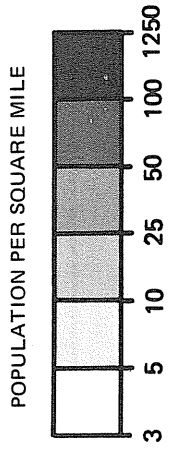
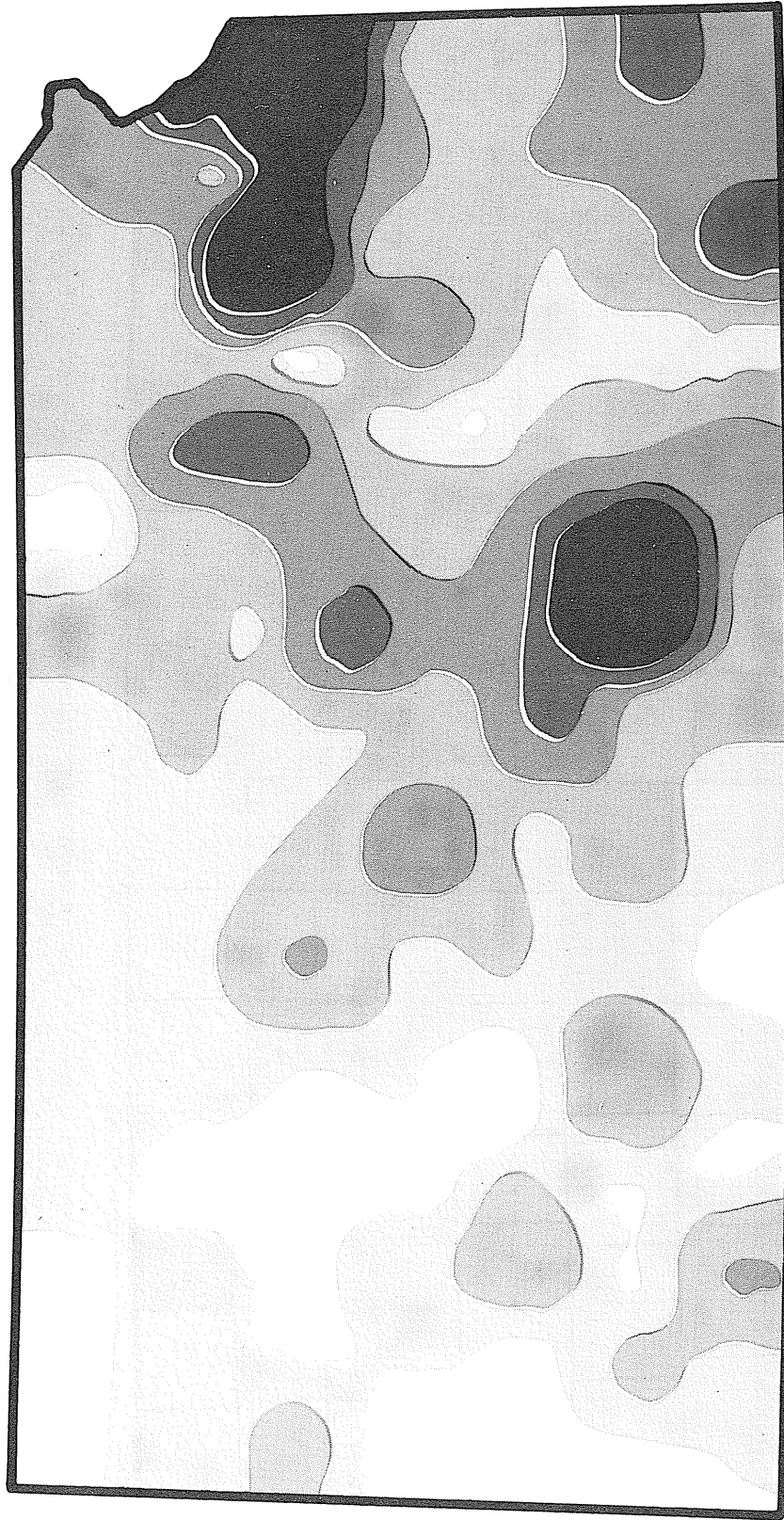

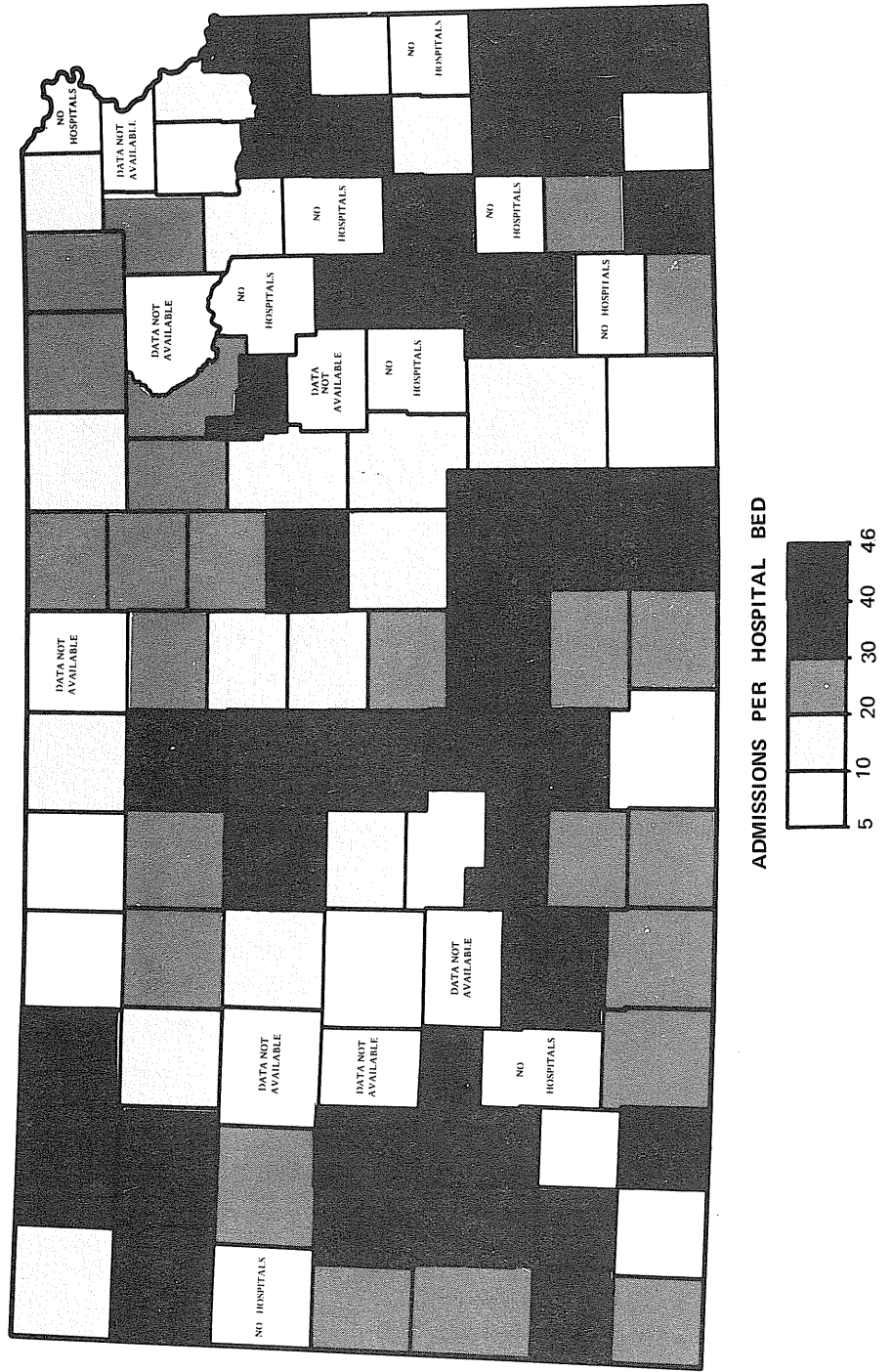

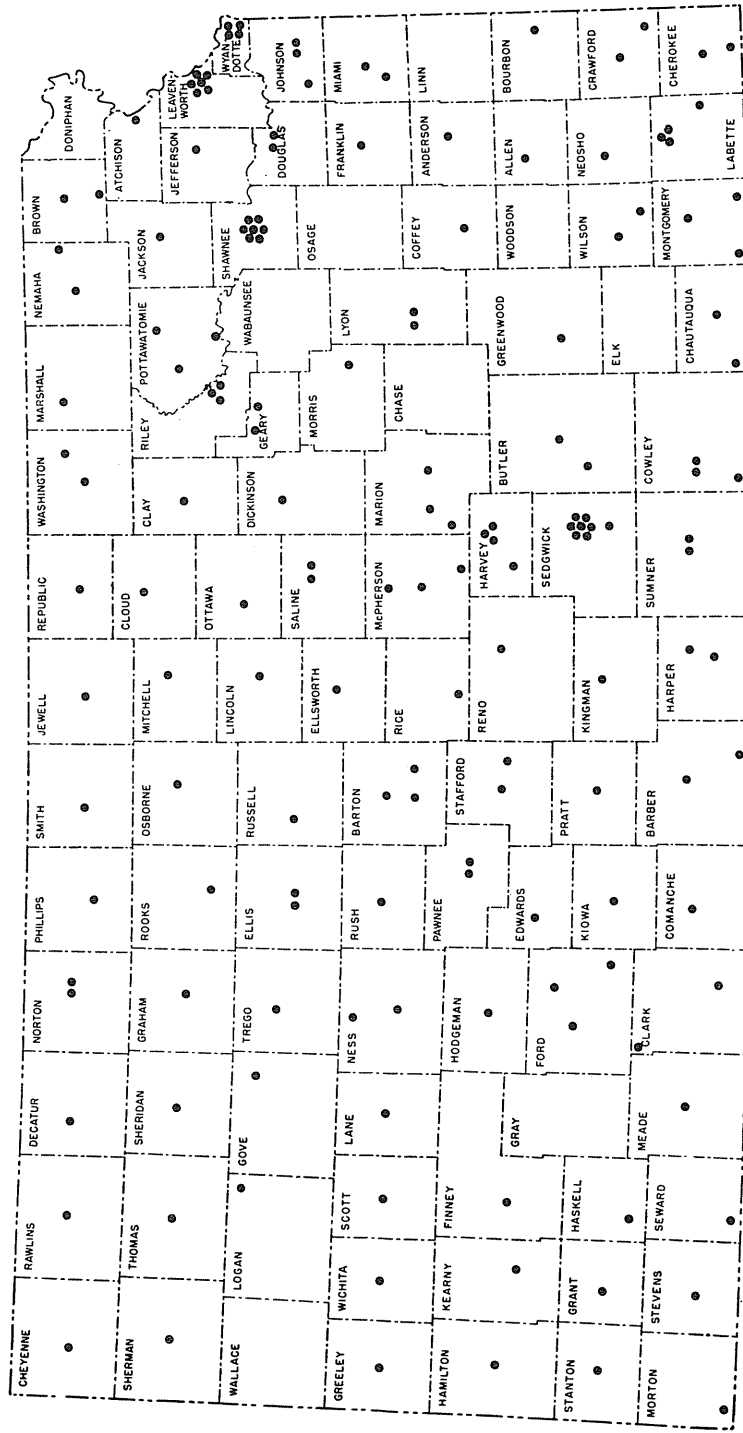

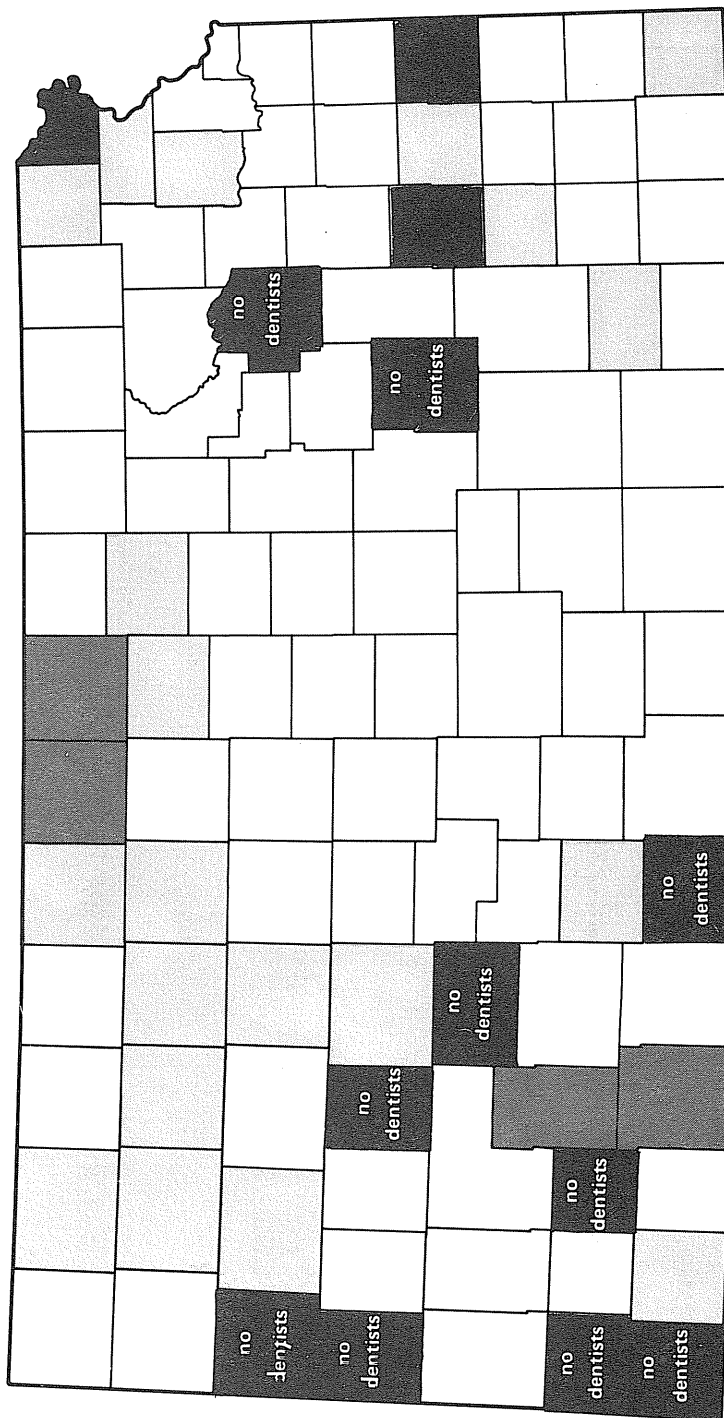

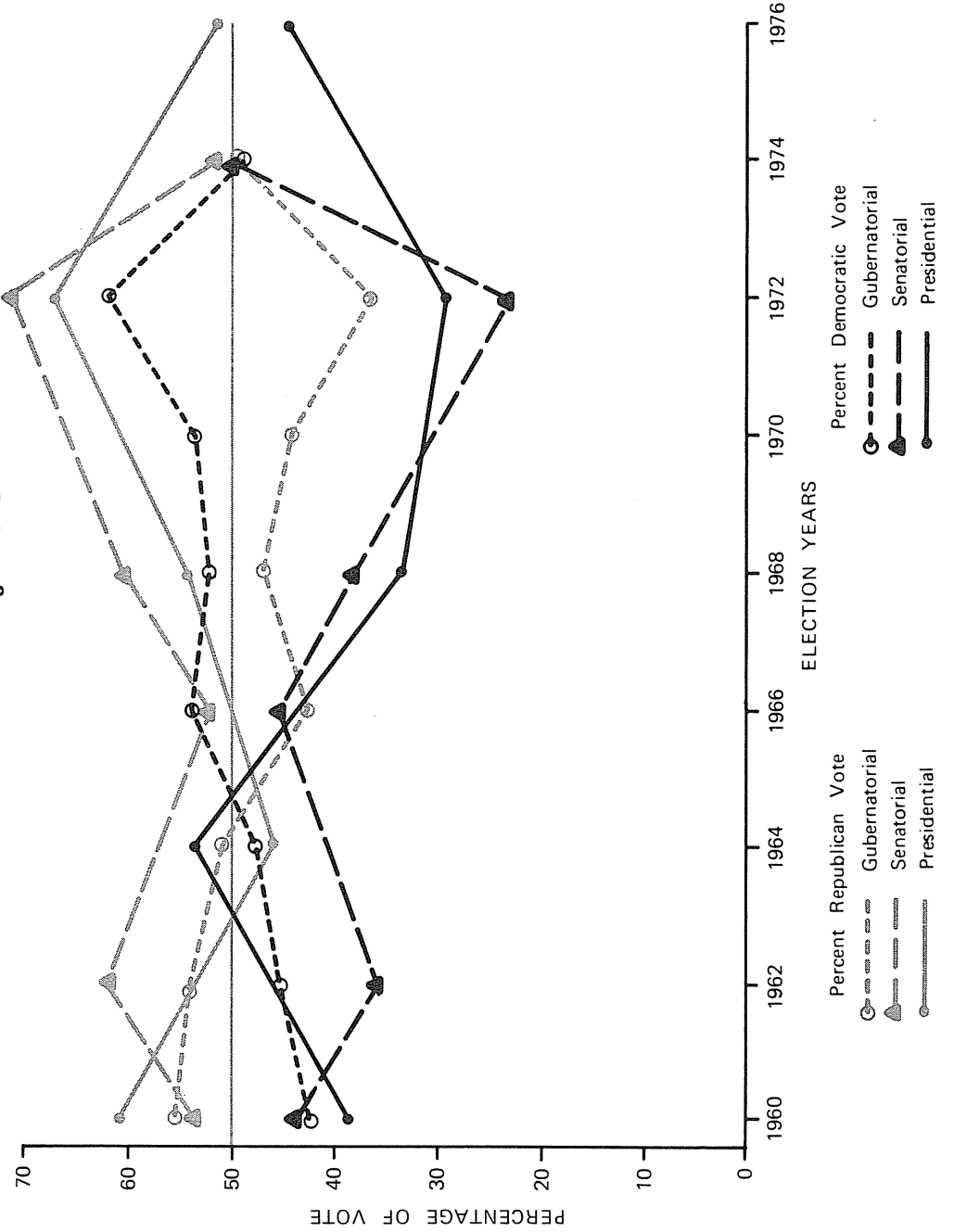

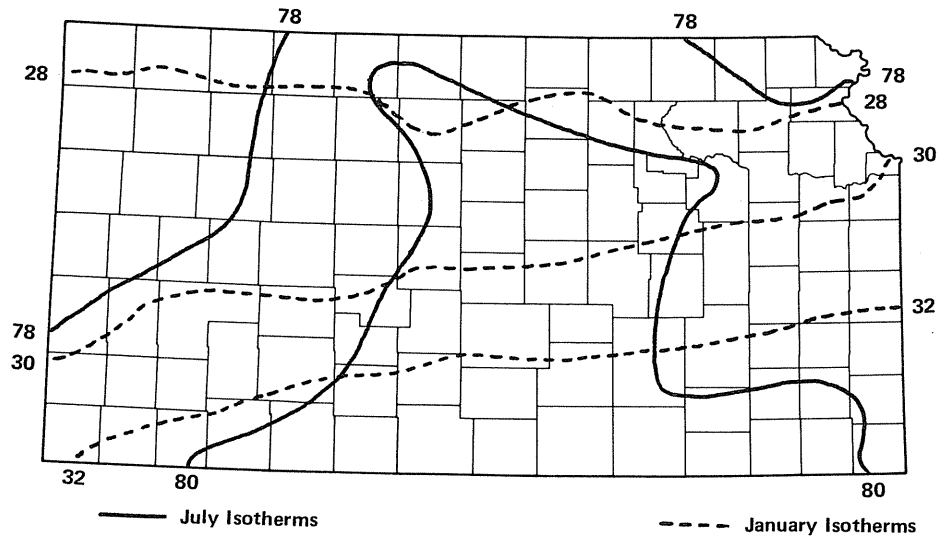

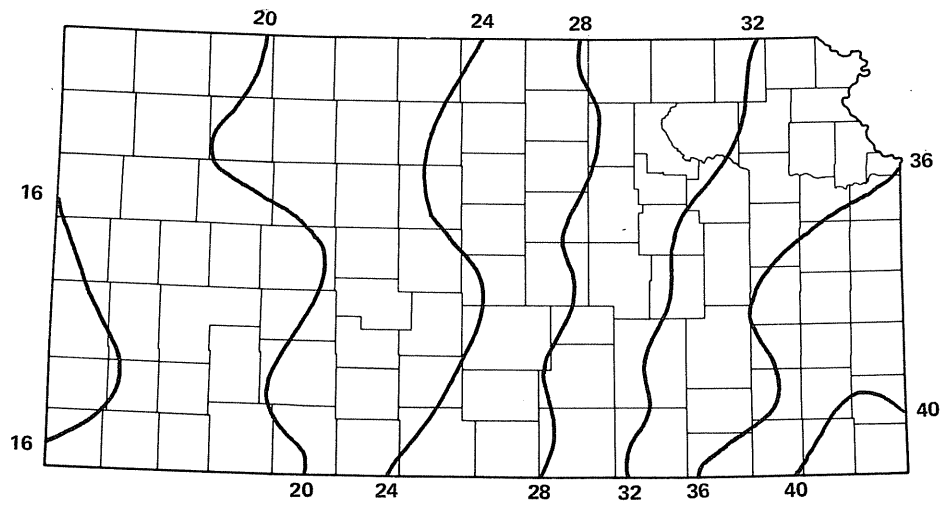

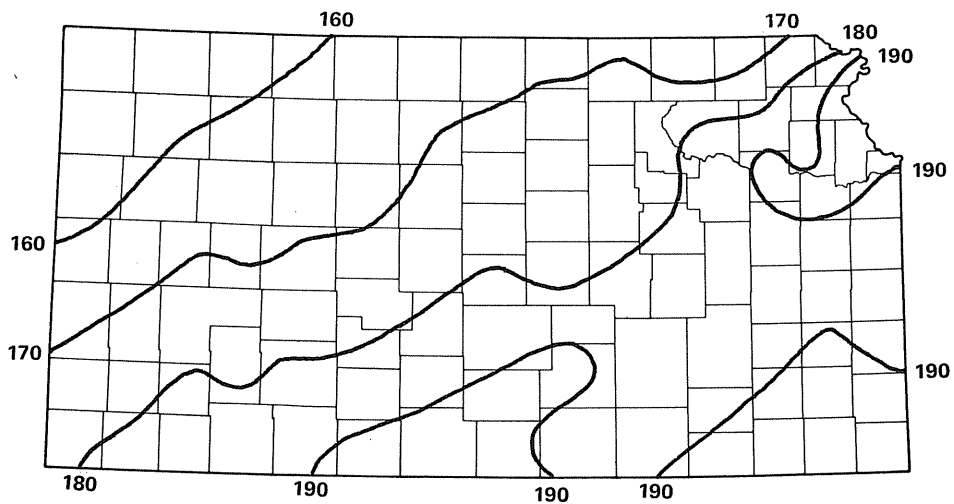
### KANSAS AVERAGE DAILY TEMPERATURES, (°F)



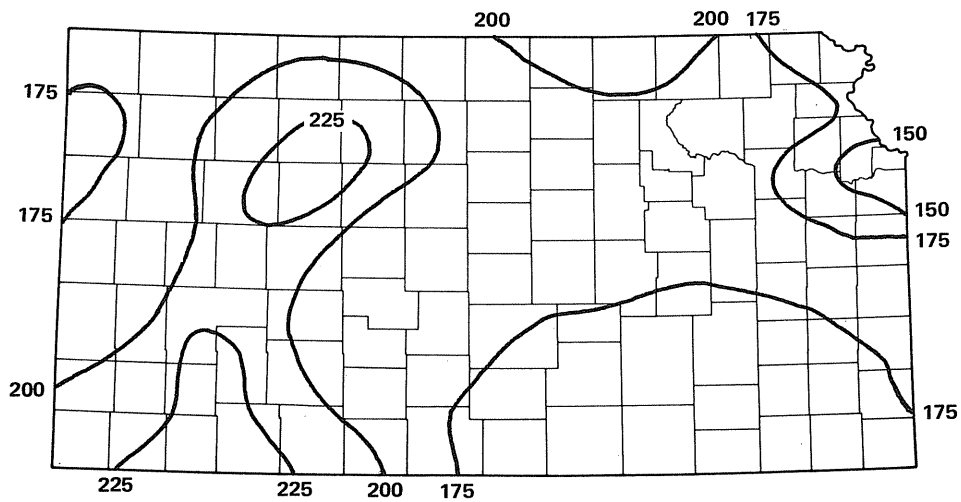
### KANSAS AVERAGE ANNUAL PRECIPITATION, (INCHES)

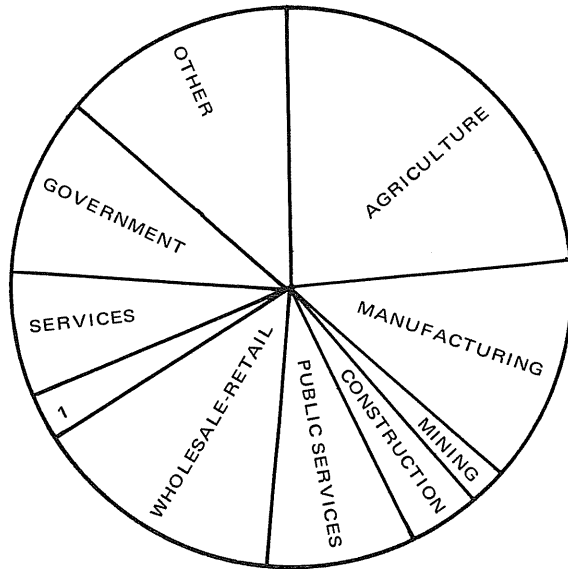

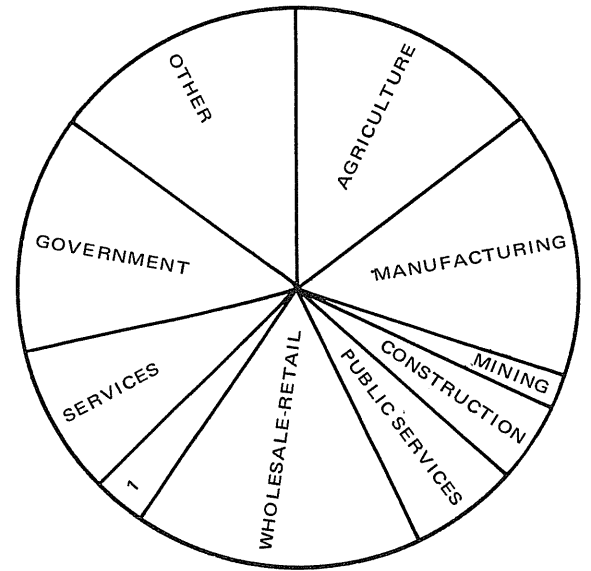

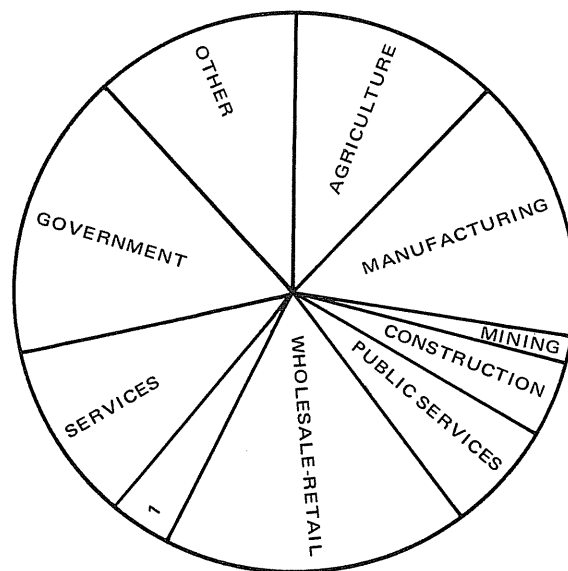
### EMPLOYMENT IN KANSAS BY SECTORS 1950-1970



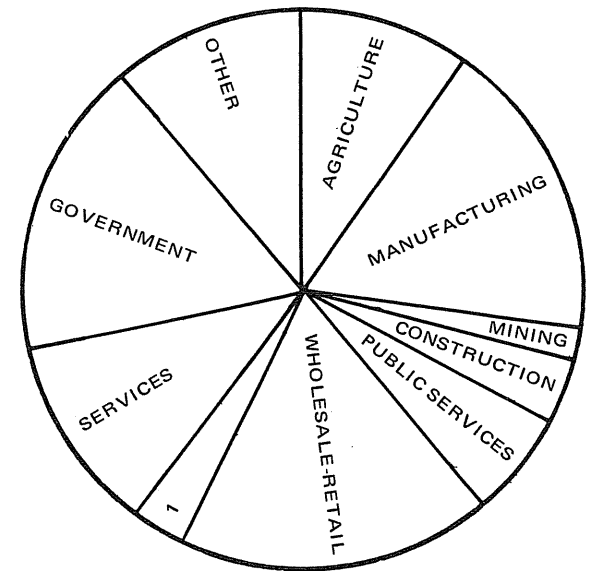

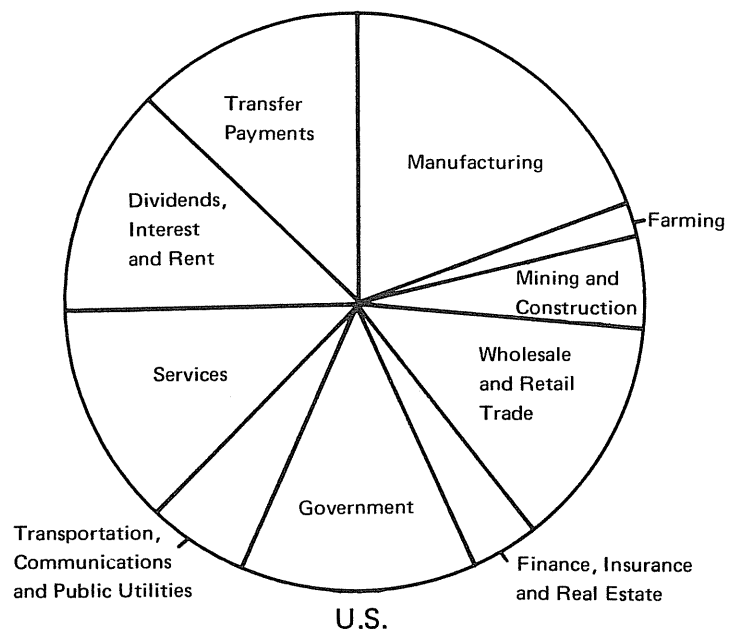

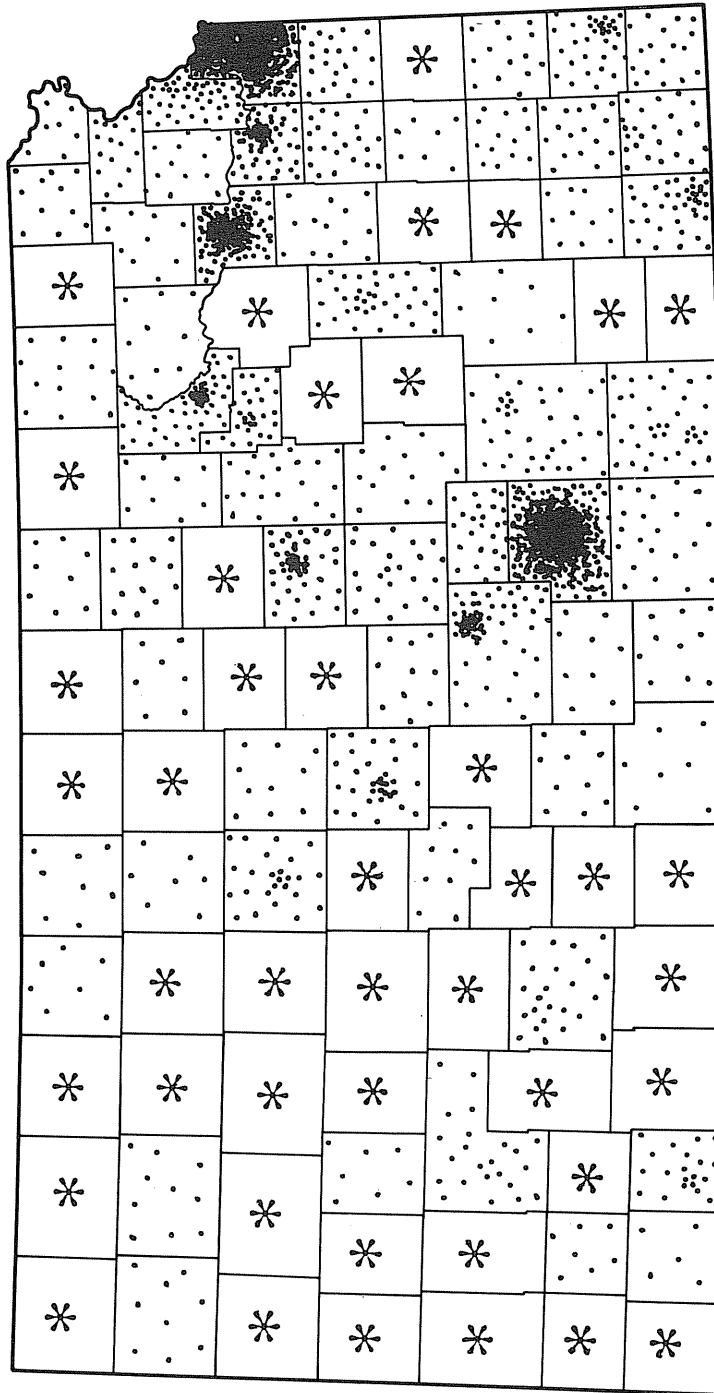

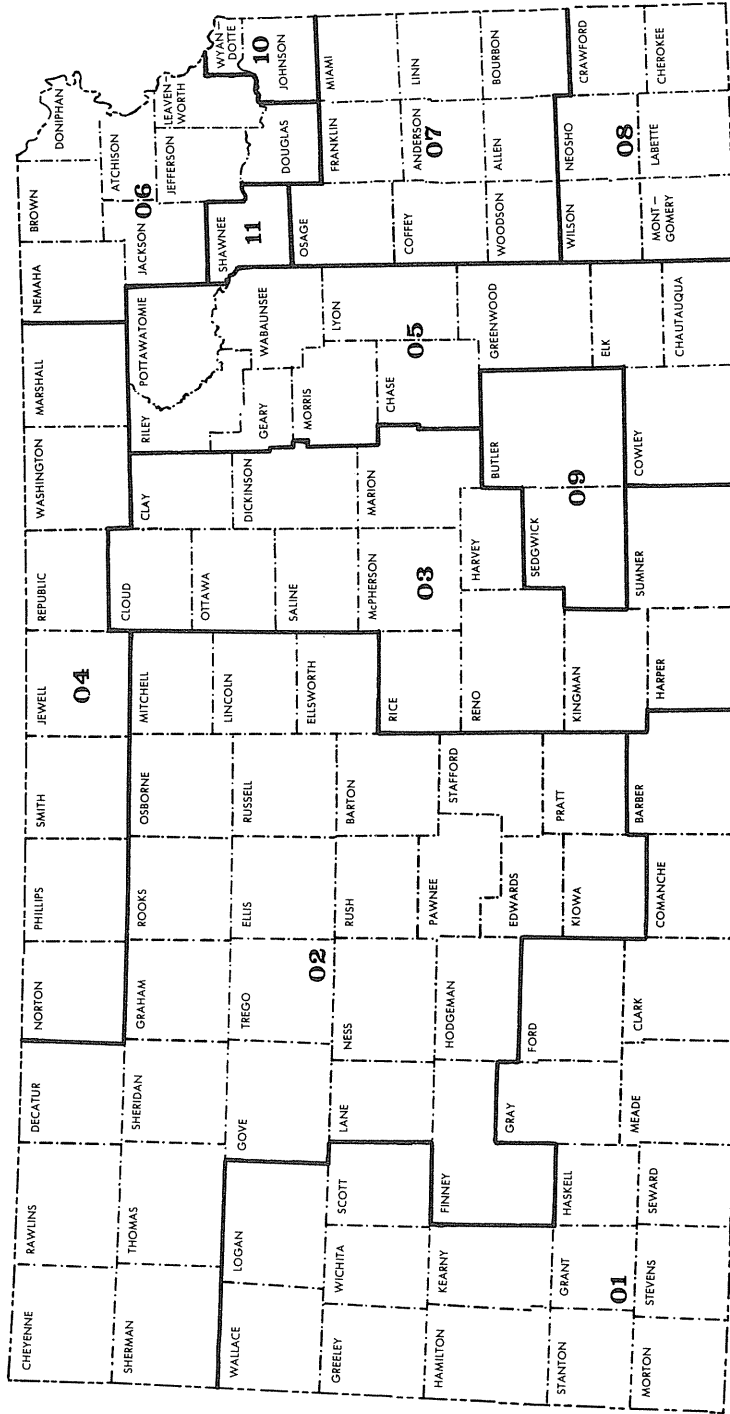

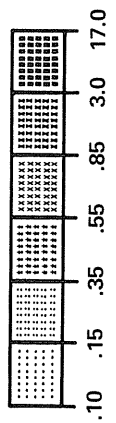

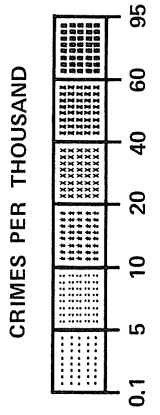
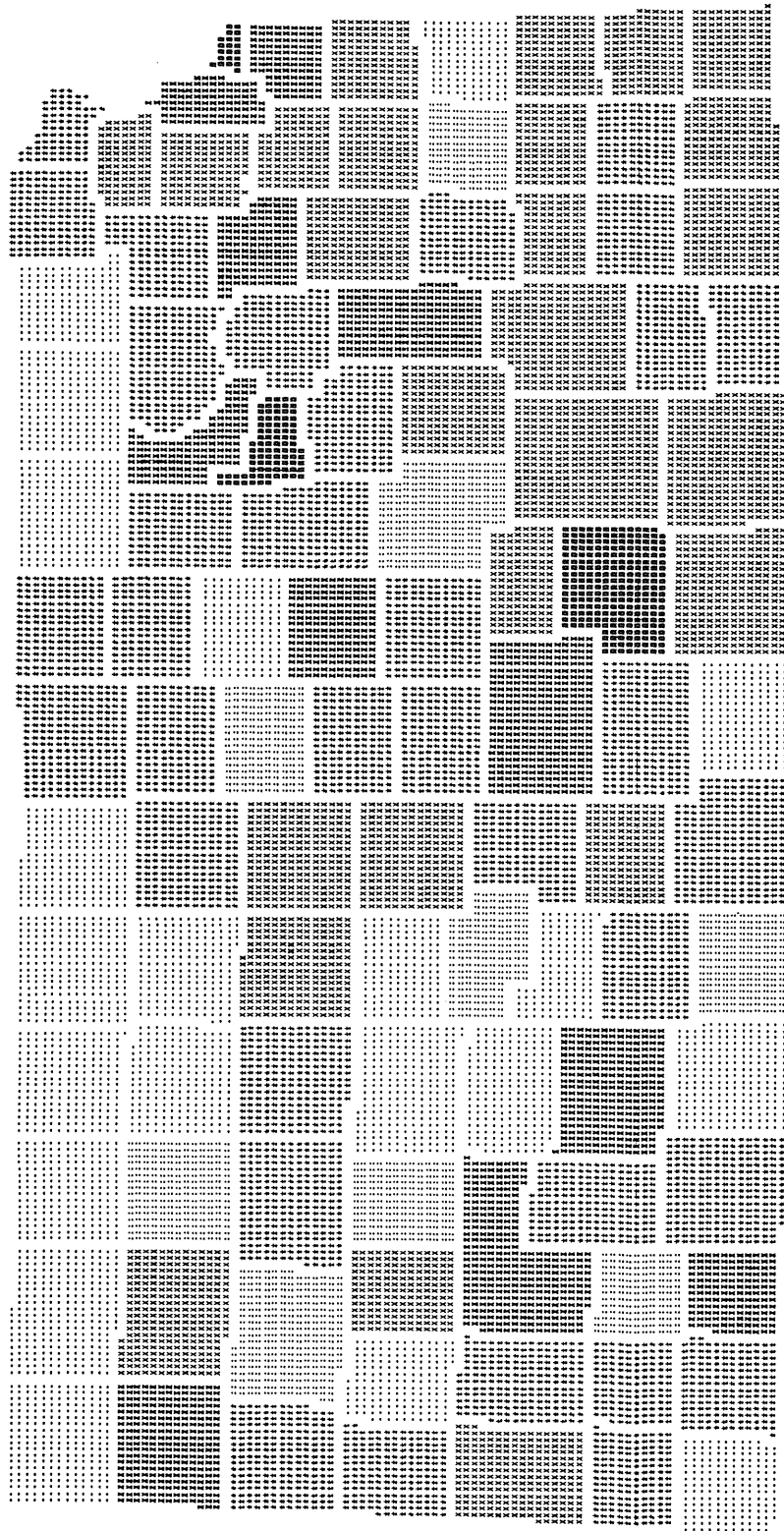
VIOLENT CRIMES - 1976



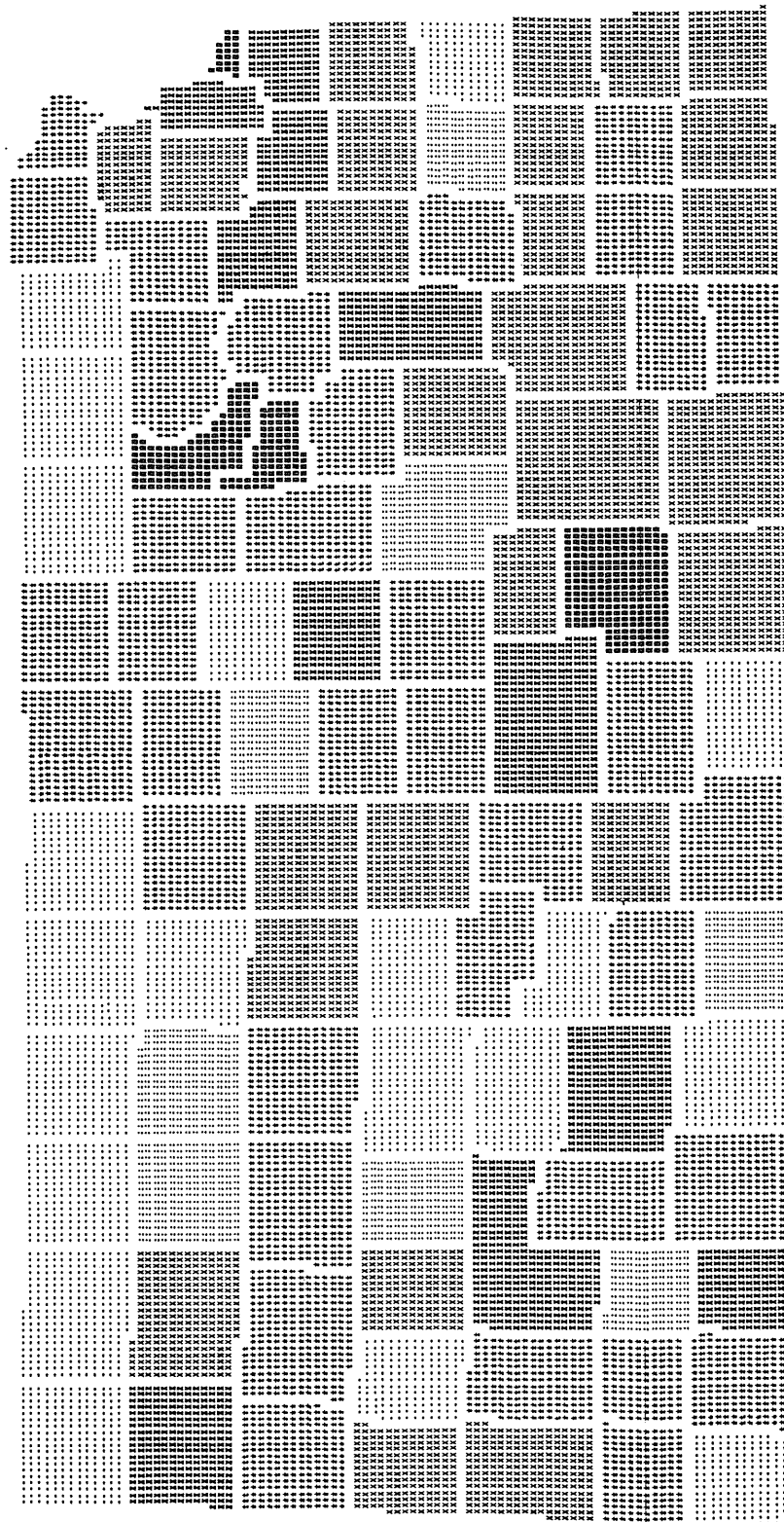
CRIMES PER THOUSAND



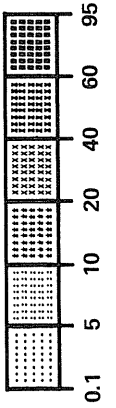
# PROPERTY CRIMES - 1976

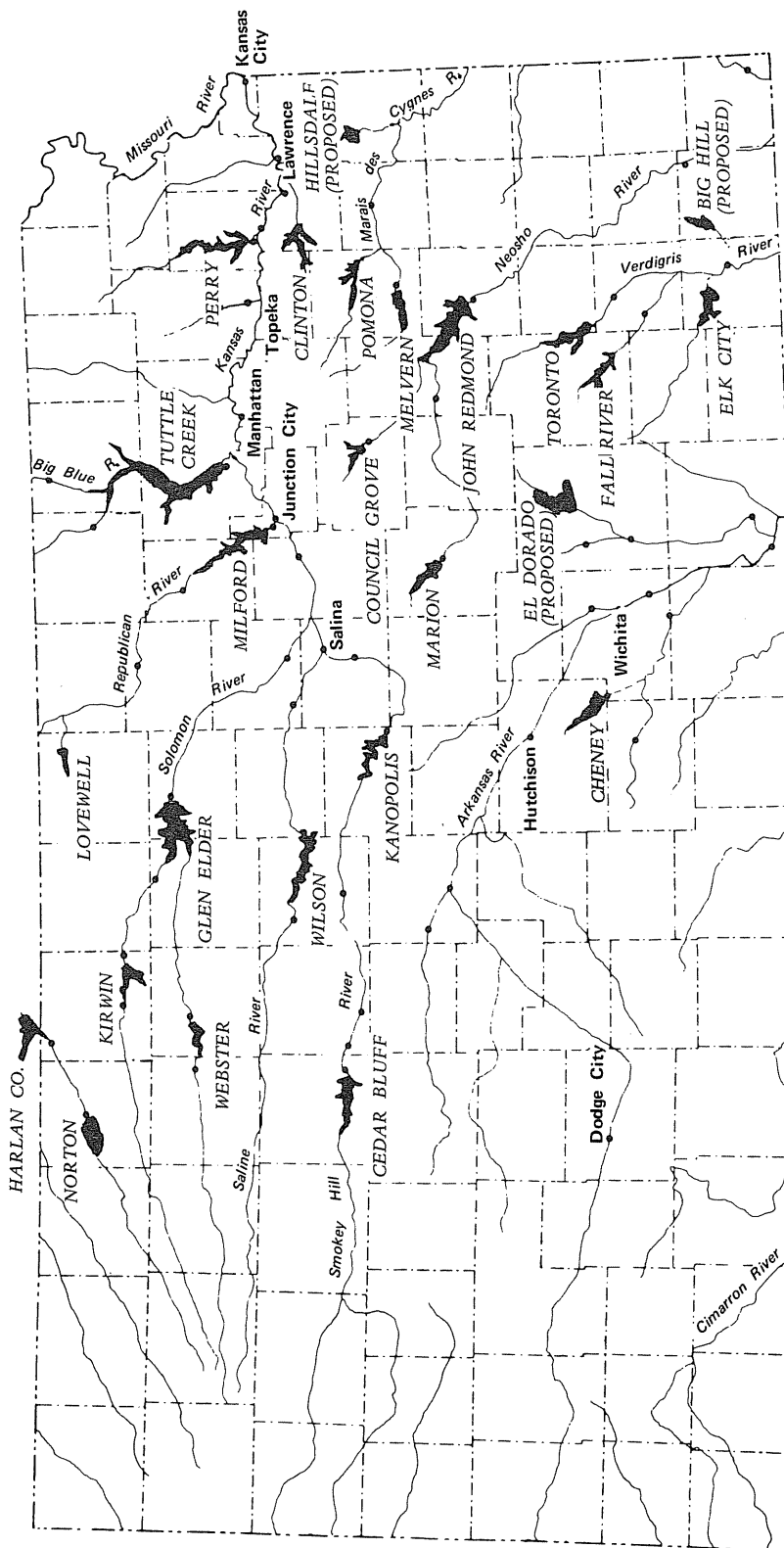

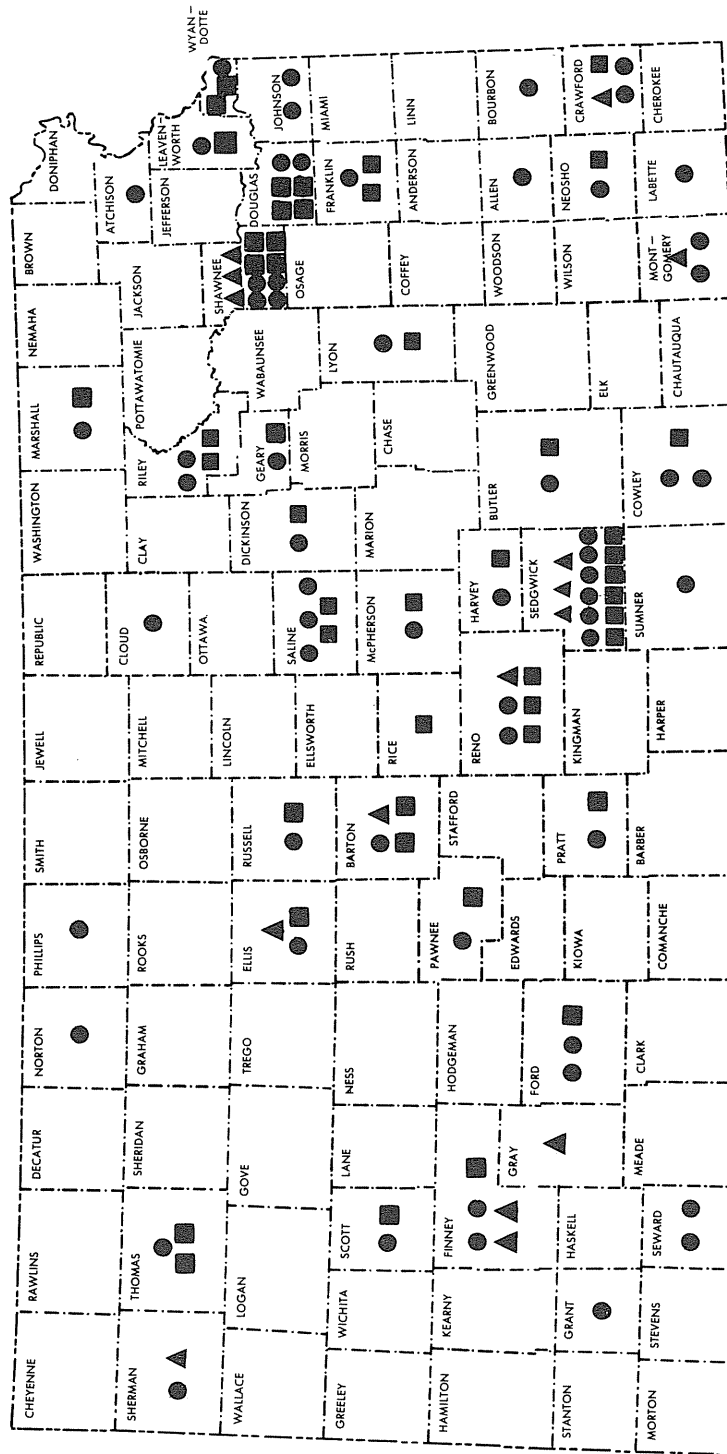

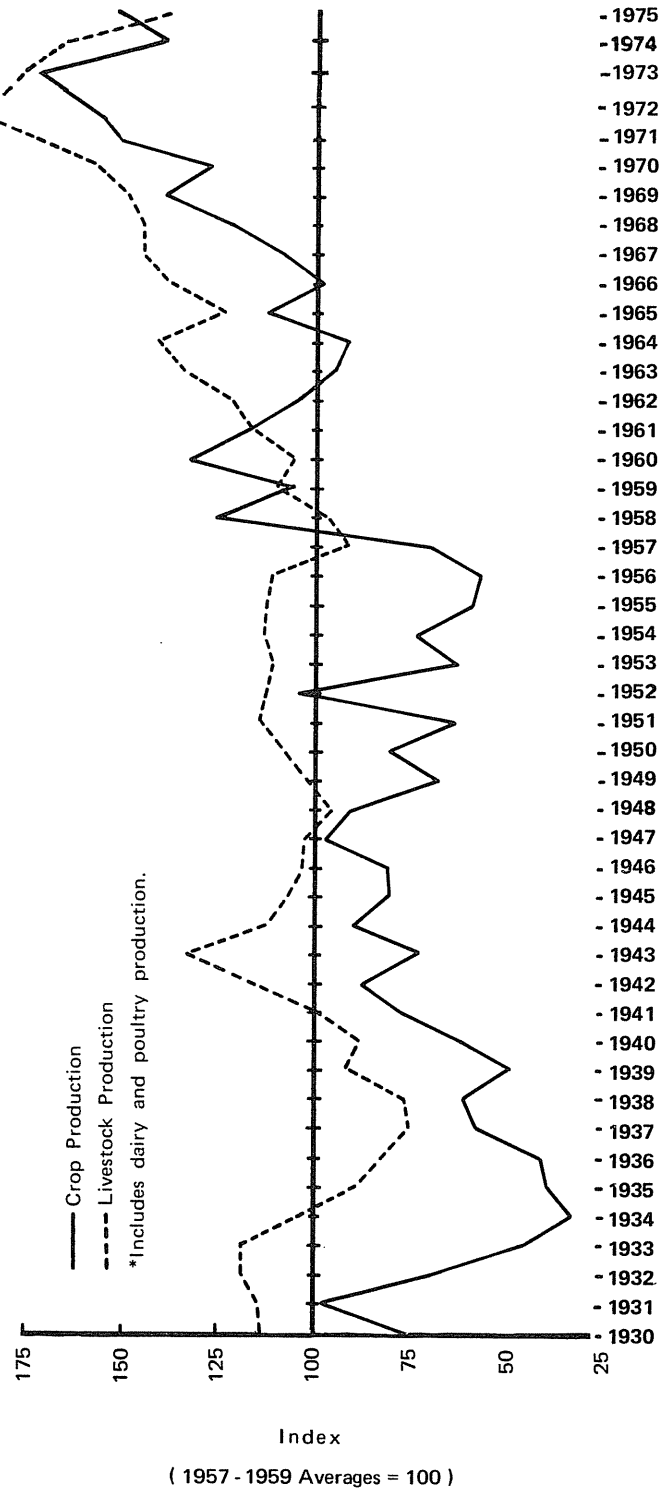
