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FOREWORD

THE FIFTEENTH EDITION OF THE KANSAS STATISTICAL ABSTRACT COVERS 20 DIFFERENT CATEGORIES OF INFORMATION INCLUDING POPULATION; VITAL STATISTICS AND HEALTH; HOUSING AND CONSTRUCTION; ELECTIONS; EDUCATION; CLIMATE; EMPLOYMENT, EARNINGS, AND PUBLIC WELFARE; INCOME, EXPENDITURE, AND WEALTH; BANKING AND FINANCE; STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT FINANCES AND EMPLOYMENT; COURTS, CRIME AND LAW ENFORCEMENT; PARKS AND RECREATION; COMMUNICATIONS; POWER; TRANSPORTATION; AGRICULTURE; MINING AND MINERAL PRODUCTS; MANUFACTURING; DISTRIBUTION AND SERVICES; AND TRAVEL AND TOURISM.

THE 1979 ABSTRACT CONTINUES THE EXPANDED COVERAGE OF PREVIOUS ISSUES AND INCLUDES A NEW CATEGORY ON TRAVEL AND TOURISM AND ADDS NEW INFORMATION ON CLIMATE AND AGRICULTURE. POPULATION DATA HAS NOT CHANGED AS AVAILABLE INFORMATION IS BASED ON THE 1970 CENSUS AND CAN NOT BE UPDATED UNTIL THE COMPLETION OF THE 1980 CENSUS SURVEY. DELETIONS OF DATED MATERIAL HAVE BEEN MADE IN THE INTERESTS OF CURRENCY AND TO REDUCE UNNECESSARY COSTS. SEVERAL MAPS AND OTHER GRAPHIC INFORMATION IN THE AREAS OF POPULATION, EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT, INCOME, POWER, AND MINING AND MINERAL PRODUCTS HAVE ALSO BEEN INCLUDED IN THIS EDITION.

WE INVITE READER SUGGESTIONS ABOUT WAYS TO IMPROVE THE ABSTRACT. ANY RECOMMENDATIONS FOR INCLUSION OF NEW INFORMATION IN THE FUTURE SHOULD BE ADDRESSED TO THE CENTER FOR PUBLIC AFFAIRS. WE HOPE THE DATA PROVIDED IN THE 1979 KANSAS STATISTICAL ABSTRACT WILL BE USEFUL TO INDIVIDUALS, OFFICIALS, AND AGENCIES IN BOTH THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTORS.

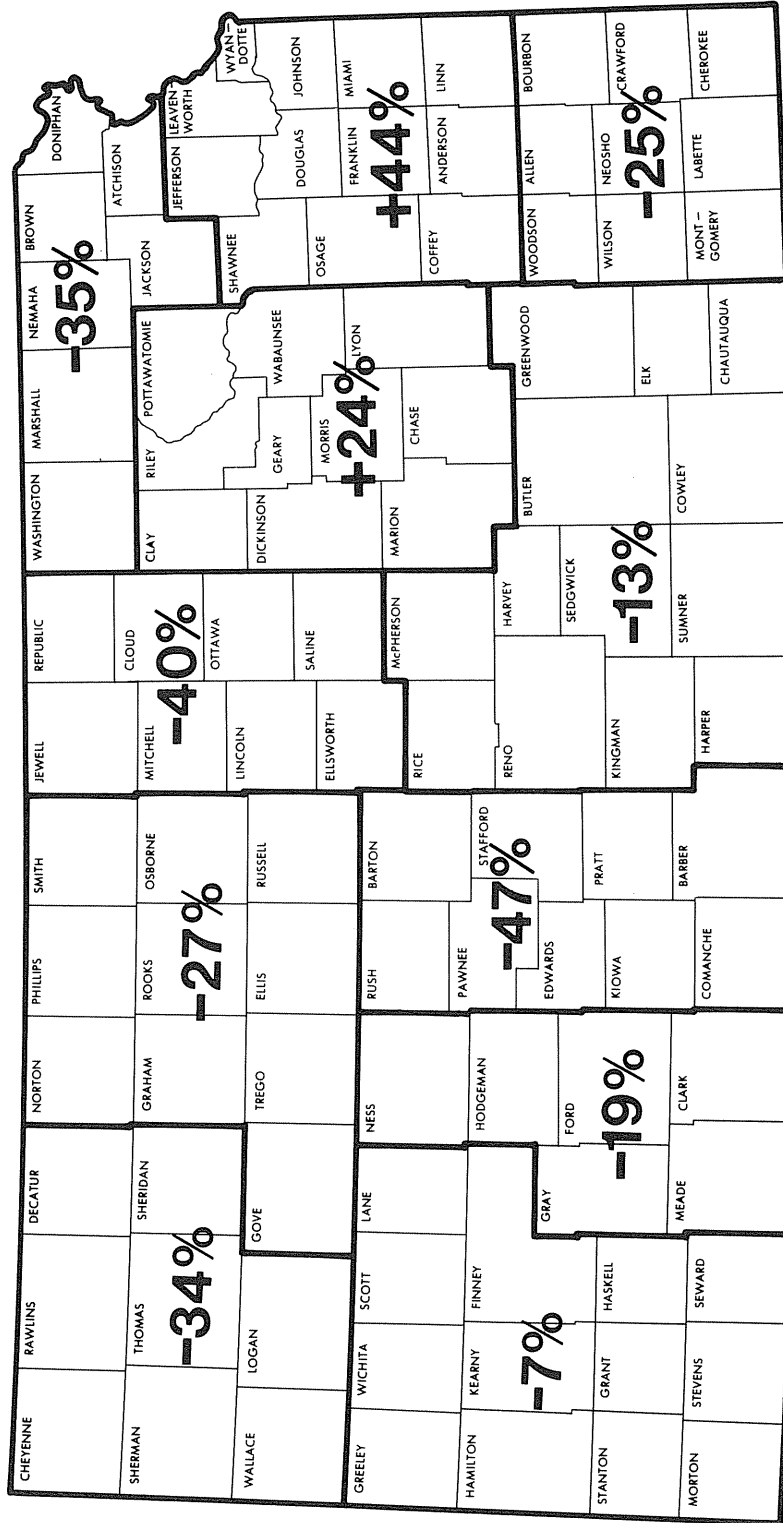

The new Bureau of the Census projections were prepared using the inflation-deflation variant of the cohort-component method. An immigration rate of 400,000 per year was assumed. Kansas projections assumed that each age group would have similar mortality and migration patterns as it had from 1960-1970, that survival rates for those aged 75 or older would remain constant, and that birth rates would follow the series E projections.

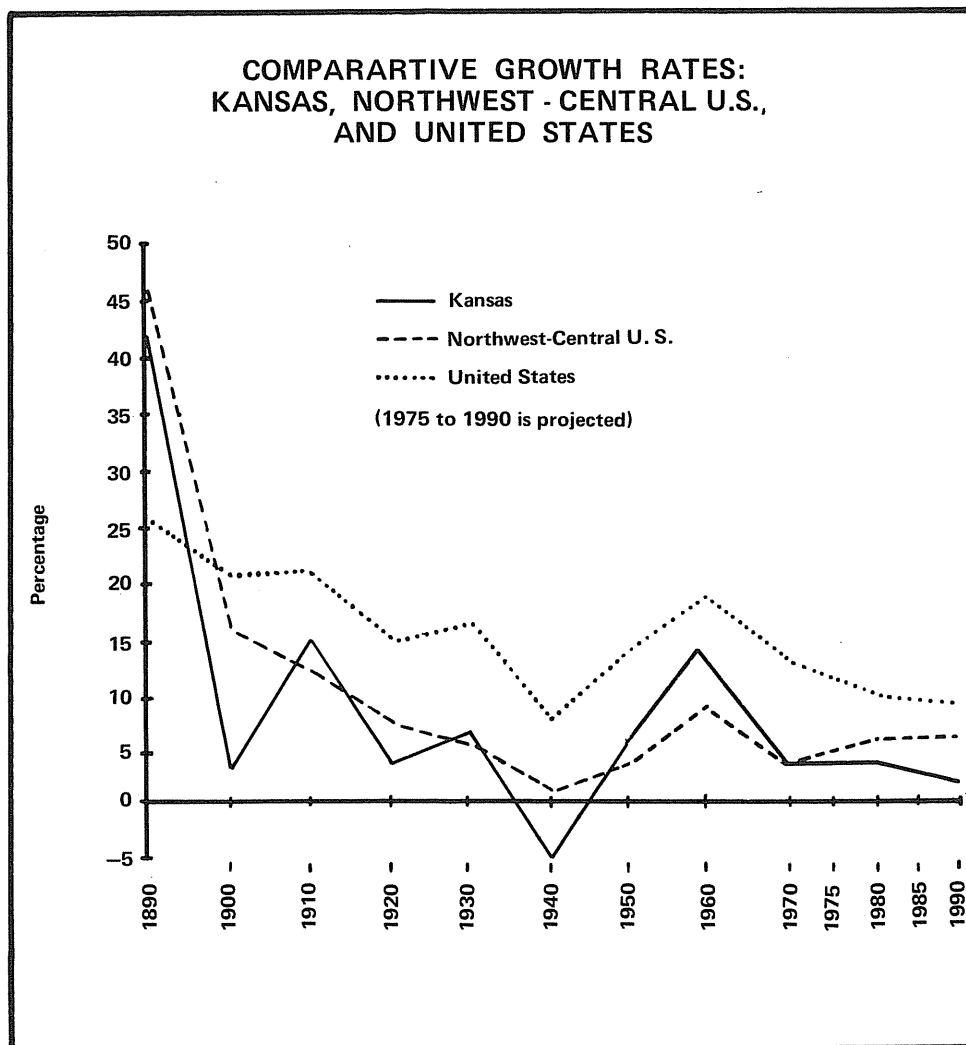

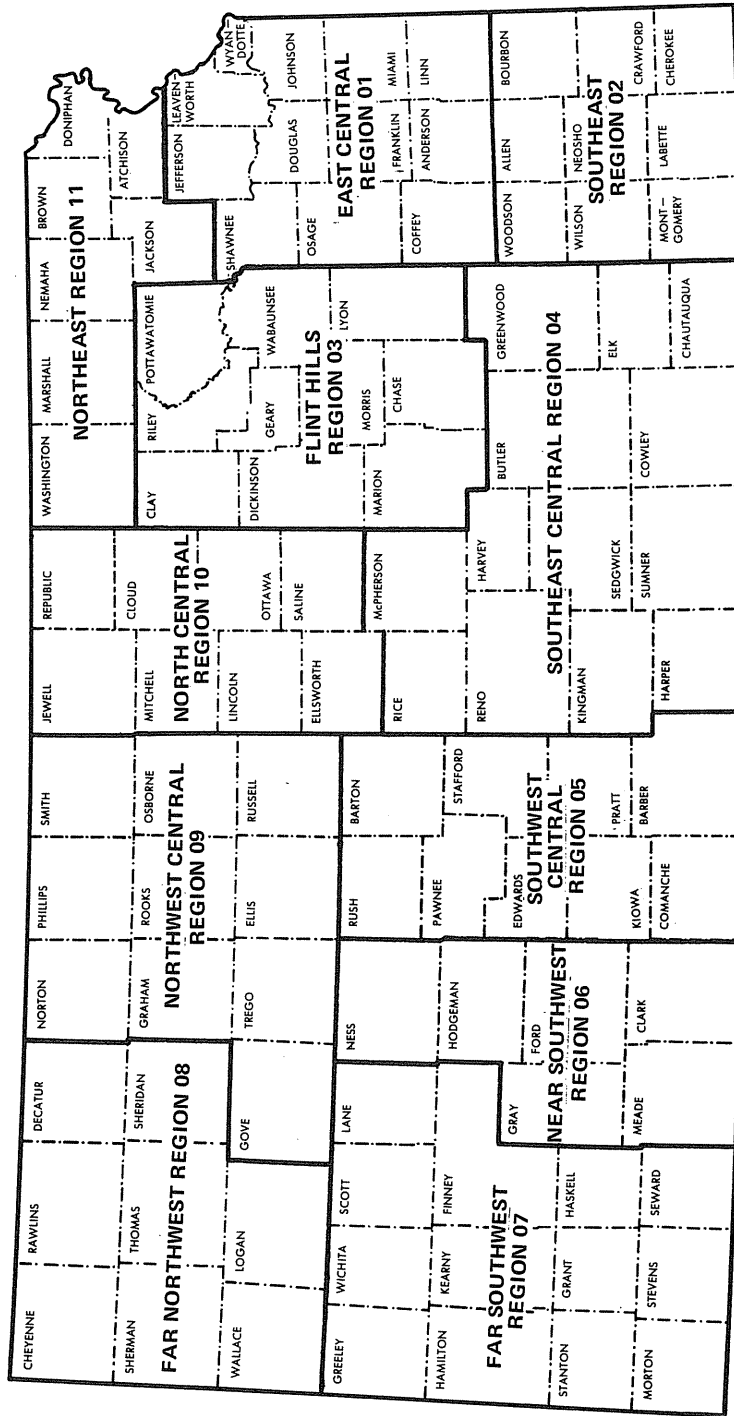

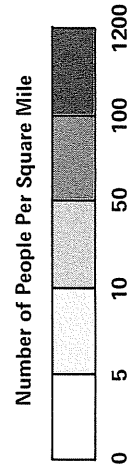

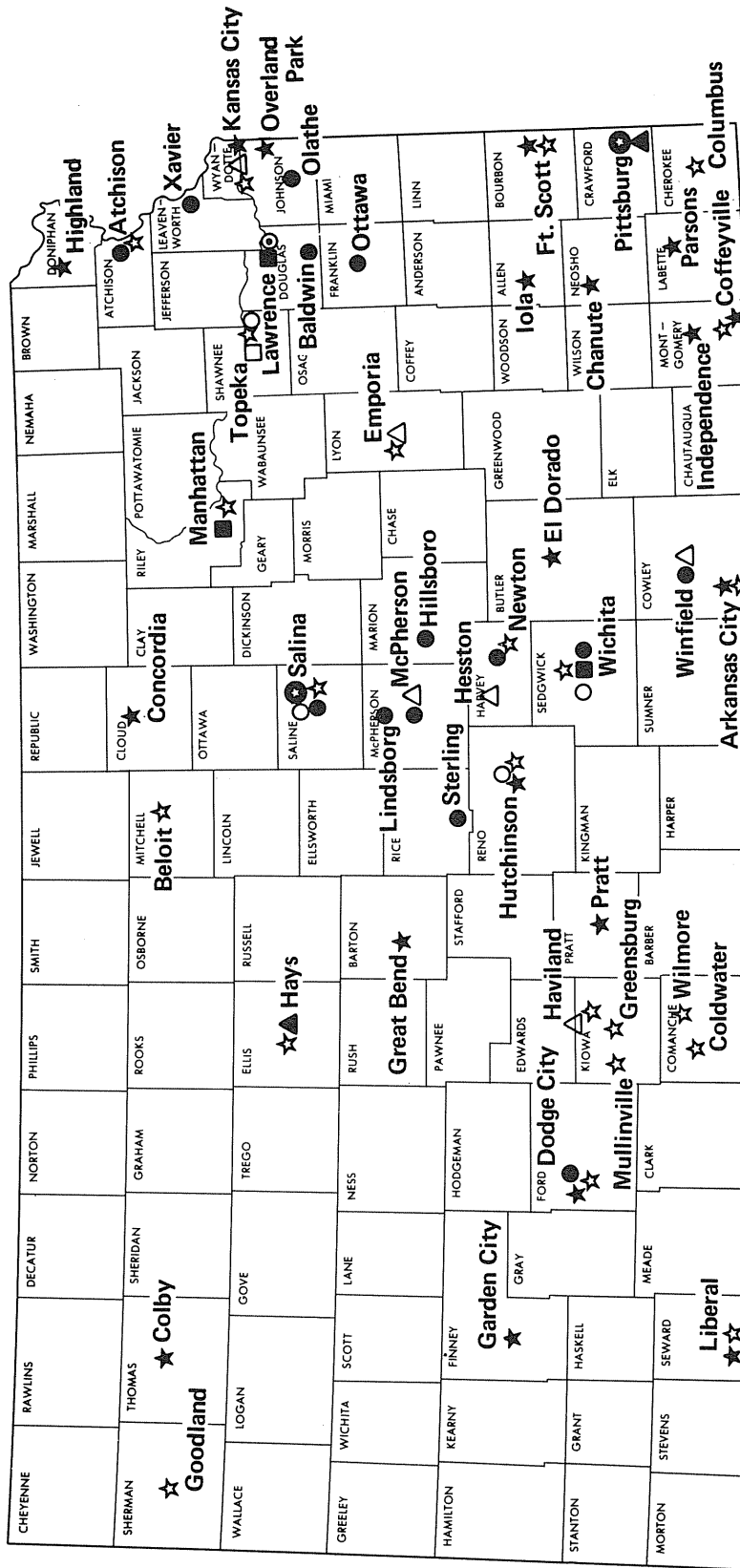

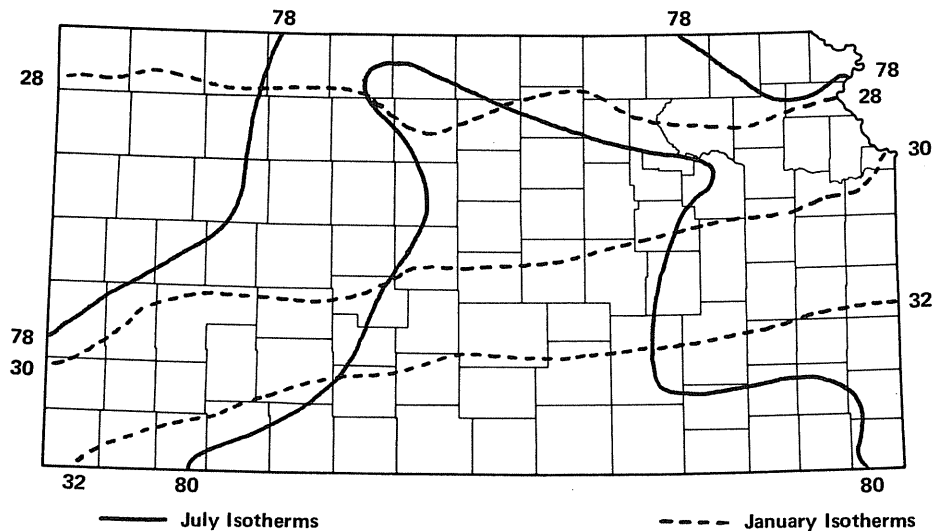

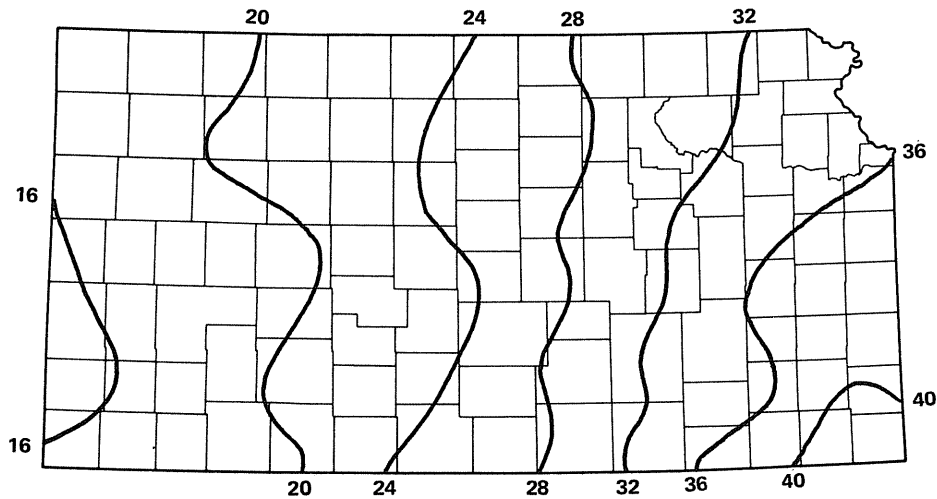

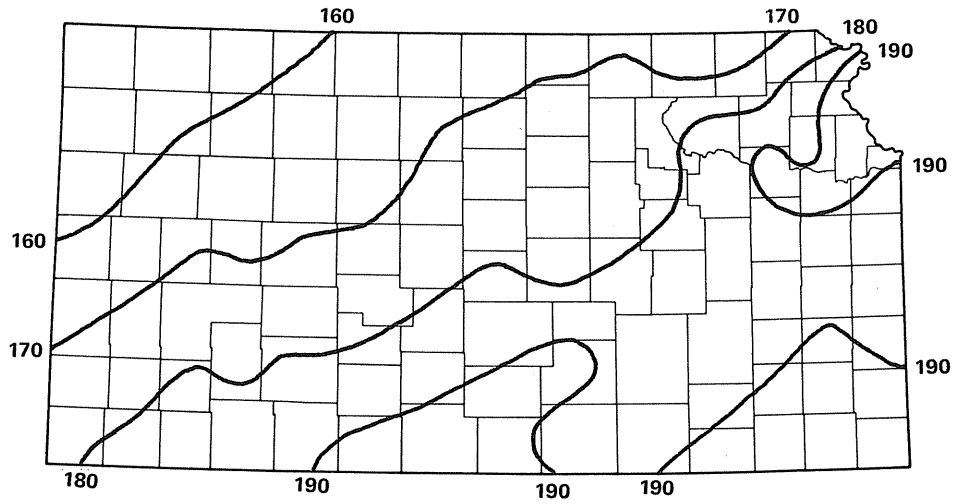
KANSAS AVERAGE DAILY TEMPERATURE, (°F)



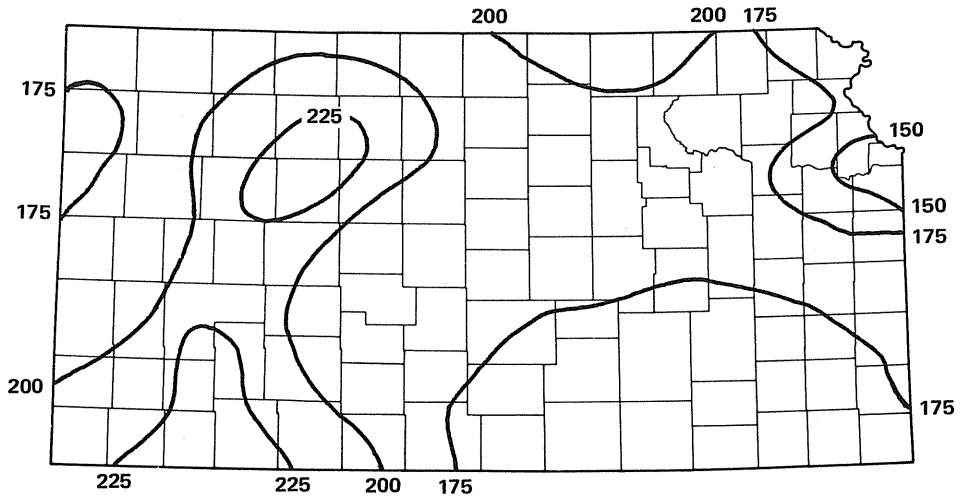
KANSAS AVERAGE ANNUAL PRECIPITATION, (INCHES)

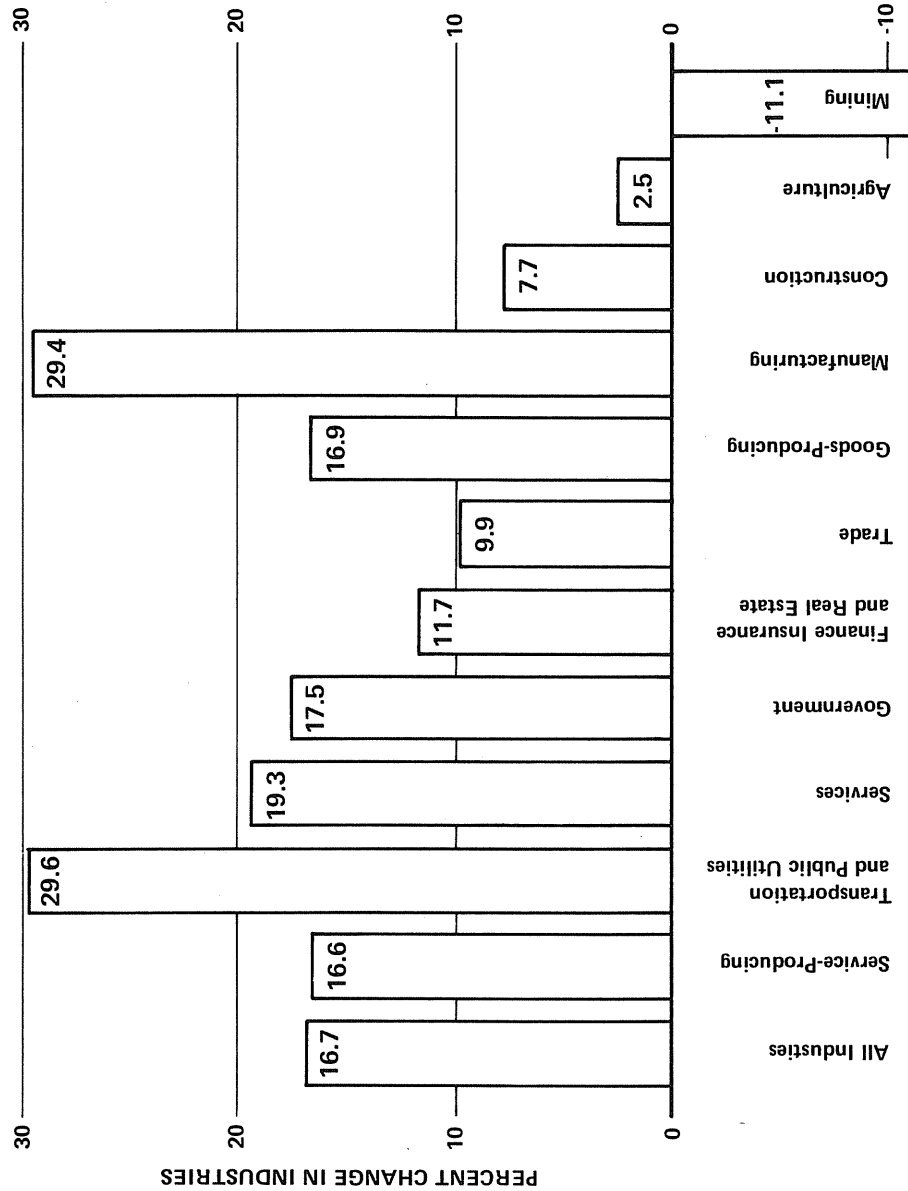

1978 to 1985

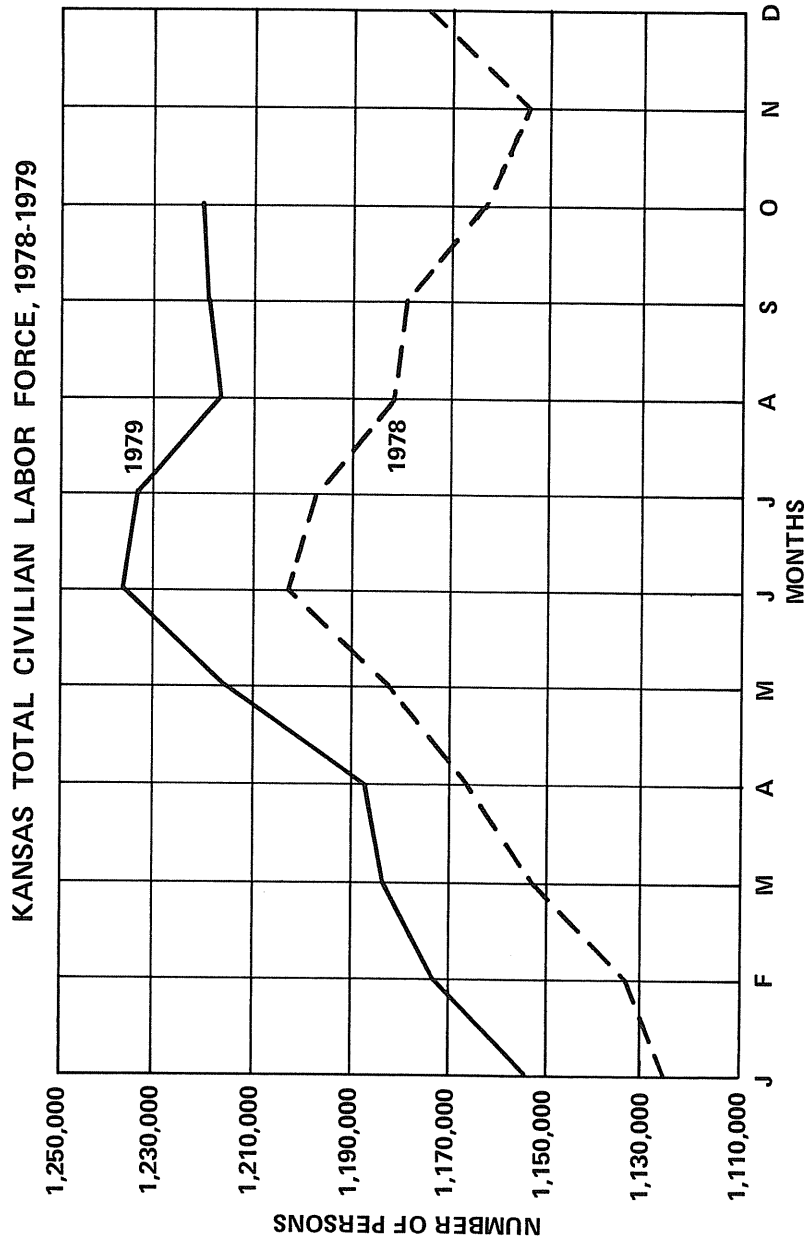

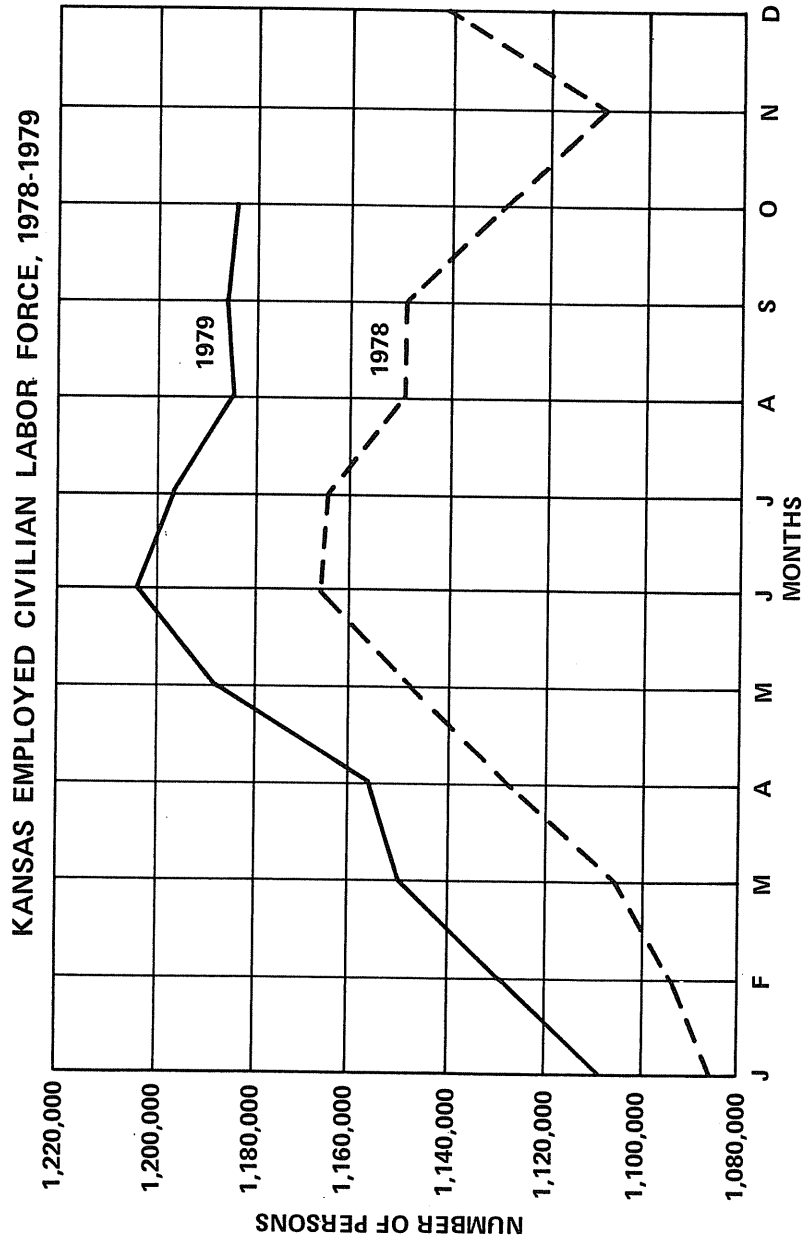

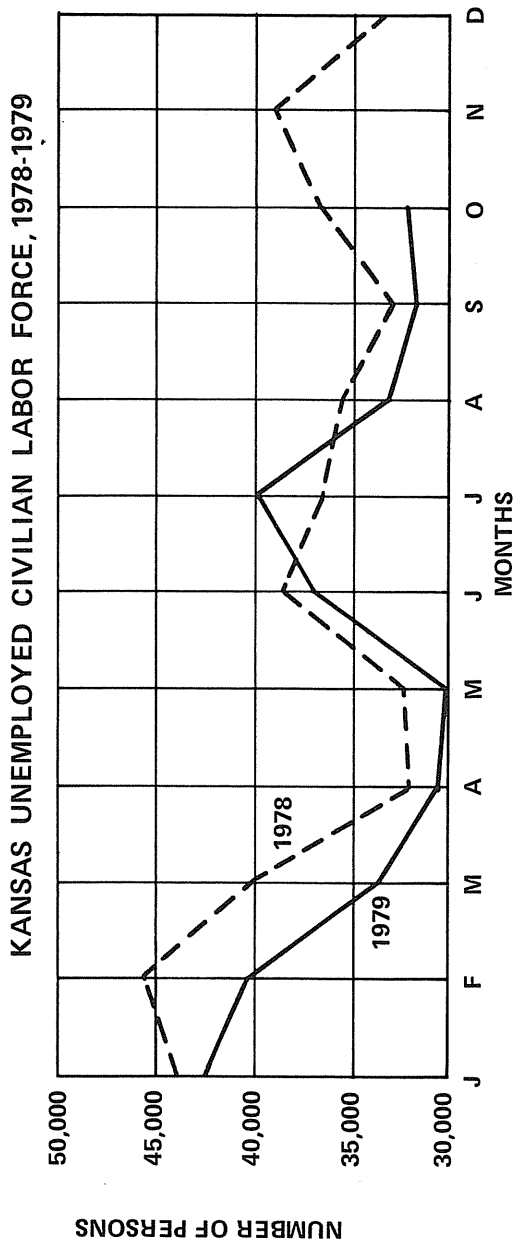

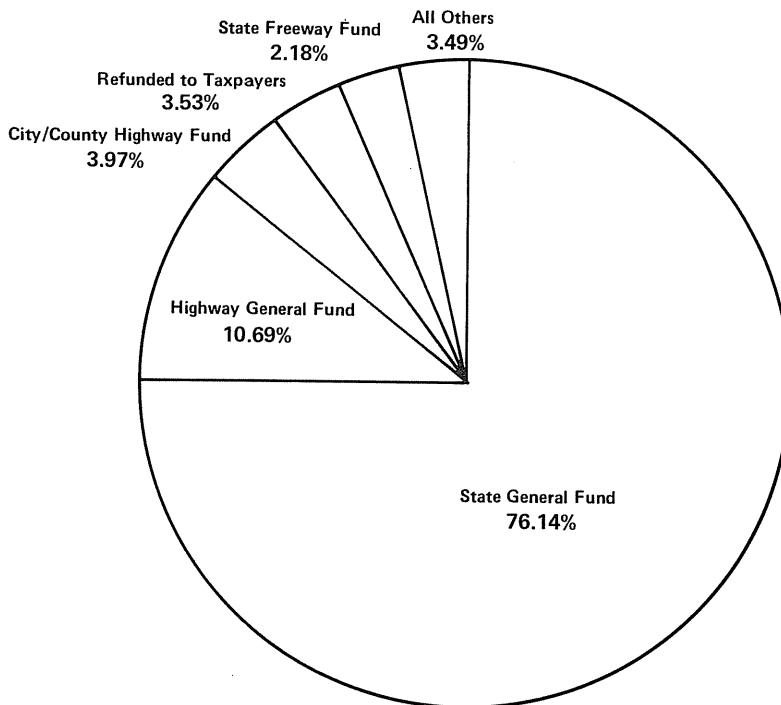

COURTS, CRIME, AND LAW ENFORCEMENT

KANSAS JUDICIAL SYSTEM

(Unification January, 1977)

Original jurisdiction in proceedings in quo warranto, mandamus, habeas corpus, and direct appeals in criminal cases involving serious classes of felony or life imprisonment. Appellate jurisdiction in any case in which a Kansas or United States statute has been declared unconstitutional. (The Court has discretionary power of review over decisions of the Court of Appeals, and may transfer cases from one court to another.)

MUNICIPAL COURTS

Intermediate appellate court with jurisdiction over all appeals from the district court except those reviewable in the district court and those in which direct appeal to the Supreme Court is required. (Effective 1978—exclusive jurisdiction over the review of orders or decisions of the state corporation commission in public utility rate cases.)

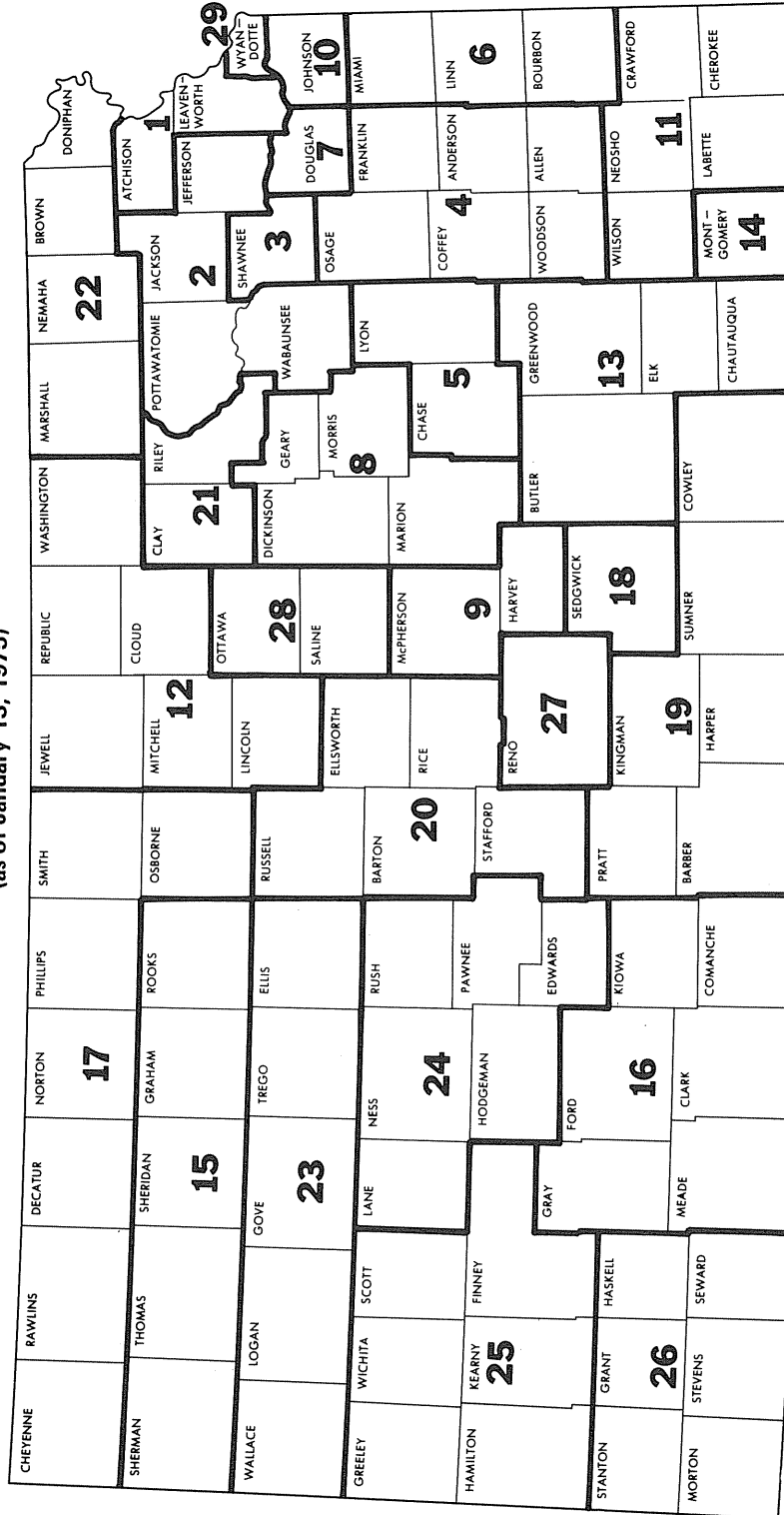
Court of record with original jurisdiction in civil and criminal cases and limited appellate jurisdiction. *District judges* exercise full power and authority of the Court. *Associate district judges* have similar jurisdiction except that they lack jurisdiction over class actions and actions in quo warranto or mandamus. *District magistrate judges* have jurisdiction over probate and juvenile matters, misdemeanors, felony preliminary examinations and certain civil actions involving amounts of \$3,000 or less.

Municipal courts exist as entities of the cities which establish them, but they have jurisdiction over ordinance violations only, and therefore, are not state courts.

Unification of the state's trial courts was effective January, 1977. Probate, juvenile, county courts and magistrate-level courts of countywide jurisdiction were abolished. The jurisdictions of these courts were consolidated into the district court. A court of appeals was also established as an intermediate appellate court. The Kansas Supreme Court, Court of Appeals, and District Courts constitute the unified state judicial system in Kansas.

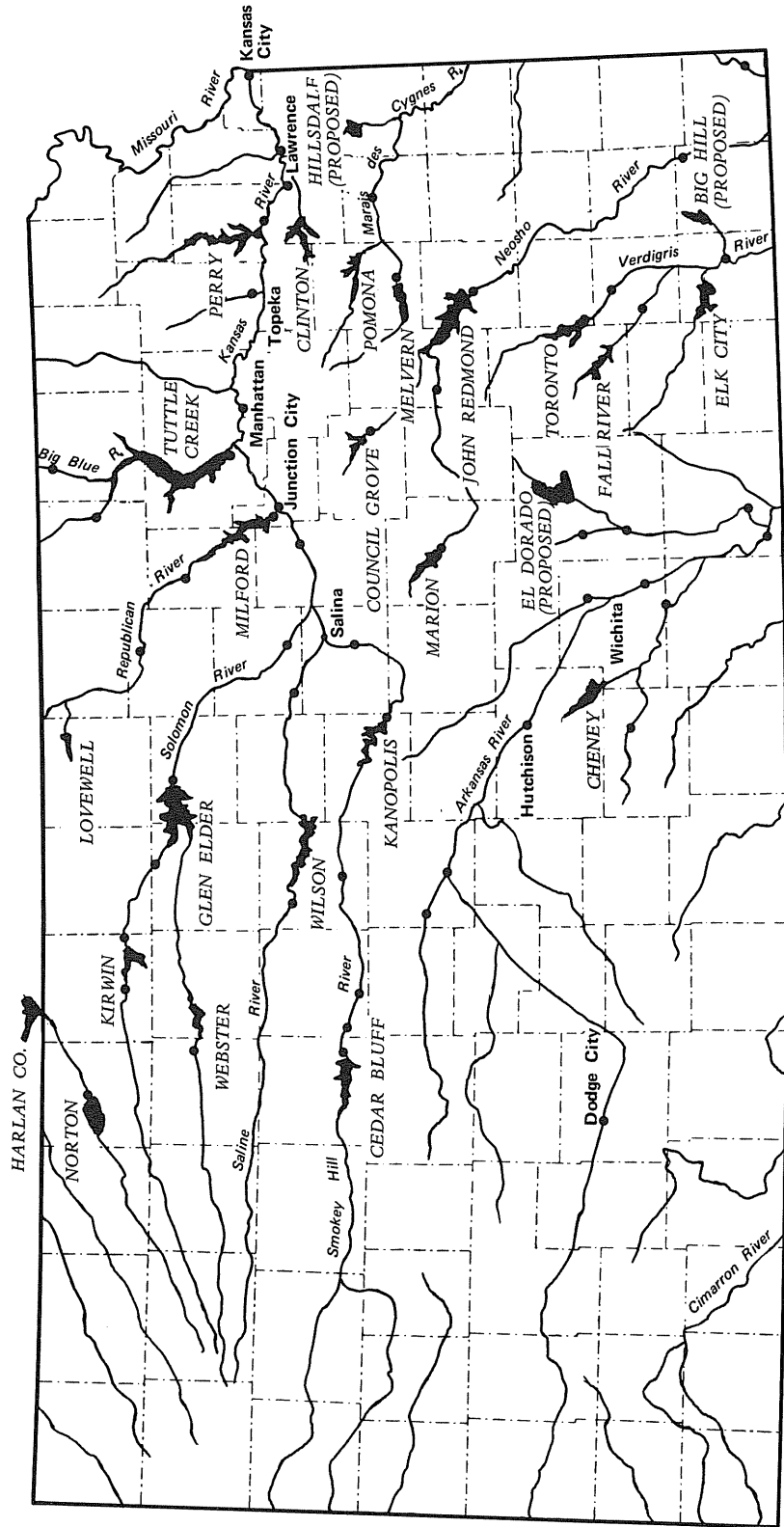

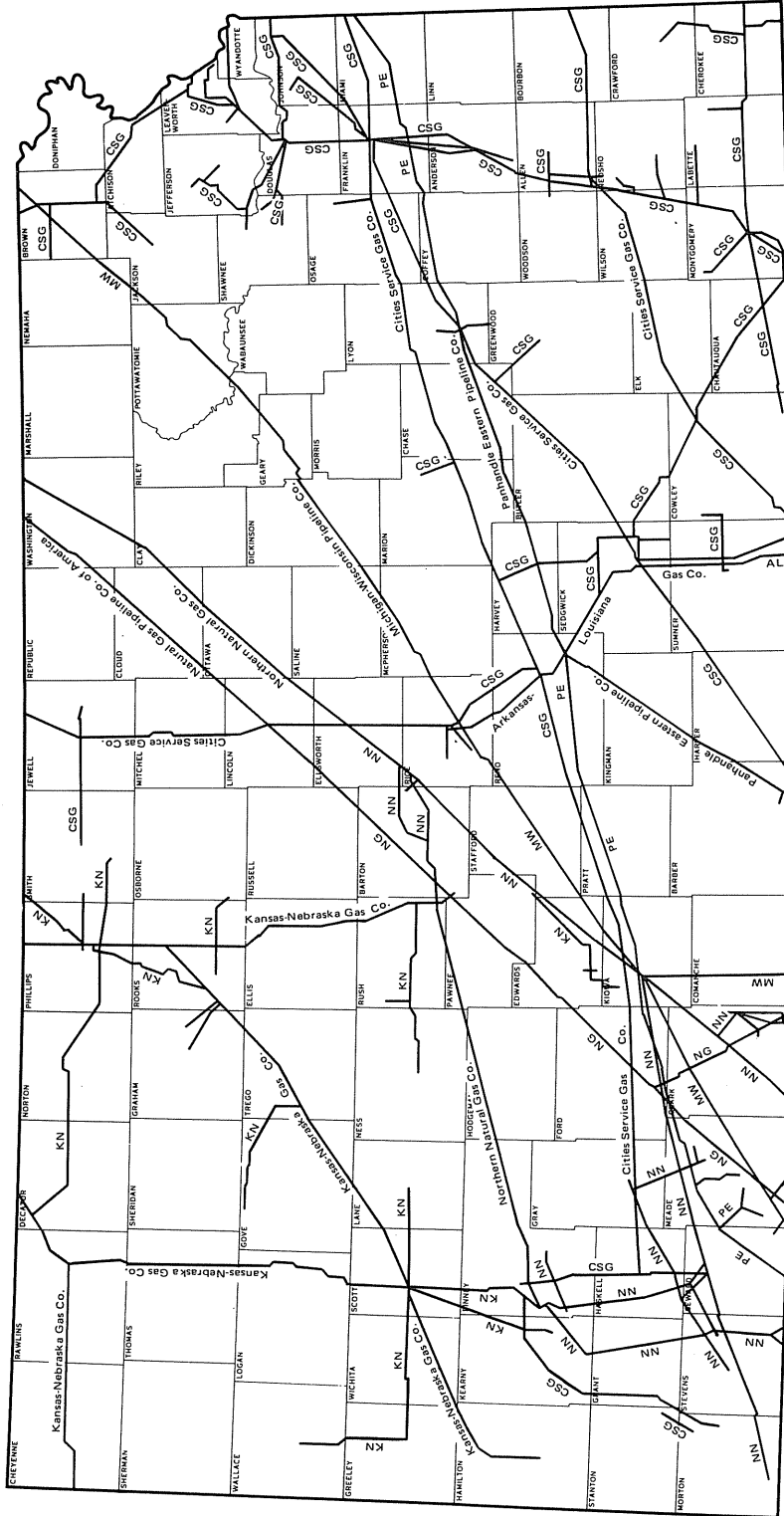

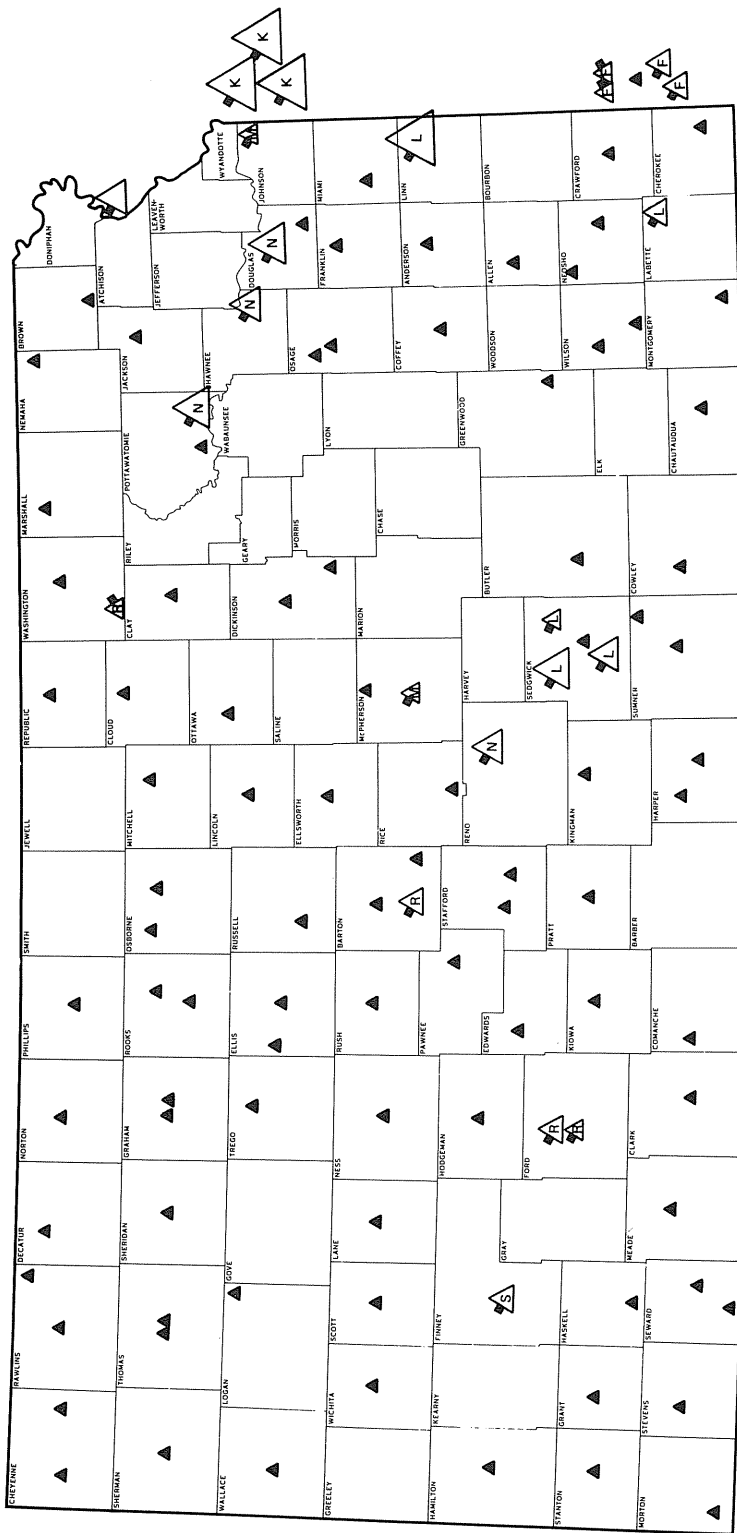
