FOREWORD

THIS IS THE NINTH EDITION OF THE *KANSAS STATISTICAL ABSTRACT*. AS BEFORE THE *ABSTRACT* SUMMARIZES DATA ABOUT THE STATE OF KANSAS IN CATEGORIES WHICH INCLUDE POPULATION, VITAL STATISTICS AND HEALTH, ELECTIONS, EDUCATION, CLIMATE, EMPLOYMENT, INCOME AND EXPENDITURES, BANKING AND FINANCE, STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT FINANCE, CRIME AND LAW ENFORCEMENT, RECREATION, COMMUNICATIONS, POWER, MOTOR VEHICLES, MINERAL PRODUCTS, CONSTRUCTION, MANUFACTURING AND TRADE SERVICES. THE STATISTICS PROVIDED ARE TAKEN FROM THE CURRENT STATE AND FEDERAL CENSUSES AND OTHER REPORTS FROM STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR. THE MOST RECENT AVAILABLE SOURCES ARE USED IN ALL CASES.

THE 1973 *ABSTRACT* PROVIDES EXPANDED COVERAGE INCLUDING DATA ON TORNADOES IN THE SECTION ON CLIMATE; INFORMATION ON OFFENSES CLEARED BY ARREST, TOTAL CRIME AND FULL-TIME LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES IN THE LAW ENFORCEMENT SECTION; FUEL CONSUMPTION, STATE MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS, ROAD MILEAGE BY TYPE OF ROAD, HIGHWAY RECEIPTS AND FEDERAL HIGHWAY AID IN THE TRANSPORTATION SECTION; AND KANSAS PARTICIPATION IN THE FEED GRAIN AND WHEAT PROGRAMS IN THE AGRICULTURE SECTION. THESE NEW CATEGORIES REFLECT THE CONTINUED EFFORTS OF THE INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES TO MEET READER INFORMATION NEEDS.

WE INVITE READER SUGGESTIONS ABOUT INFORMATION AND FORMAT TO AID THE INSTITUTE IN ITS EFFORT TO IMPROVE THE USEFULNESS OF THE *ABSTRACT*. IT IS HOPED THAT THE DATA PROVIDED WILL ENABLE INDIVIDUALS, OFFICIALS AND AGENCIES IN BOTH THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTORS TO BETTER UNDERSTAND THE VARIETY OF ACTIVITIES REFLECTIVE OF LIFE AND DEVELOPMENT IN KANSAS.

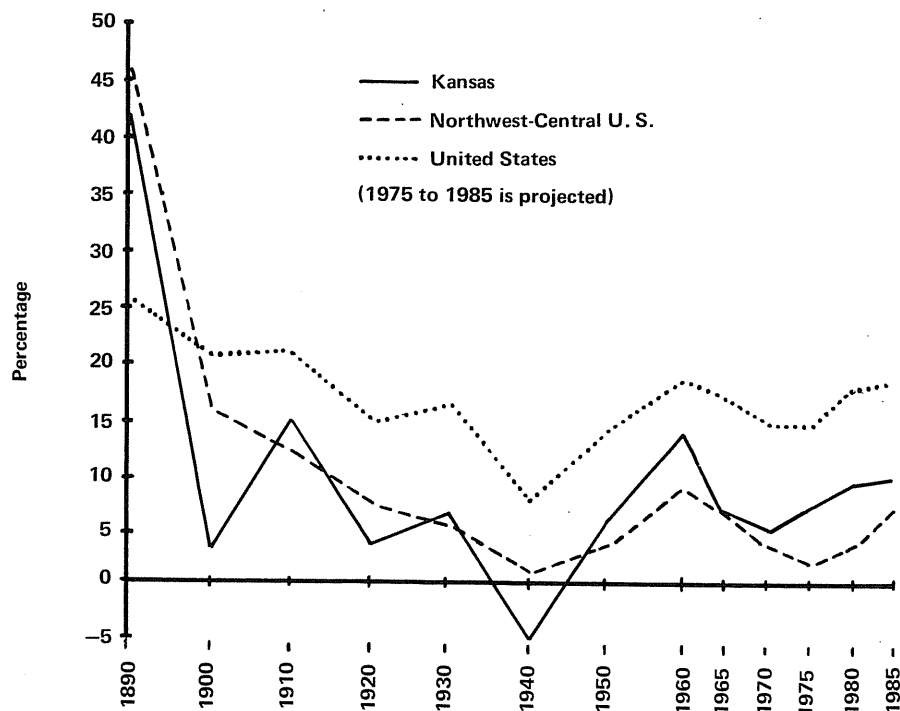

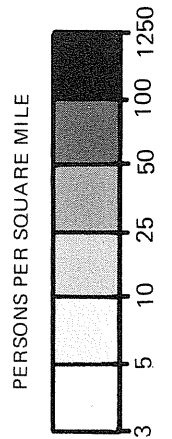
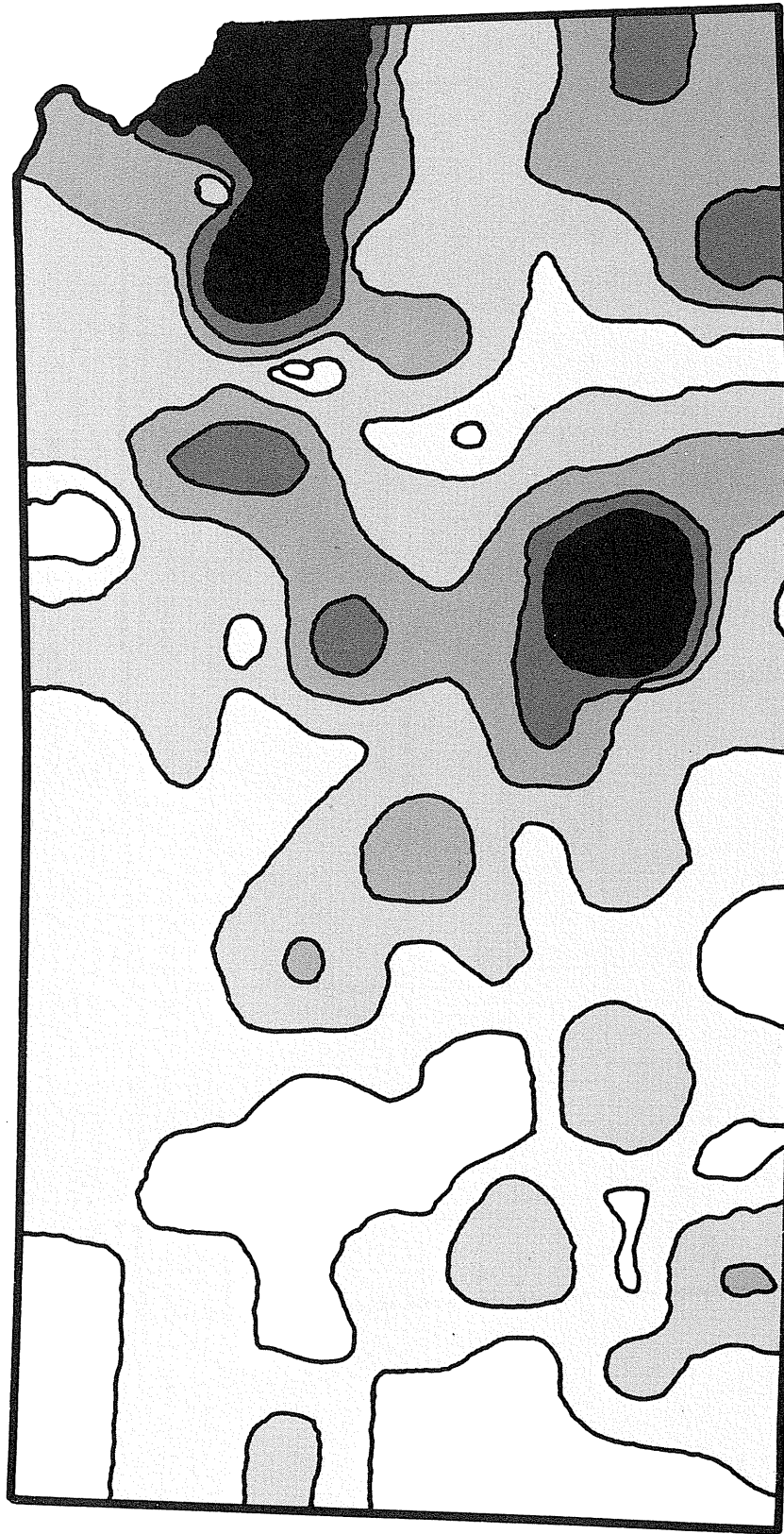

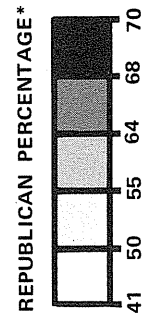

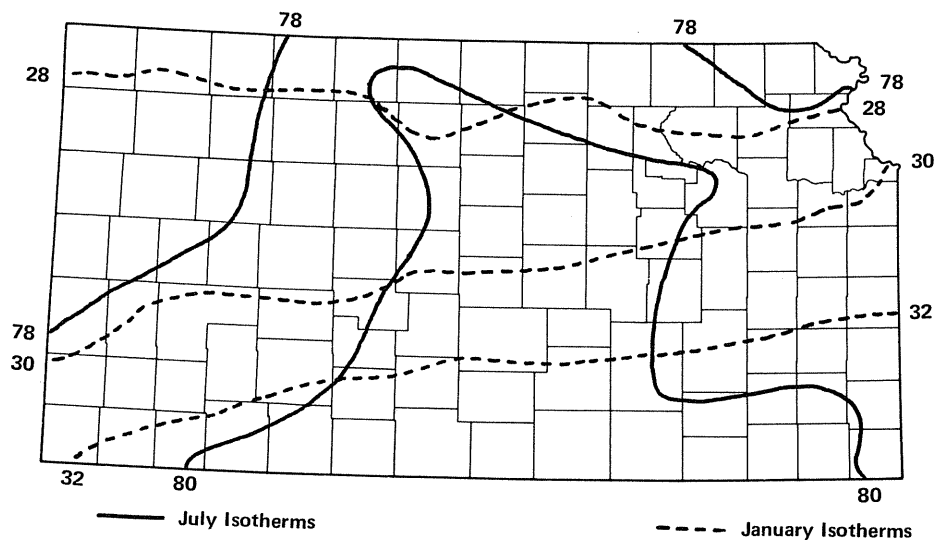

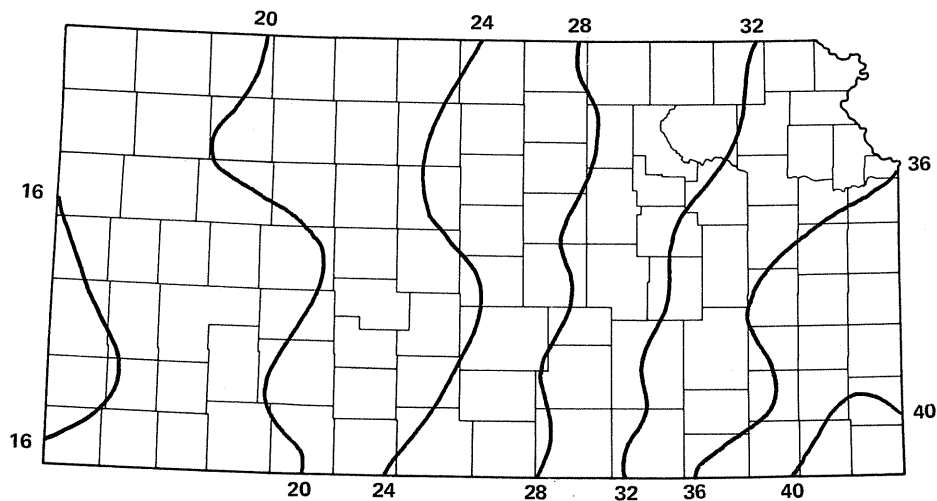

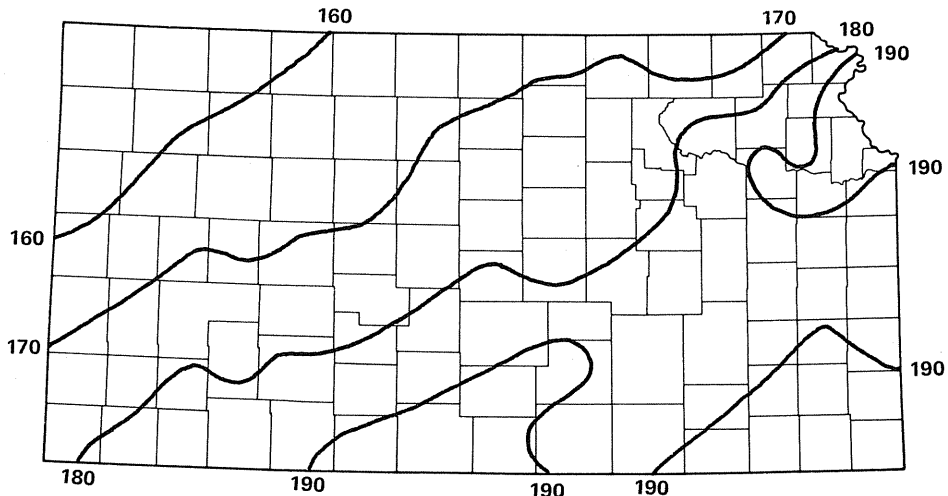
KANSAS AVERAGE DAILY TEMPERATURES, (°F)



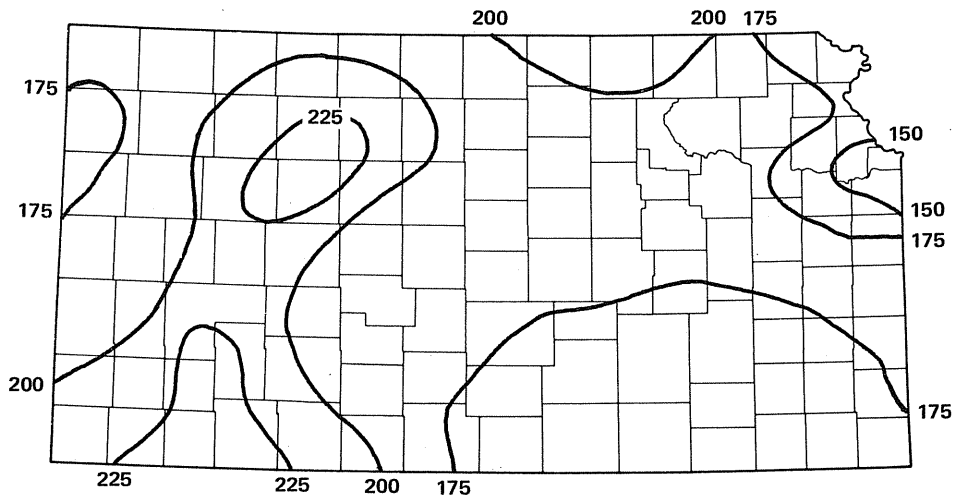
KANSAS AVERAGE ANNUAL PRECIPITATION, (INCHES)

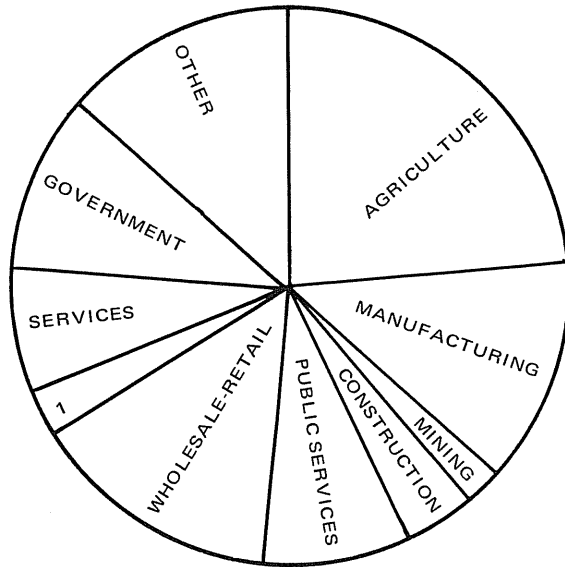

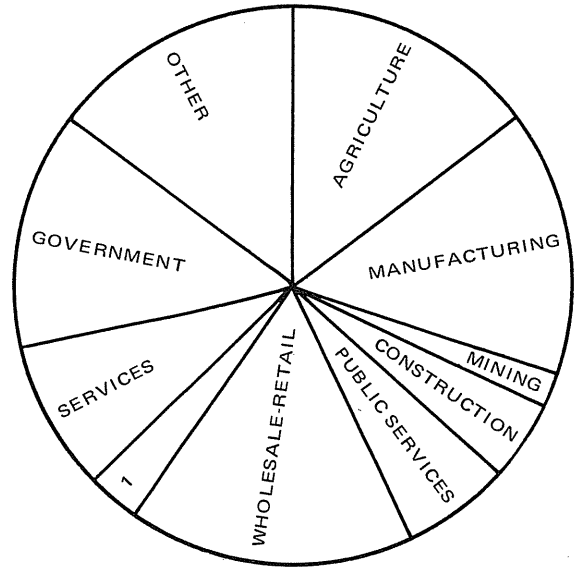

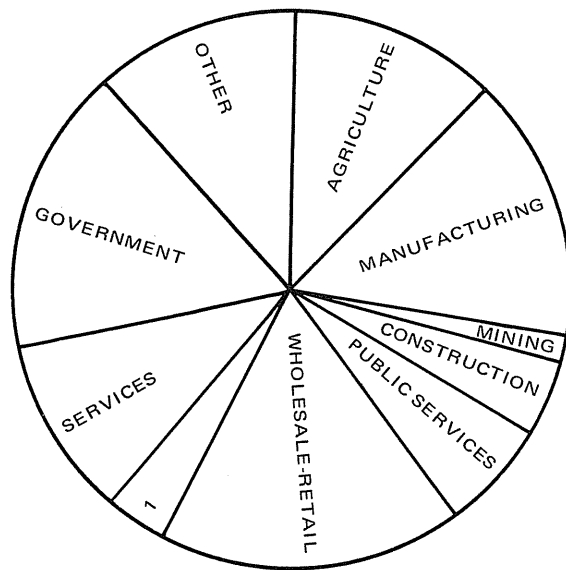
EMPLOYMENT IN KANSAS BY SECTORS 1950-1970



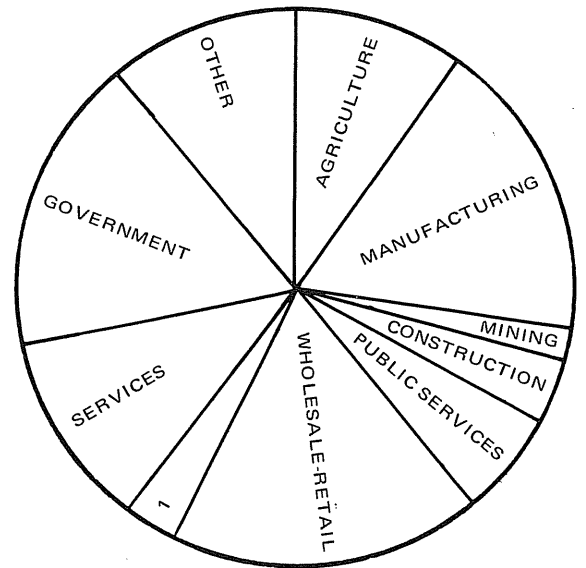

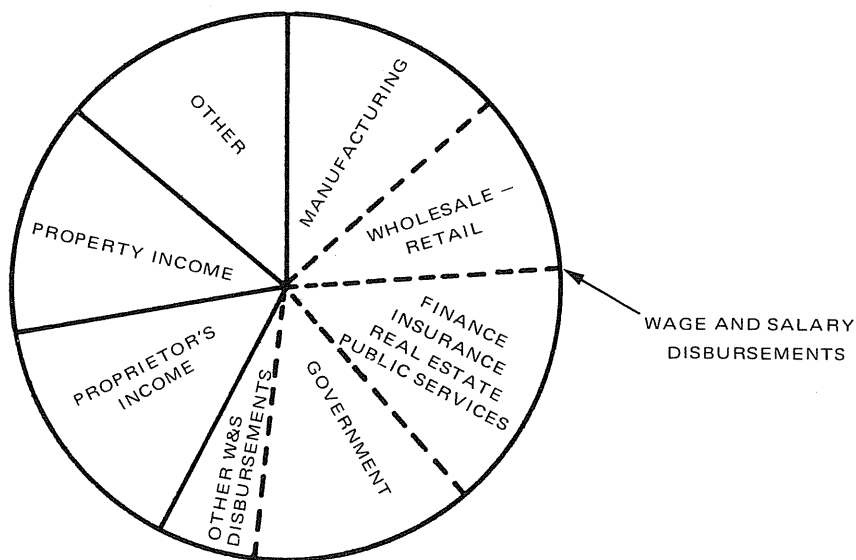

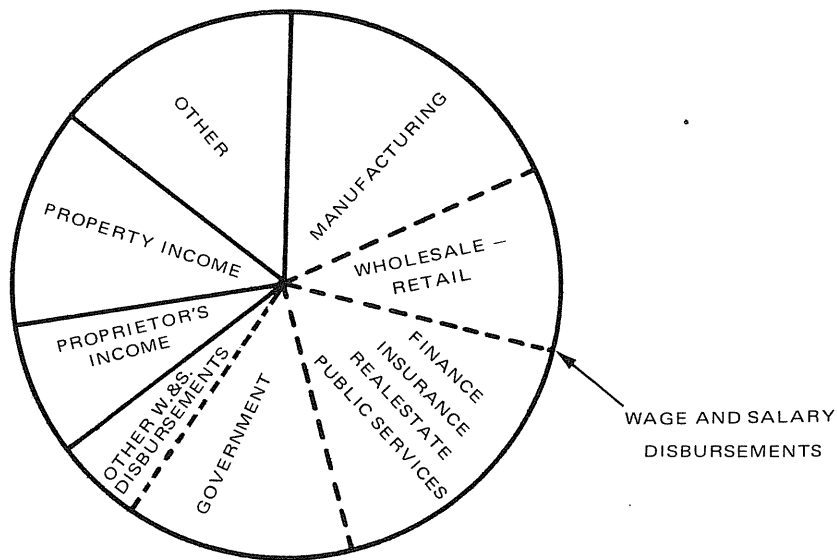

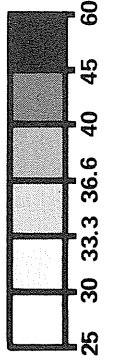
NET DOLLAR INCOME—1972

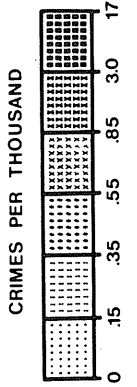

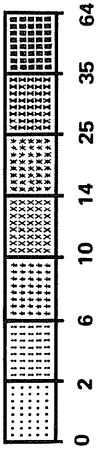
VIOLENT CRIMES—1972



PROPERTY CRIMES—1972



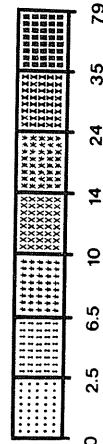
CRIMES PER THOUSAND

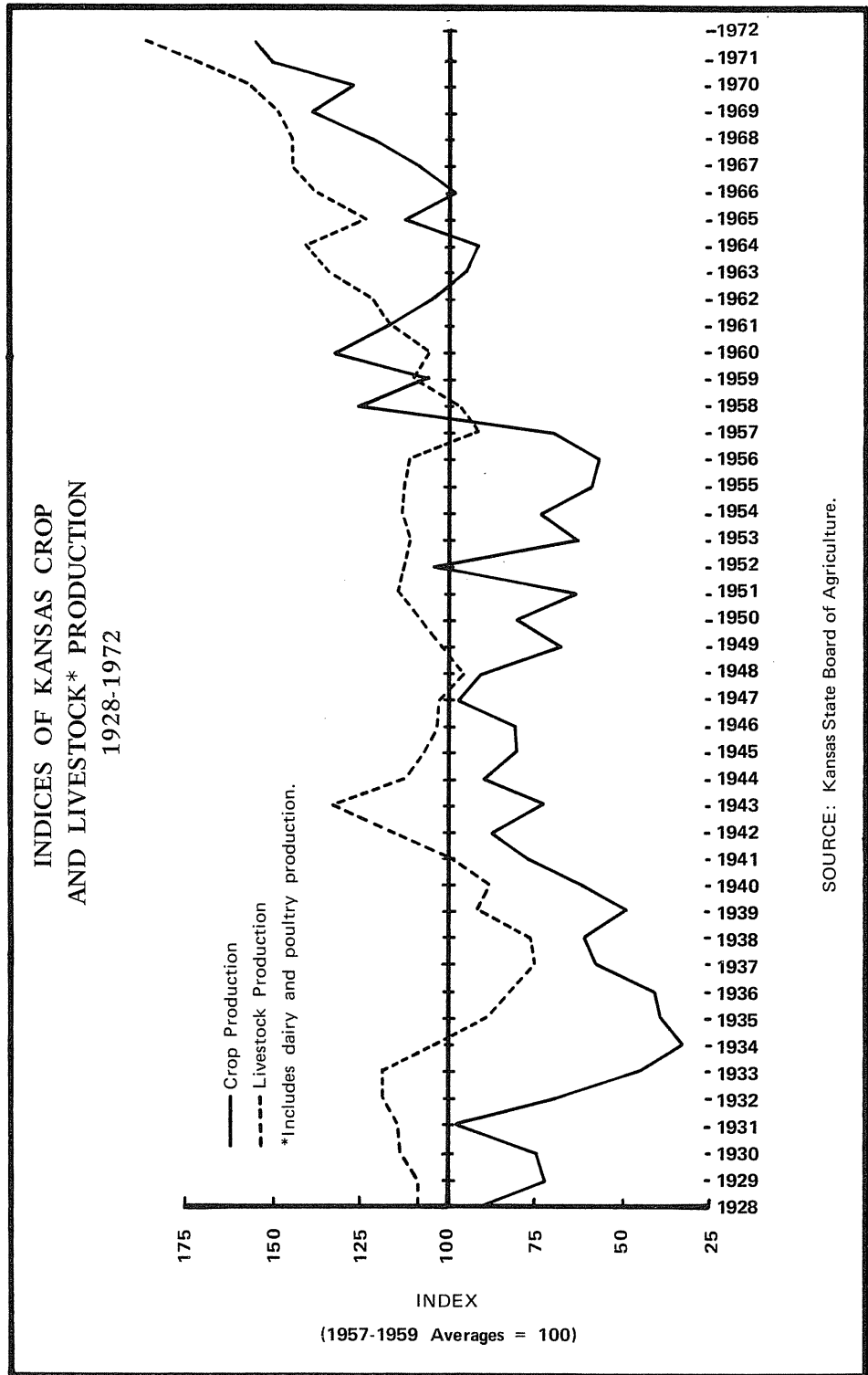
