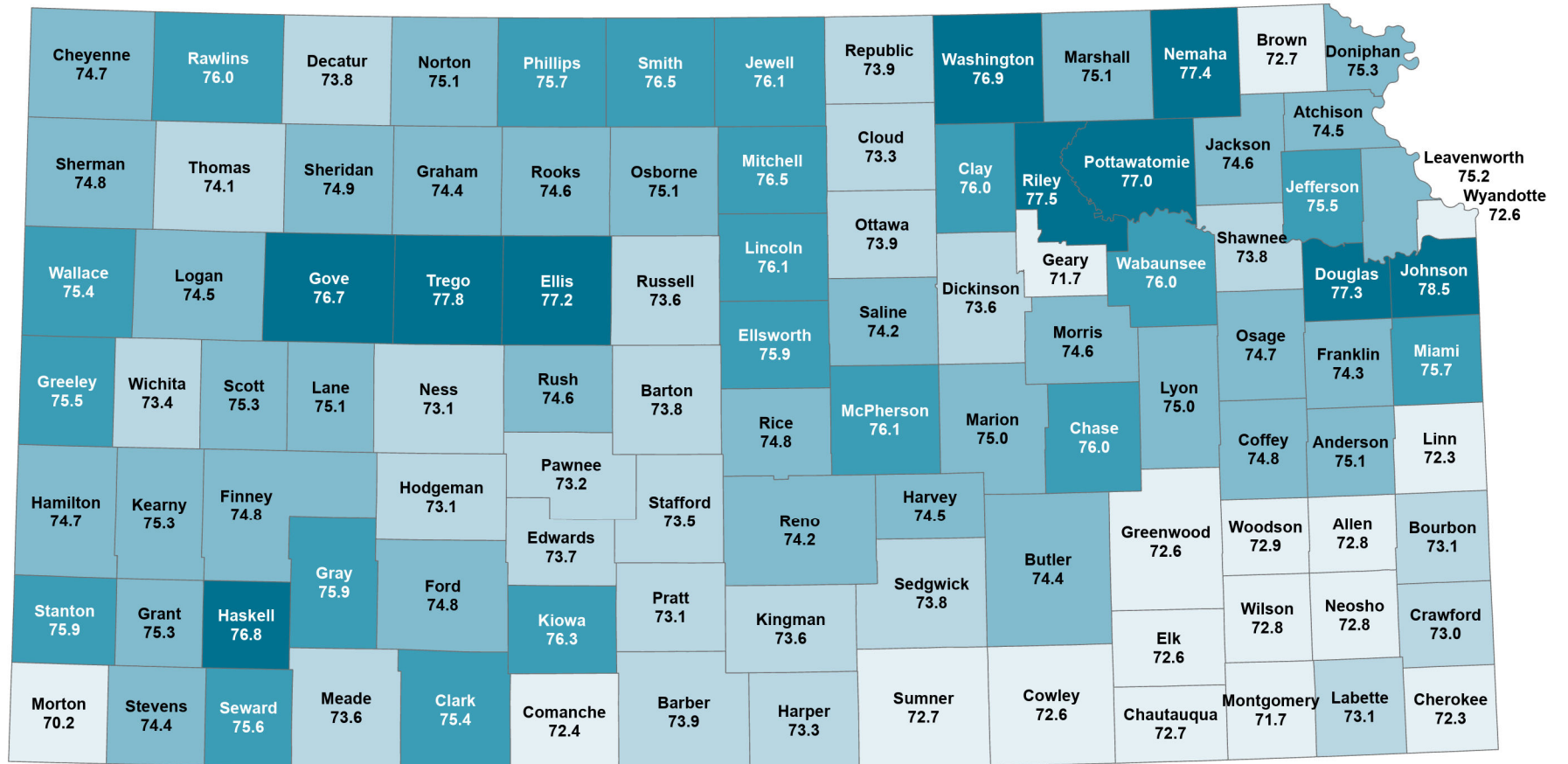

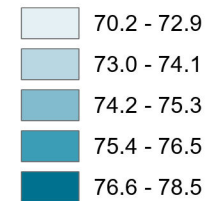
Life Expectancy at Birth in Kansas, by County, 2018-22



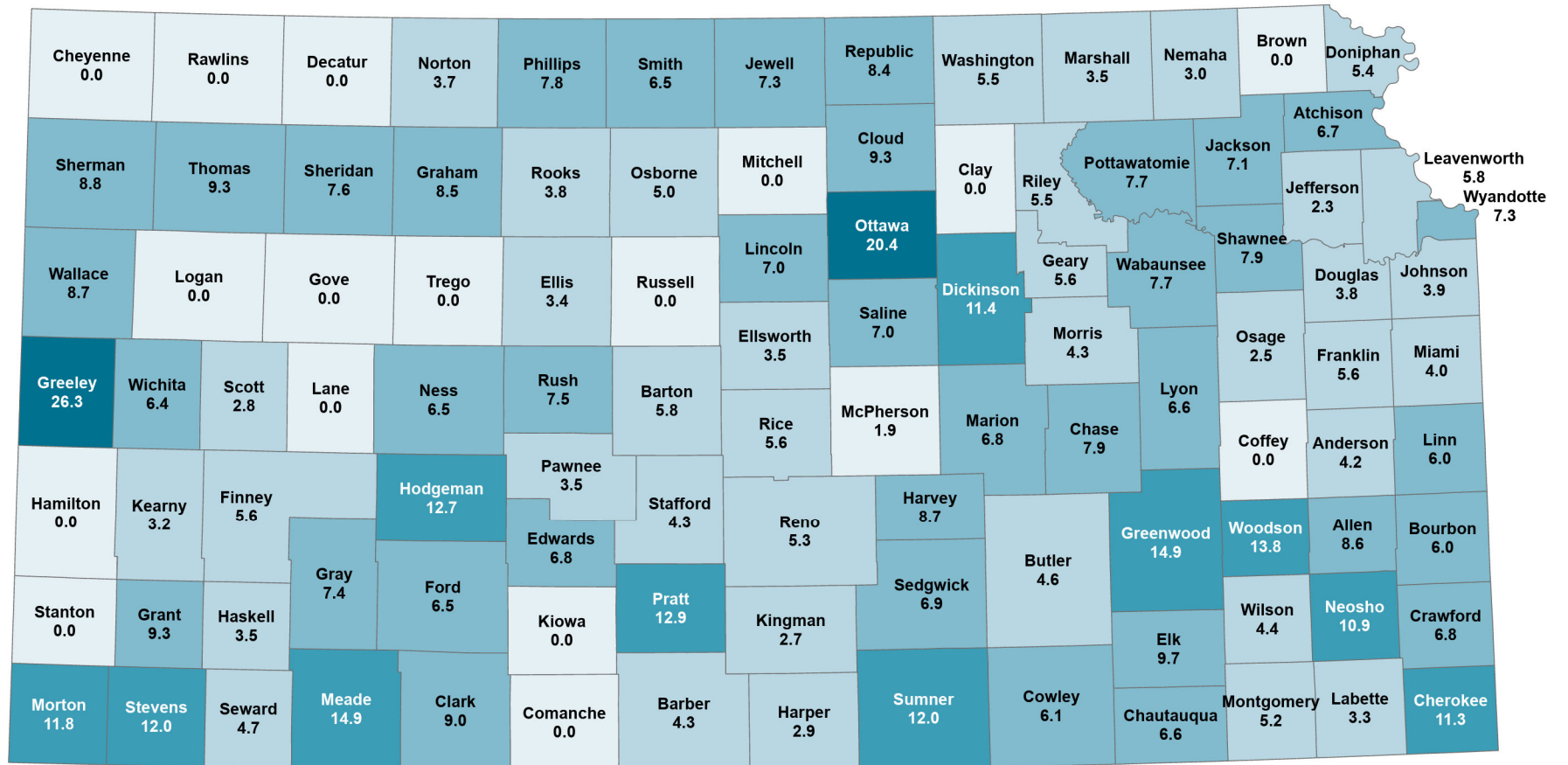

Life Expectancy



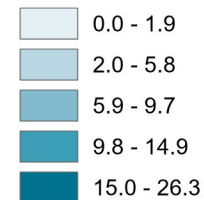
Infant Mortality Rates in Kansas, by County, 2018-22



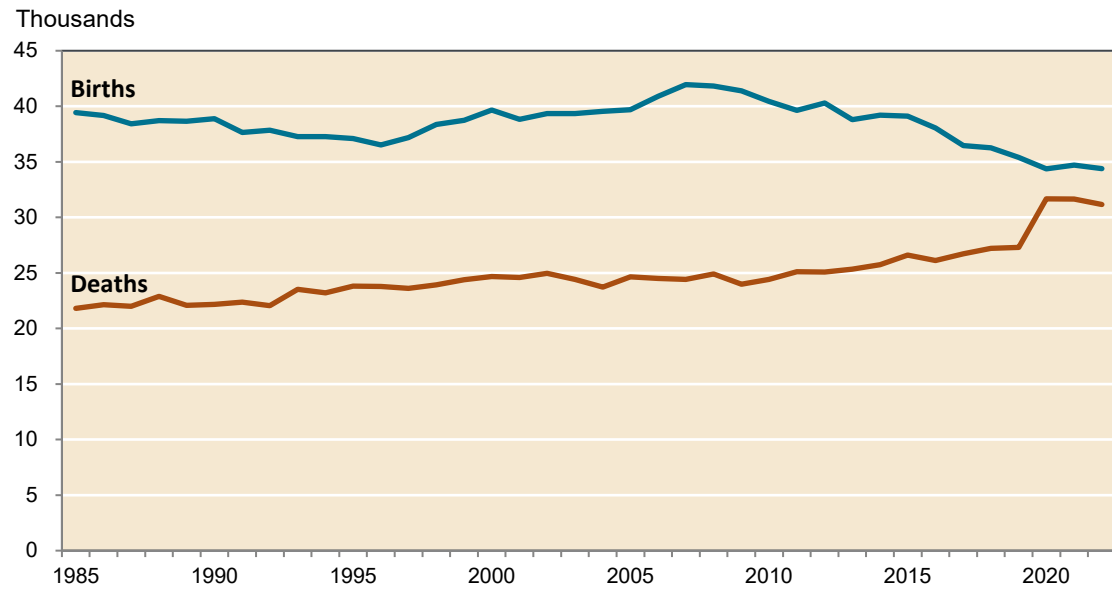

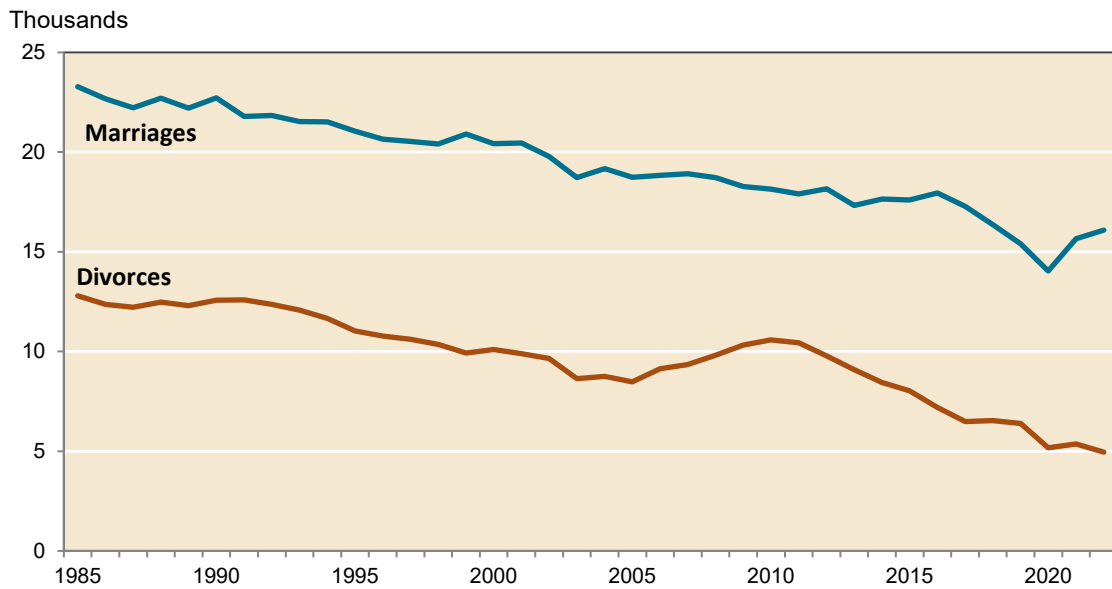

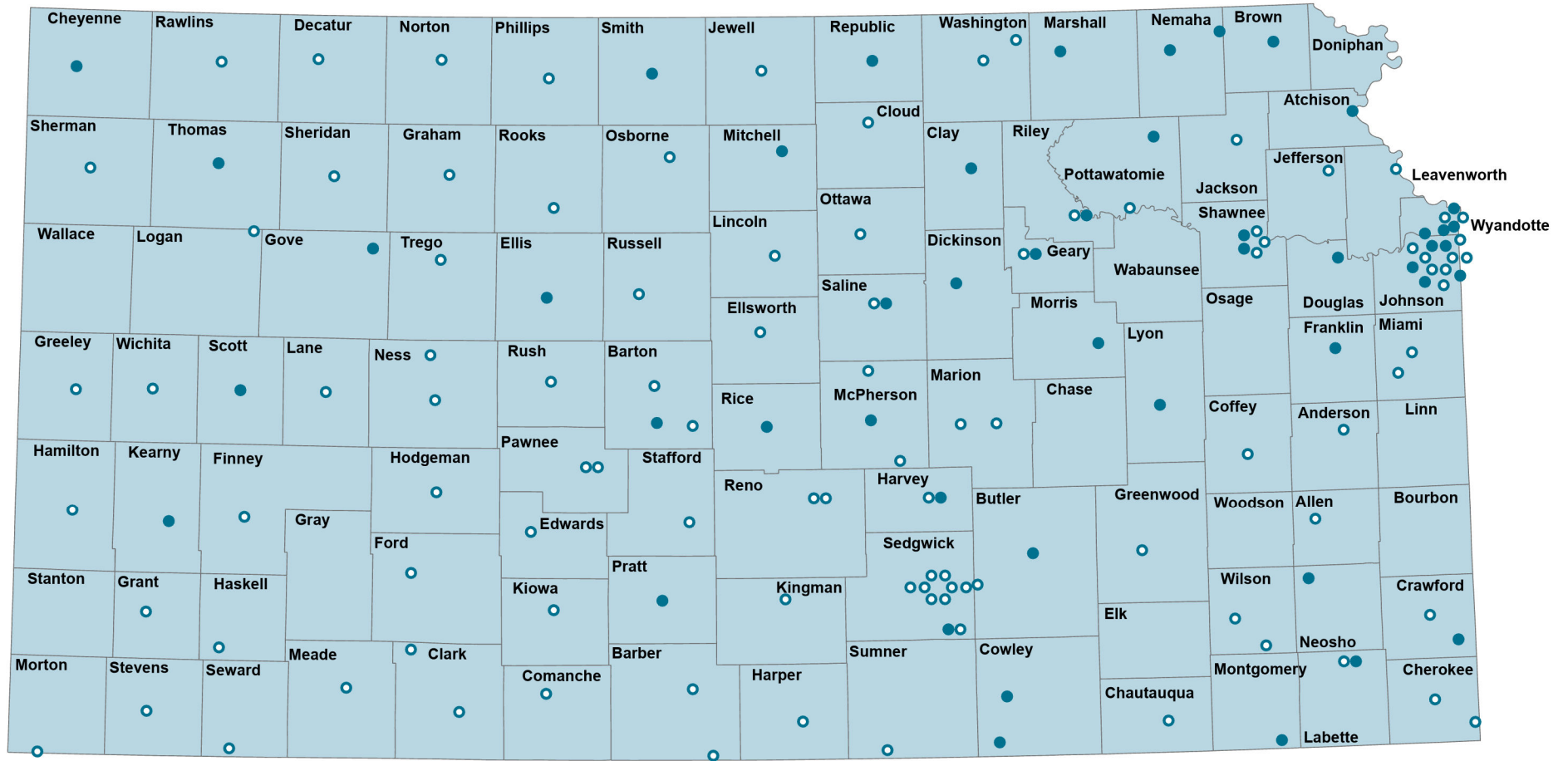

Hospitals in Kansas, 2022



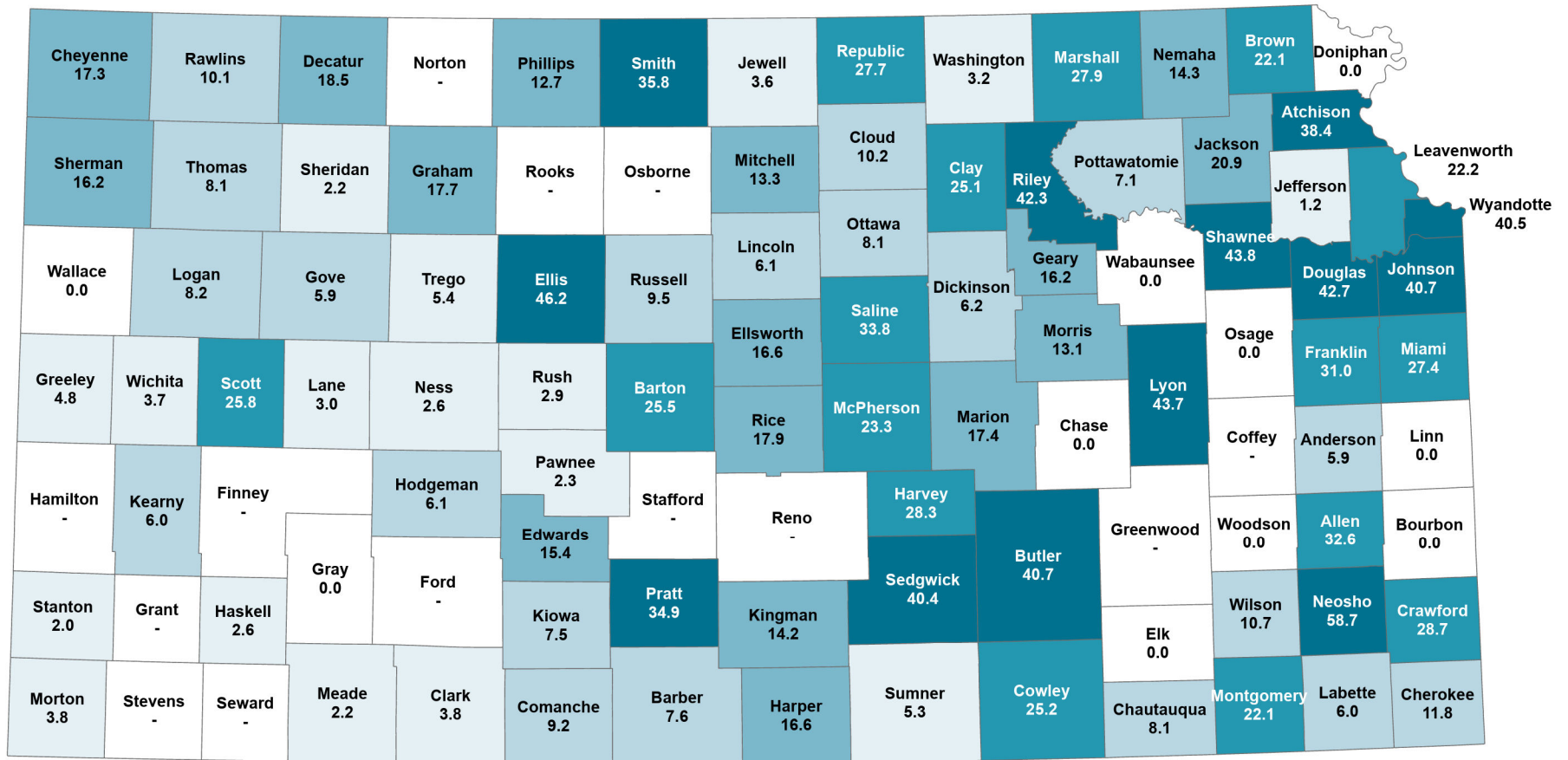

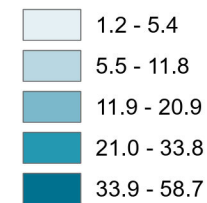
Utilization of Hospitals in Kansas, by County, 2022 Admissions per Bed

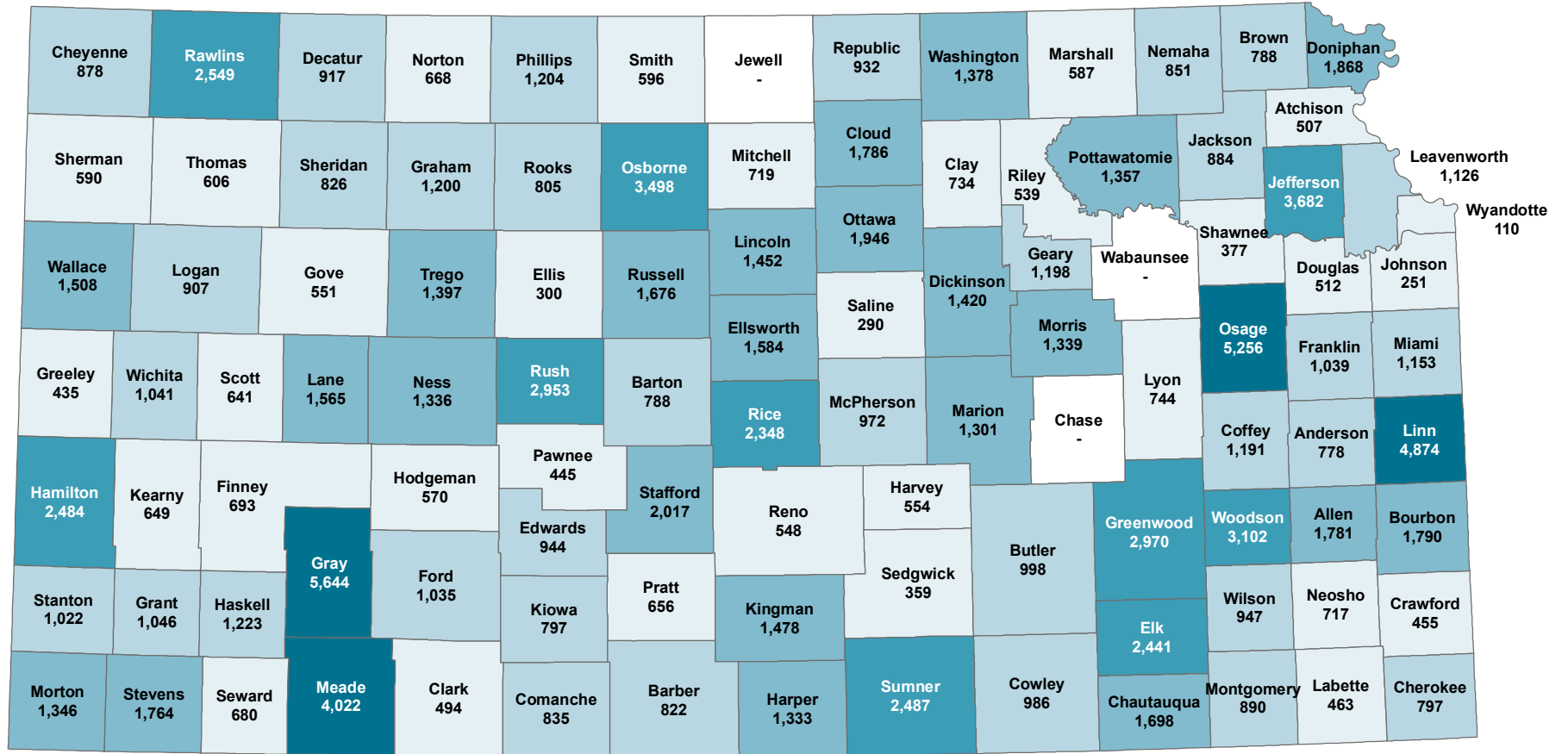

Persons per Physician in Kansas, by County, 2021



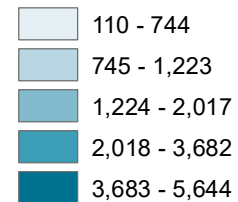

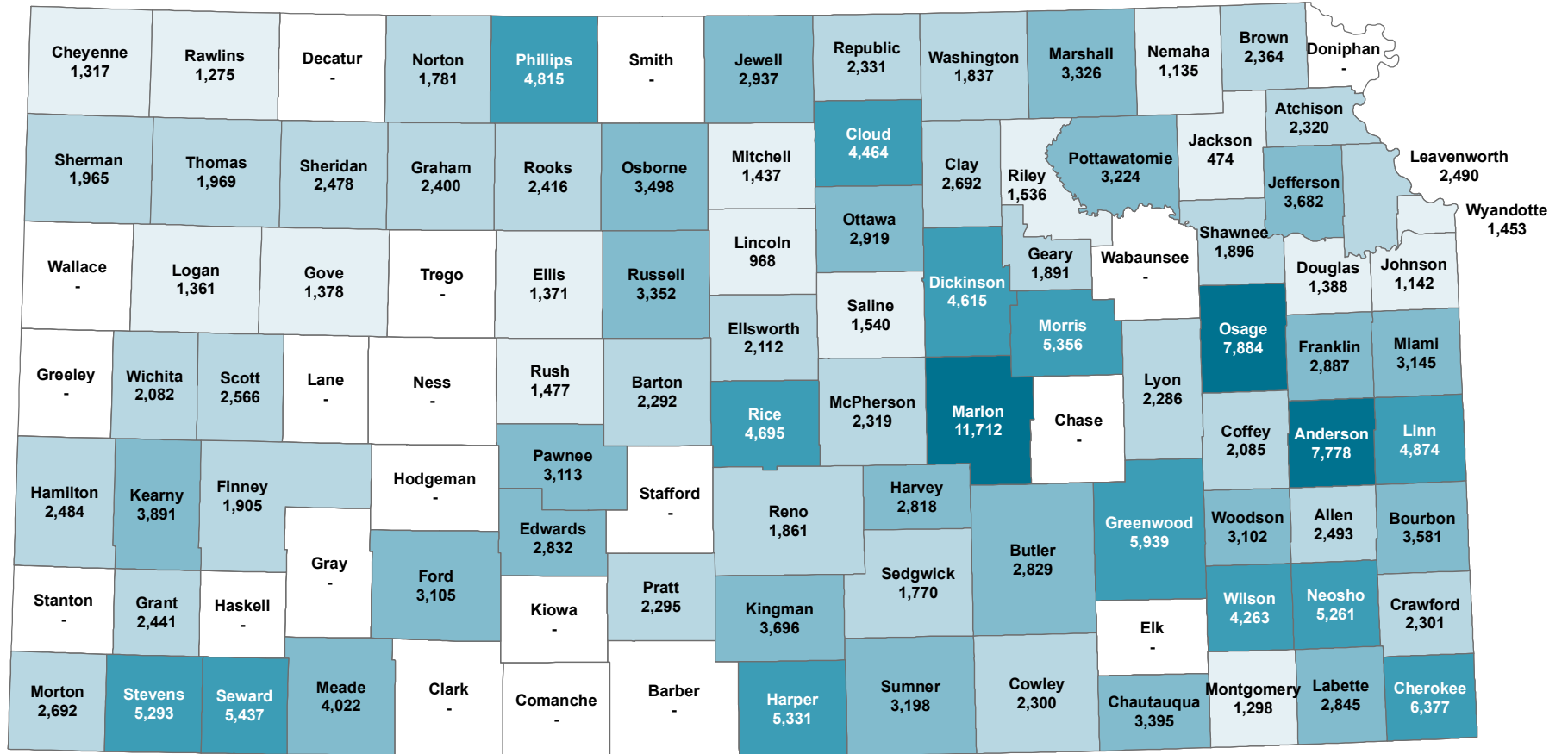

Persons per Dentist in Kansas, by County, 2021

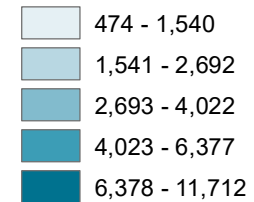

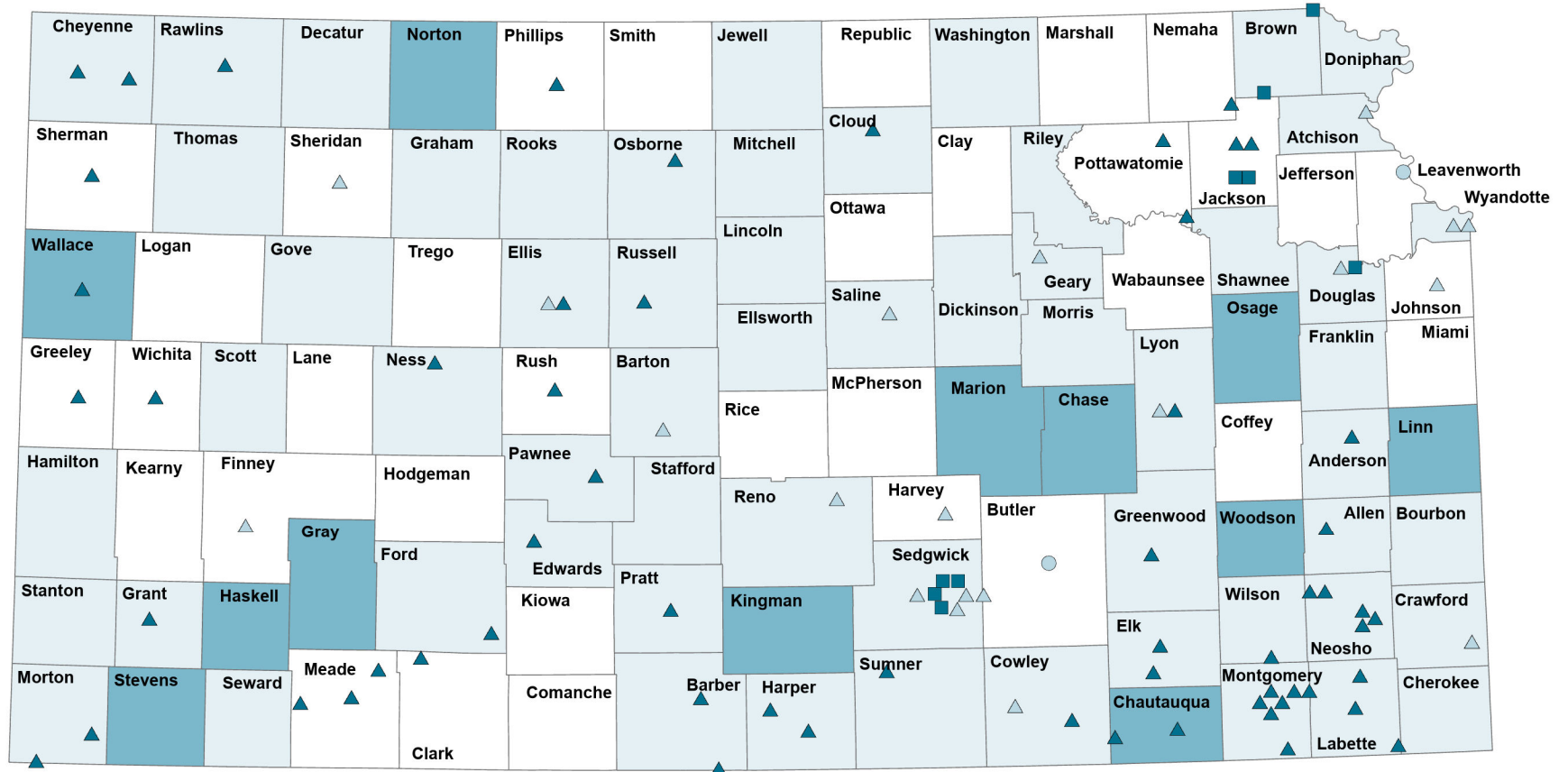

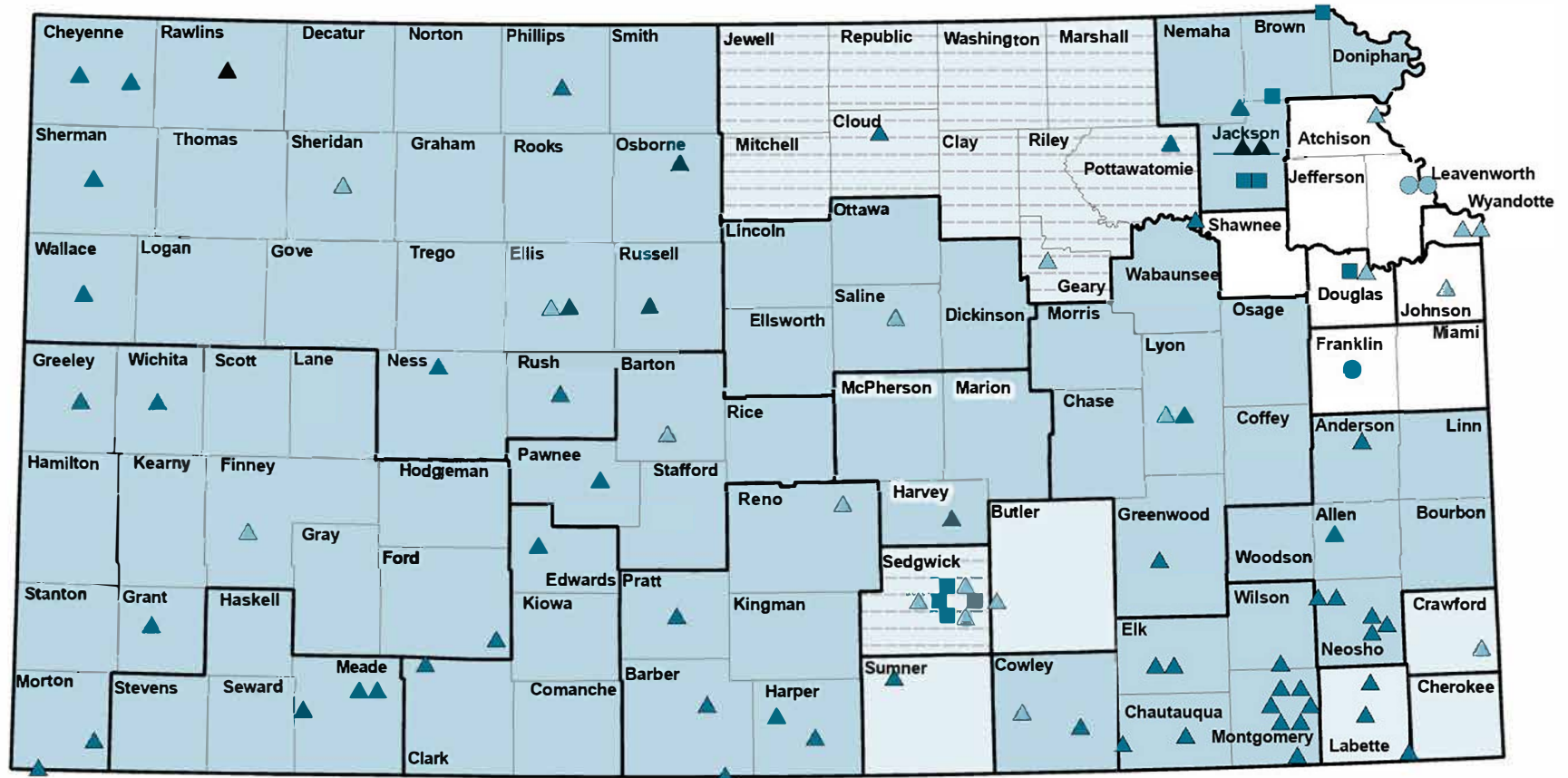

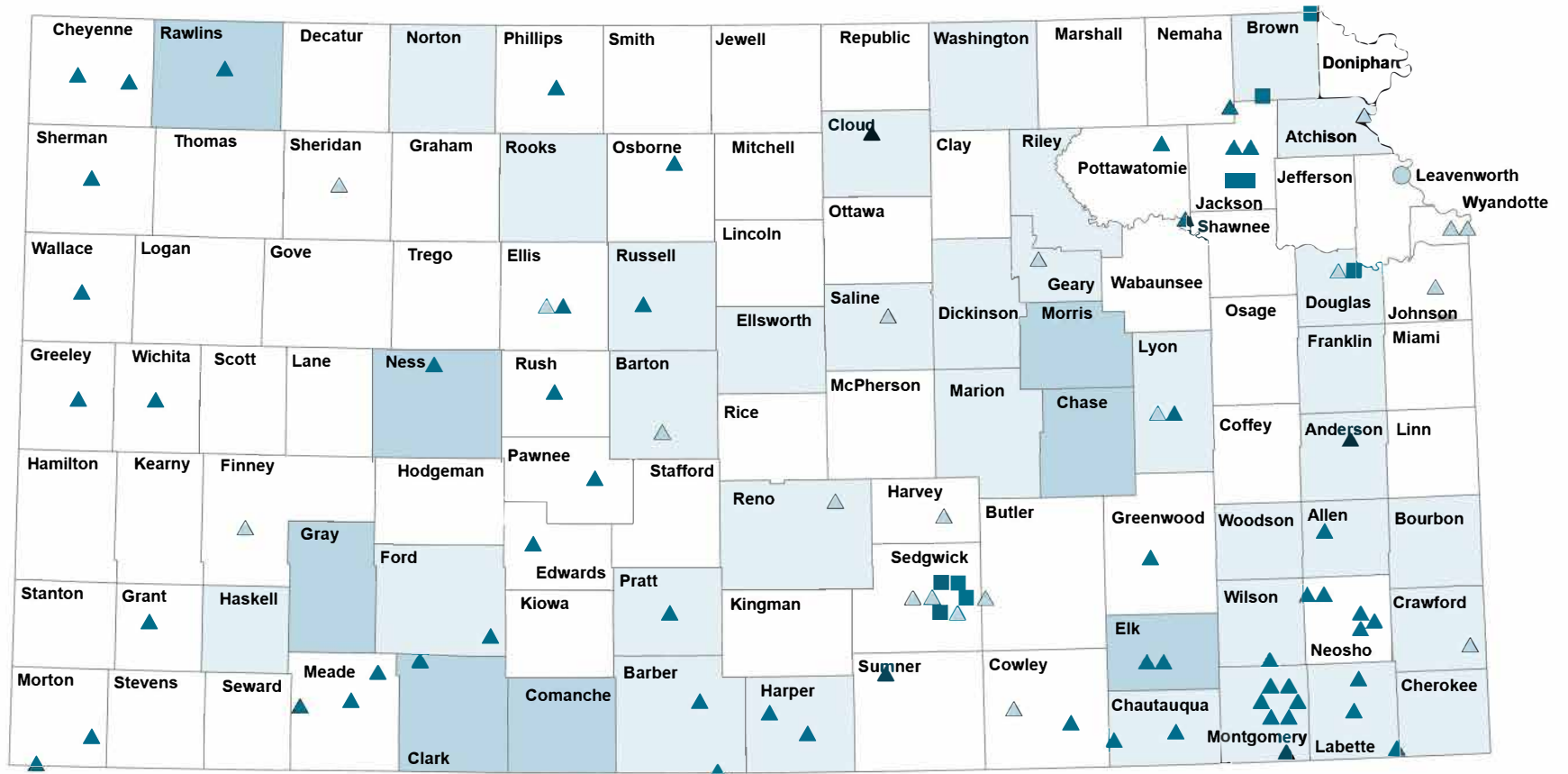

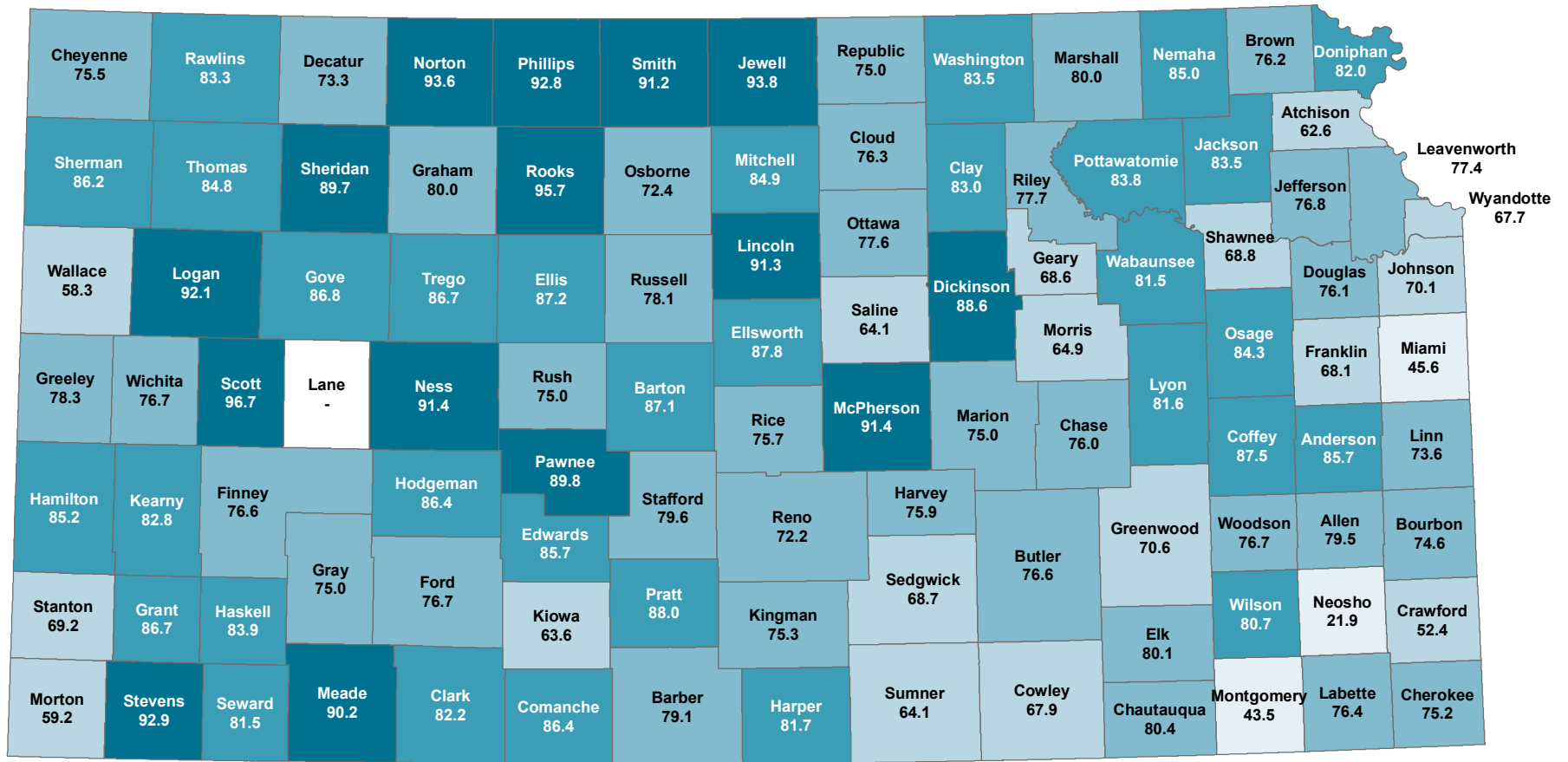

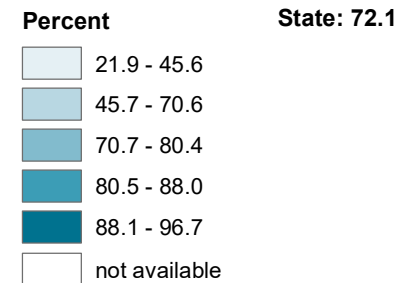

Percent of Infants Fully Immunized at 35 Months in Kansas, by County School Year 2018-19

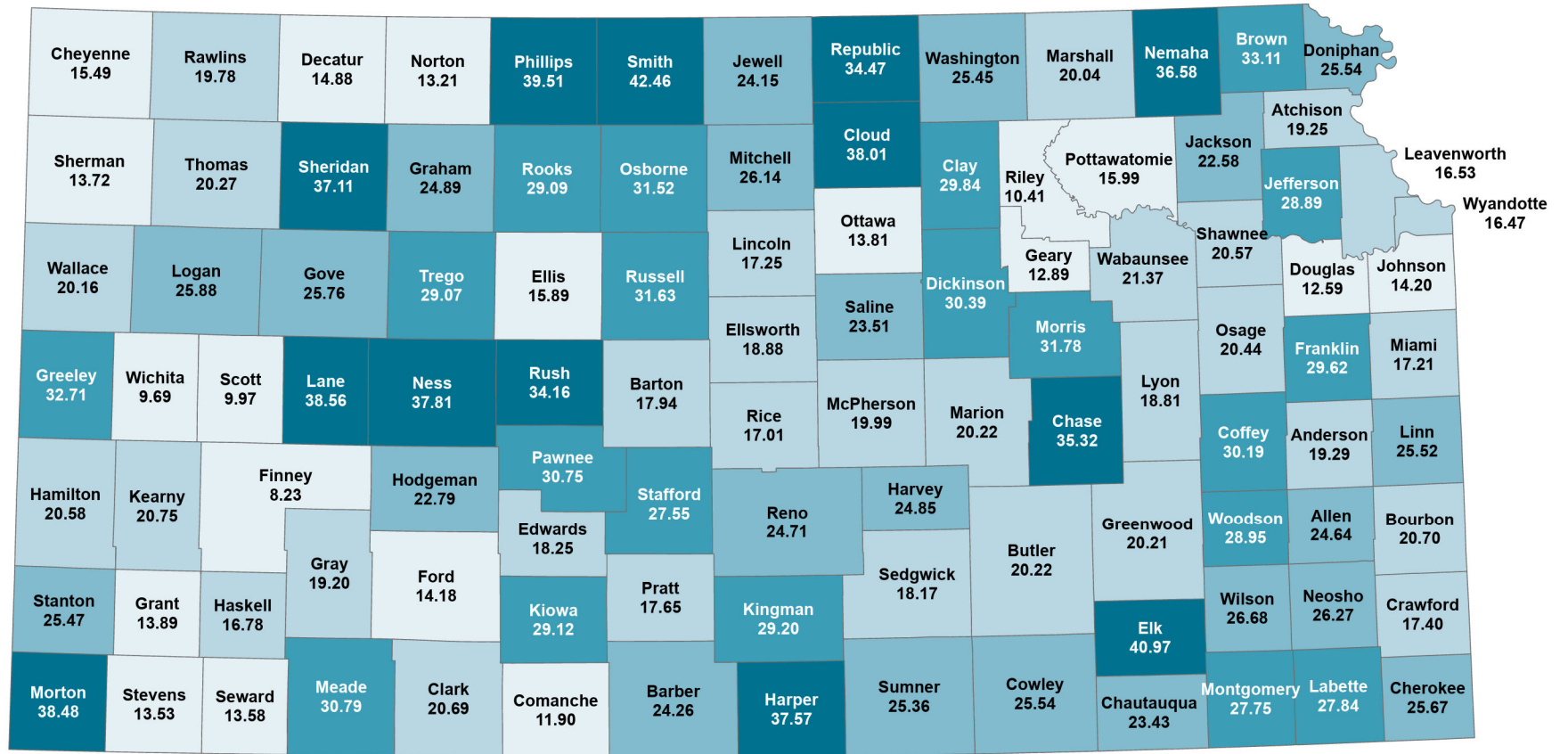

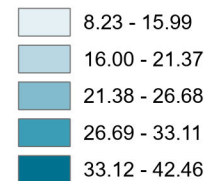
Cancer Death Rates in Kansas per 10,000 People by County of Residence, 2022

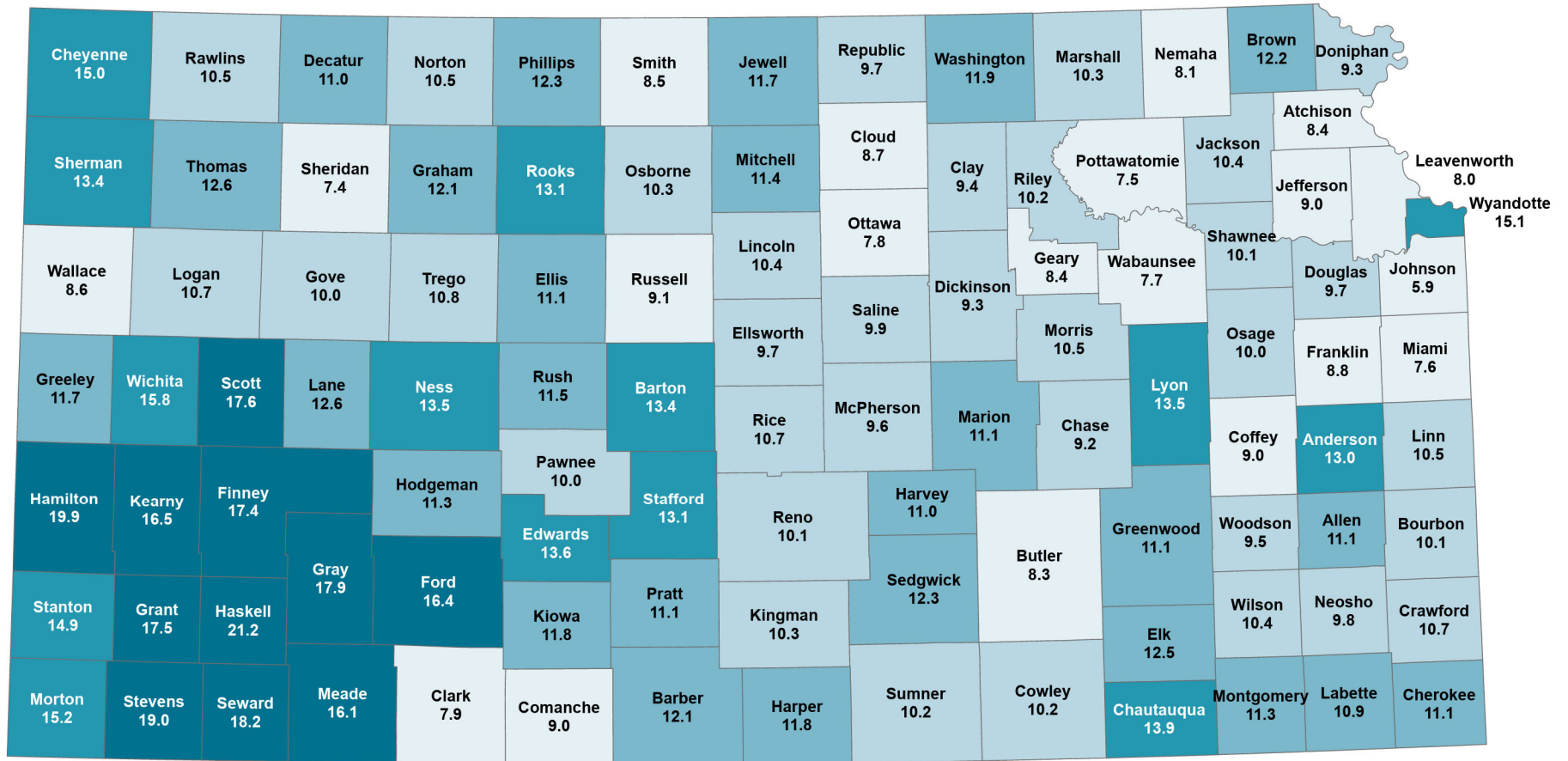

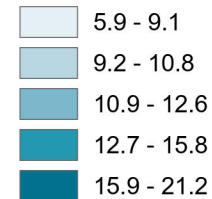

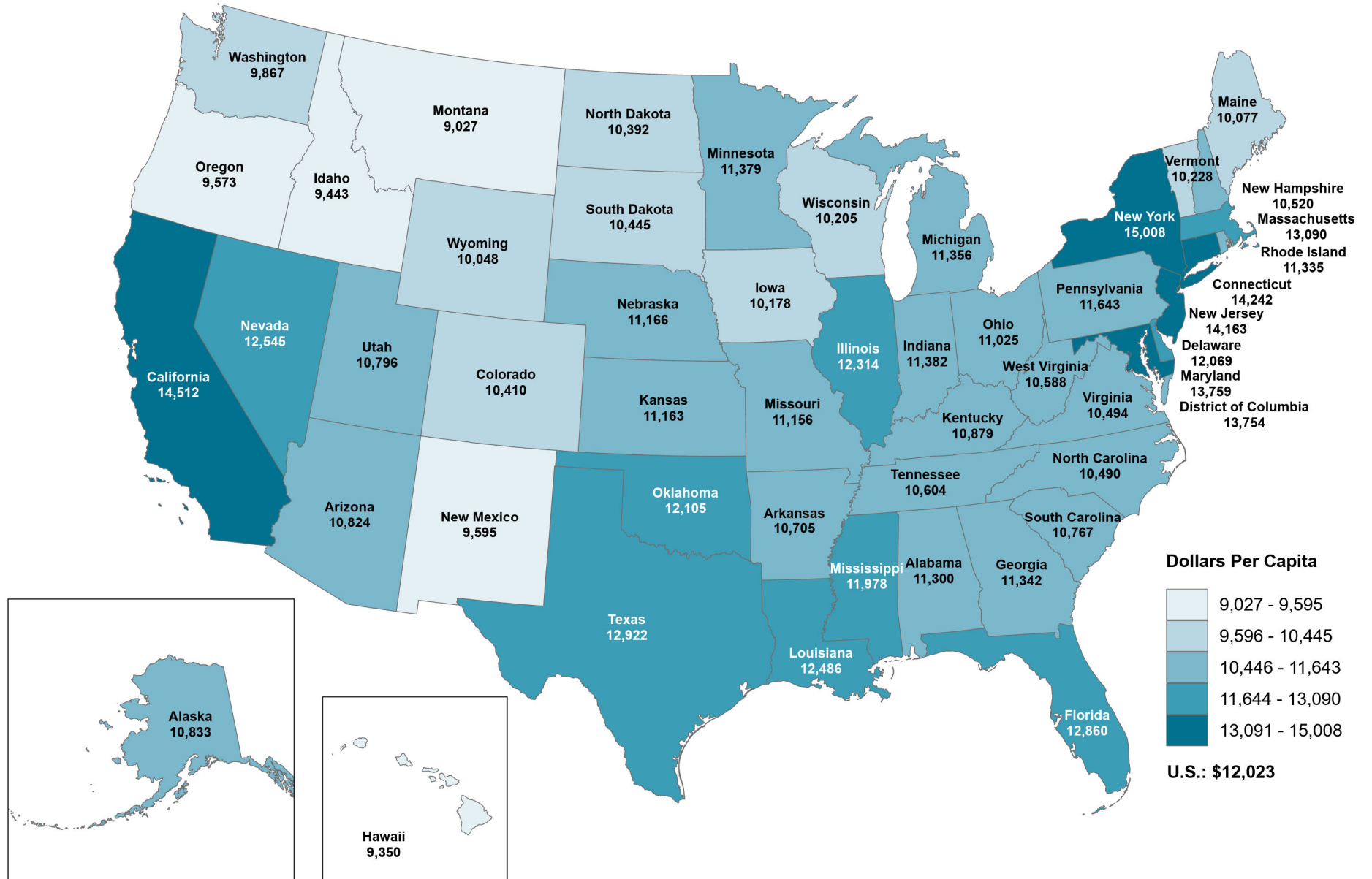

Per Capita Medicare Expenditures in the U.S., by State, 2022



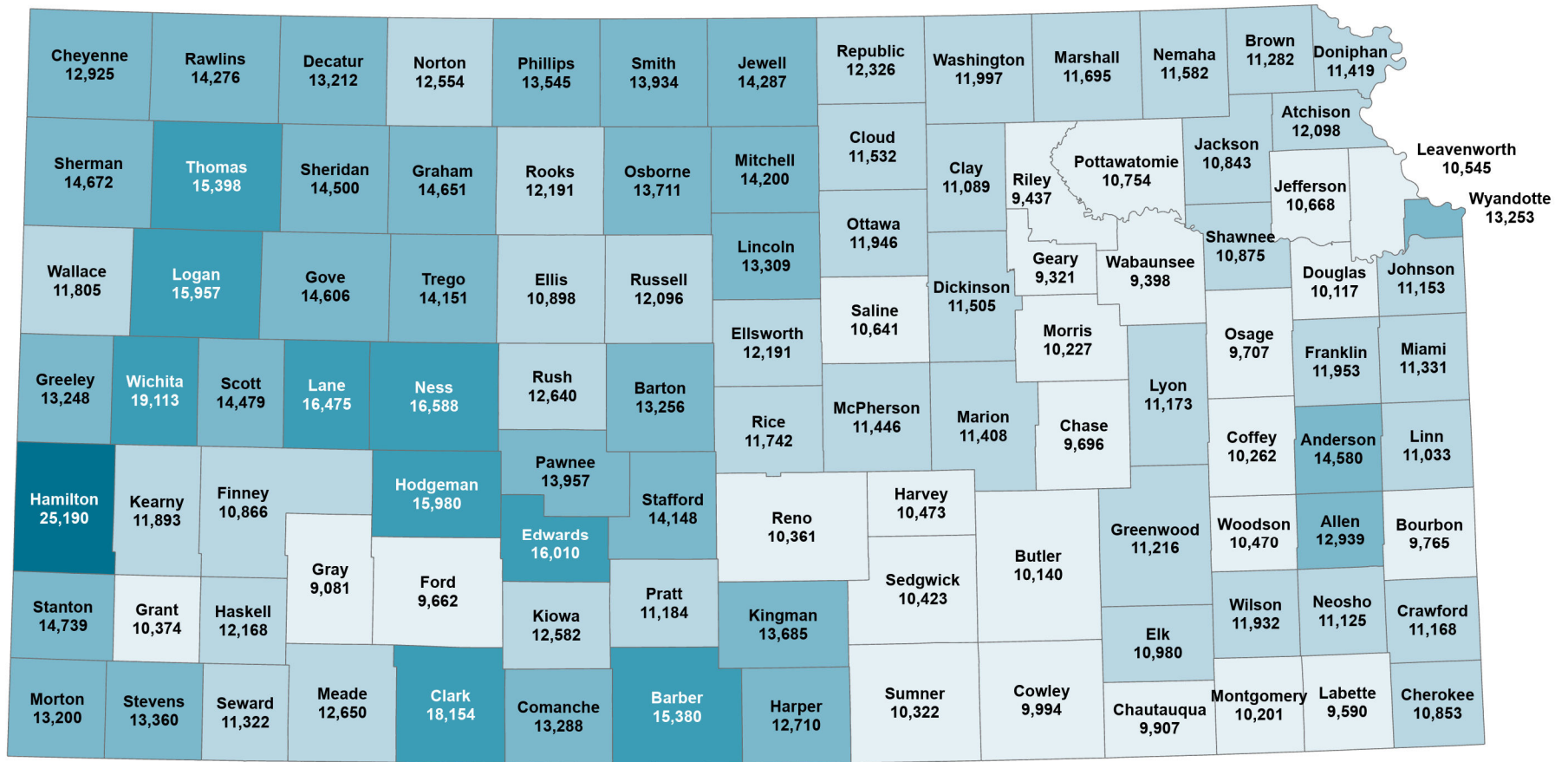

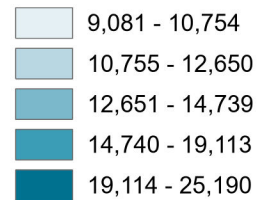

Per Capita Medicare Expenditures in Kansas, by County, 2022



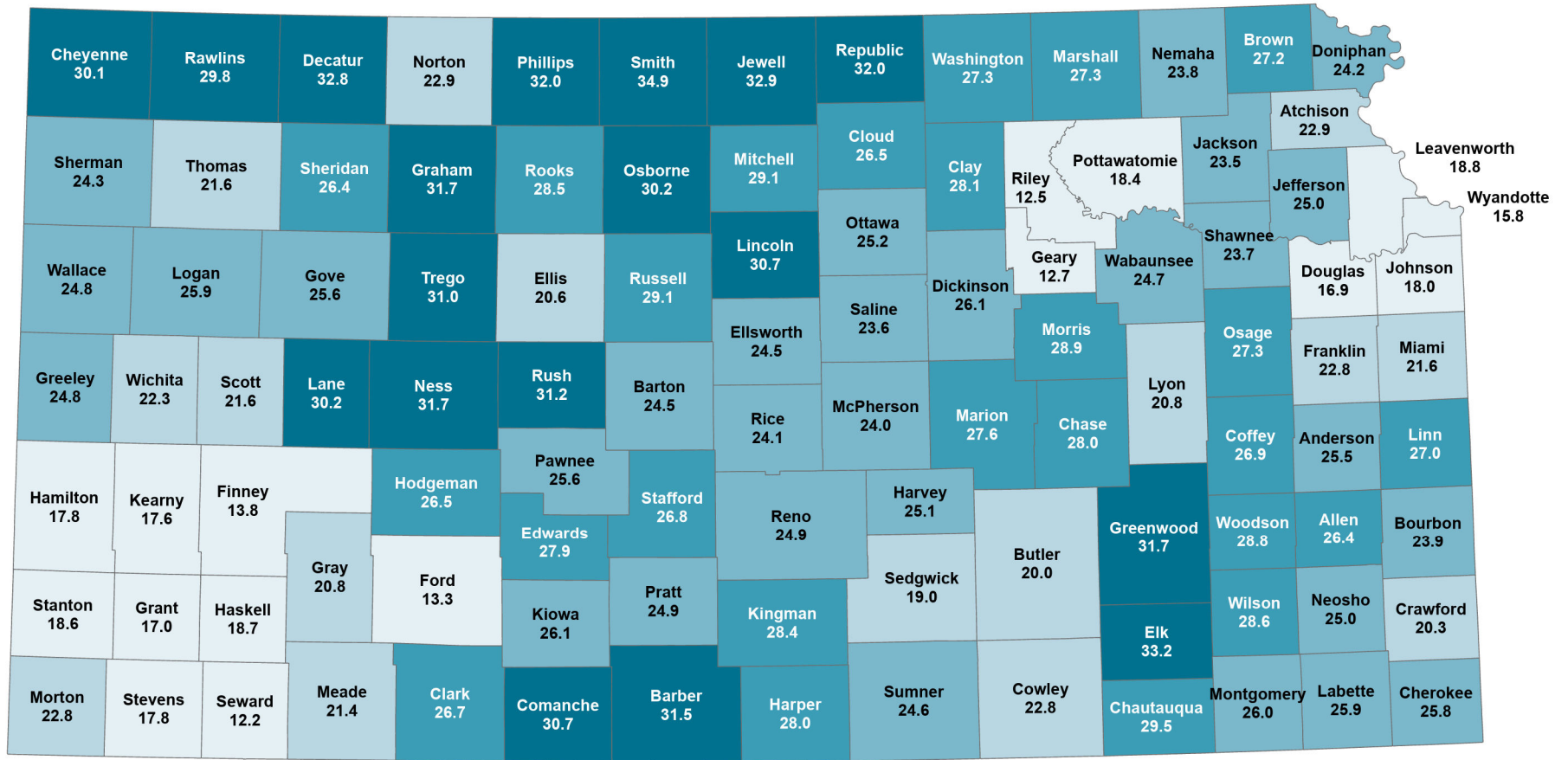

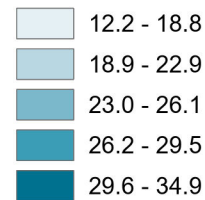
