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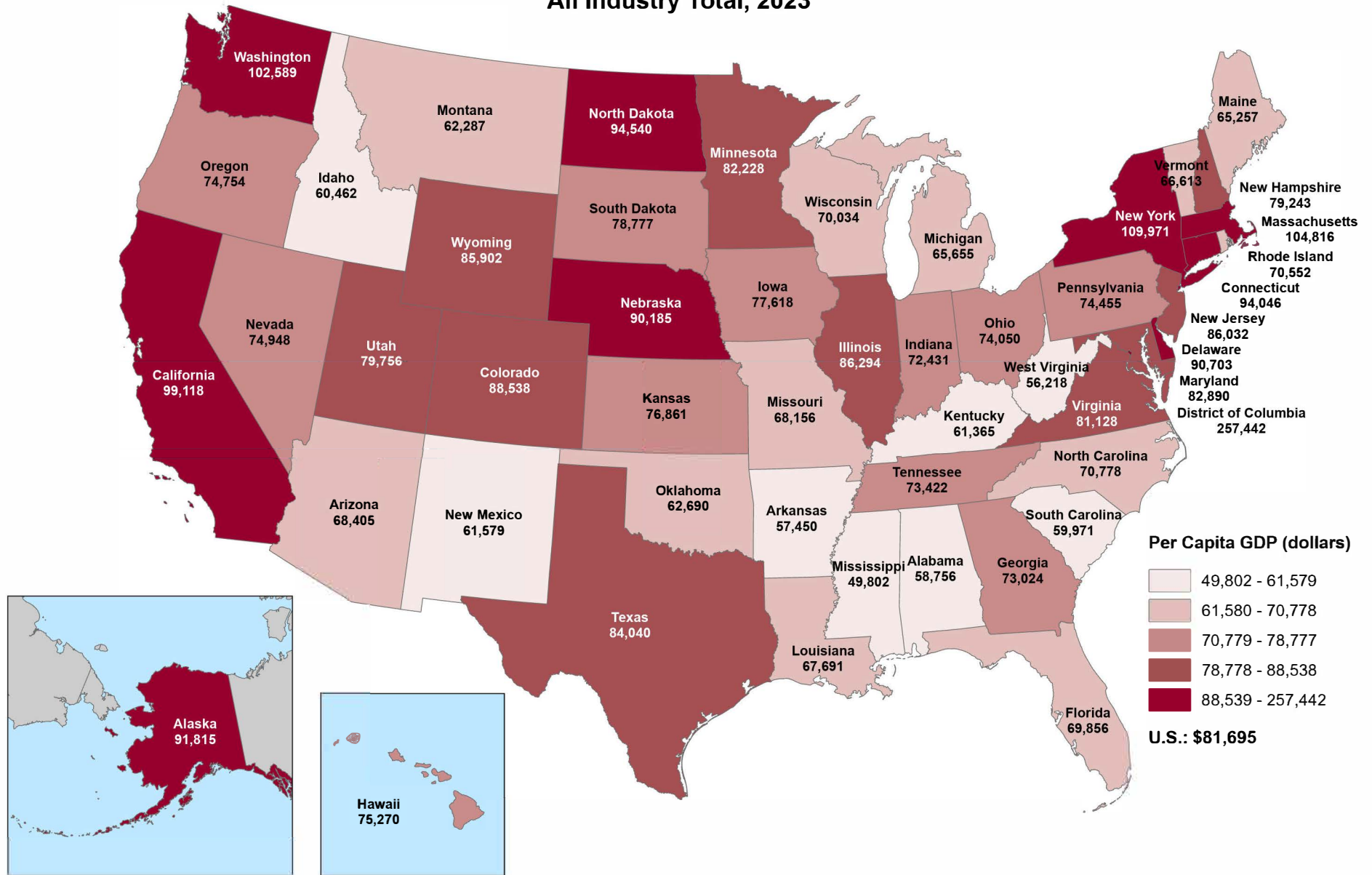

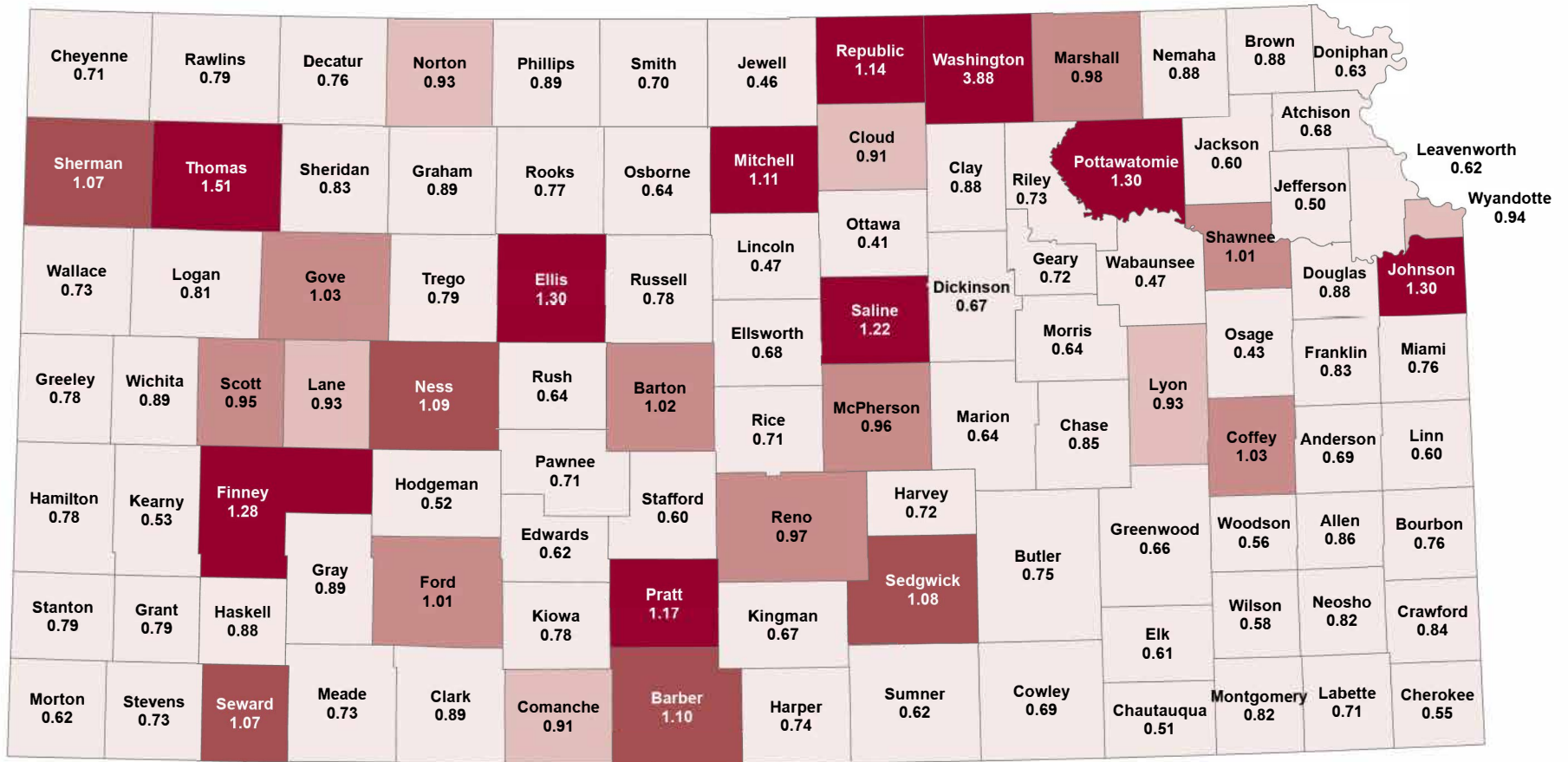

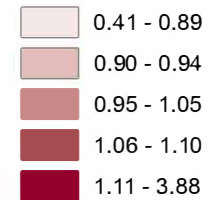
## County Trade Pull Factors in Kansas, Fiscal Year 2023
